Introduction:

This collection highlights the extensive genealogical research done by Mrs. Bonnie S. Ball, who worked primarily in Southwestern Virginia historical records. Contained in the collection are notes for merely a handful of family histories researched by Ball.

Biographical Note:

Bonnie Sage was born on December 17, 1901 near Stickleysville, Virginia. She was the fourth of thirteen children! Bonnie later became a teacher and taught all over Virginia and adjoining states. During her teaching, she met and married Palmer Ball. After 33 years of teaching, Bonnie retired to Big Stone Gap, Virginia, but remained active. She was a member of several historical societies, DAR, UDC, a correspondent for several papers and publications, published several books, and participated in church activities. Unfortunately, Mrs. Ball suffered poor health during her later years and succumbed to her ailments on May 11, 1996 at the age of 95. She was a well-known and respected genealogist and her work can be passed down to future generations¹.

Scope and Content:

- The Bonnie S. Ball collection comprises 1 record storage box.
- The collection is made up of handwritten notes by Ball, all done on standard notebook paper; genealogical charts; scrapbook is approximately 8x12 and contains various sized church photos, both in color and black and white
- This collection dates mainly from the late 1950s through the early 80s

Folder 1- copy of tribute article to Bonnie Ball, written by Gladys Stallard for the December 1996 edition of the Appalachian Quarterly after Ball's passing.

Folder 2- Letter