

E EXTEND to the Brethren and friends a cordial welcome to the Annual Meeting in Virginia. We date back thirty years and note that this is the fourth time you have met on like occasions in the Old Dominion. In 1869 this body of people met near Salem; in 1879, at Broadway: in



Partial View of the Meeting Grounds.


1889, in Harrisonburg, and now, in 1899, at Roanoke. The meeting ground is in a beautiful young hickory and oak forest, on the street

This souvenir pamphlet will, we trust, aid to remind you of some pleasant associations while attending this meeting.

Virginia, "Mother of States and of Statesmen," occupies, perhaps, a higher place of interest than any other Commonwealth in the galaxy of States. It is clothed as with a mantle with historic memories, reaching back to the incidents which gave rise to the title, "Old Dominion."

The great Valley of Virginia, acknowledged by all to be the Eden of this historic old State, with its many points of interest, is




View from the Grounds.

a very presentable subject. Bordered by two ranges of mountains with foundations of rock and ribs of iron, it furnishes the natural resources for the employment of thousands of industrious people and is capable of supporting millions more. In the last few years its undeveloped resources have been made known to nearly half the world. Not many years ago the attractions of this valley caught the fancy of the tourist and pleasure-seeker only; but since the revelation of her natural resources, capital from the North and from across the waters has sought investment within her limits.

Roanoke is situated at the head of the Shenandoah Valley, and in the Roanoke Valley, between the Blue Ridge and Alle-

ghany Mountains, and at the intersection of the main east and west line of the Norfolk and Western Railway with their north line, running through the Shenandoah Valley to Hagerstown, Md., and south line to Winston, N. C.

Roanoke is 153 miles from Bristol, Tenn.; 257 miles from Norfolk, Va.; 239 miles from Hagerstown, Md.; 219 miles from Washington, D. C.; 199 miles from Richmond, Va.; 41 miles from Natural Bridge; 110 miles from The Grottoes; and 151 miles from the Luray Caverns.




Mountain Peak Near Roanoke.

INDUSTRIES.

Roanoke is emphatically an industrial city. In the center of the Norfolk and Western Railway system, here are located the shops of the company, the largest in the South, employing under normal conditions about 1,500 men. The offices of the company also are located here, employing many men with fine salaries. The superintendents and section men of four divisions of the road are paid off here. When you add to these the employes of three blast furnaces, a bridge works, tobacco and clothing factories, flouring mills, and the many other smaller industries in wood, iron and other materials, they make an aggregate monthly pay-roll of splendid


proportions. Roanoke is justly proud of her banking institutions, every lawful check having been paid when presented, without exception.

SCHOOLS.

The school system of Roanoke can not be excelled by that of any other city in the State. Seven large and well appointed structures have already been erected and the city rents other buildings for white schools. The colored school buildings are conveniently located in the colored districts, and are well attended. There are now fifty-four teachers employed and the total school enrollment is nearly thirty-five hundred.

In addition to the public schools, the educational advantages of Roanoke are unexceptionable. A female college capable of accommodating two hundred pupils is located on the south side of Roanoke River, a mile and a half from the center of the city. It is endowed with all the requirements for conferring a first-class education and is supplied with a corps of well-known instructors. An excellent academy for the education of boys and young men and the preparation of students to enter the higher colleges and

universities is situated on South Jefferson Street. It is capable of accommodating seventy-five students. Beside these, there are numerous private schools throughout the city, a business college for the training of both sexes in a commercial education, and a large parochial school under the jurisdiction of the Catholic Church. At Salem, seven miles west of Roanoke, is located Roanoke College,

an old and well-established institution of learning which numbers among its alumni many prominent men in this and adjoining States. At Hollins, six miles away, is Hollins Institute, the Vassar of the South, with an enrollment of nearly two hundred.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS.

There are five hotels in Roanoke, capable of entertaining over a thousand guests. These are excellently equipped, elegantly furnished, and located sufficiently near the center of the city to be of

easy access from the business quarter and the railroad stations. Hotel Roanoke enjoys the distinction of being the best-managed hotel in Virginia. It is situated on an eminence just north of the passenger station, and is in the midst of beautifully laid out grounds consisting of ten acres. From the veranda of the hotel a good view of the city may be obtained.

CLIMATE.

Situated in latitude 37° 33′, with an elevation of a thousand feet above sea-level, at the base of Mill Mountain, which is nine hundred feet higher, fourteen miles west of the top of the Blue Ridge Mountains and thirty-five miles east of the summit of the Alleghanies, the city is relieved from the extremes of all climates, as indicated by the mean temperature for the different seasons: Spring, 56.0; summer, 76.0; fall, 61.0; winter, 41.0; average, 58.0.

Roanoke, besides being situated in a rich farming and fruit country, with heavy deposits of coal and iron hard by, has the peculiar advantage of being situated almost in the center of the great mineral spring region of Virginia. Distant from Roanoke, Coyner's Spring is seven miles: Botetourt Spring seven: Blue

CHURCHES.

Roanoke is a city of churches and is a great church-going community. Services at all churches morning and evening. The average attendance at the Sunday services is fully five thousand people. There are twenty-three white and eight colored churches in the city, well apportioned according to population and sect. Some of the church edifices will compare favorably with those of any city in Virginia, and the aggregate value of church property will probably exceed six hundred thousand dollars. There are four Baptist churches, six Methodist, four Presbyterian, two Lutheran, two Episcopal, one Catholic, one United Brethren. one Dunkard, one Reformed and one Christian. colored Baptists have five, the colored Methodists two, and the colored Presbyterians one. making a total of thirty-one churches in the city limits.



In the mountains of Virginia, affording beauty and healthfulness, grow the famous Albemarle pippin and other choice apples, which have won a world-wide reputation. Fruit-growing in this section is a profitable industry.

Since 1883 there has been a steady growth in the coal and coke output from the Pocahontas district, the great coke producing section of the Norfolk and Western Railway. What was once considered a mountain waste is now a thriving district, producing annually several million tons of coal and more than half a million tons of coke.

One of the most prominent and beautiful features of the city of Roanoke is Crystal Spring, at the base of Mill Mountain. Here a spring gives forth a volume of perfectly clear, cold and pure water, to the extent of five million gallons per day—more than double the present need of the city. The capacity of the two pumping engines is four million gallons a day. Recently a new water company completed a reservoir four hundred feet up the side of Stewart's Knob, a high peak of the Blue Ridge, about four miles east. This water is freestone and there is an unfailing supply.




NATURAL BRIDGE, VA. Width, 100 Feet.

the narrows where the colossal arch, rising two hundred and fifteen feet above the stream which murmurs beneath, stands with all the grandeur which places it in the foreground of the Seven Wonders of the World. With its massive piers braced against two mountains and its ponderous keystone, weighing hundreds of tons, resting so gracefully; with its high, shapely abutments rising so solidly and springing into such a noble arch, it completely satisfies our idea of beauty of curve, and grace, and strength.

This wonderful structure overlooks the James River Valley, being on the western slope of the Blue Ridge Mountains and at the center of the State of Virginia. It ranks among the great wonders of the world. It approaches Niagara in grandeur and exceeds it in height and awful mystery.

From the Bridge, only a few hours' drive over a delightful road to the east, brings you to the magnificent "Peaks of Otter," the ascent of which will abundantly repay you. You may have stood at the edge of Ætna and cast your eye far over Callabian Italy to the east as the glowing sunlight flooded the Ionian sea, or to the west as the mighty mountain's shadow covered the whole length of Sicily; but as you stand on this highest point in the State and the eye ranges over the backbone of Virginia into the valley beyond, where shining towns lie upon the mountain sides, gray old hamlets and verdure-softened villages speck the lovely dales with hints of happiness, you can not find words to express the vastness of the panoramic view. As the sun's disc bursts over hill and dale, shedding its mellow light on "every statesman's lichened cottage," an







Castles on the Rhine-Luray.






Farming Lands Near Roanoke.

Bird's-eye View of Vinton, Two Miles from Roanoke, on the Car Line.






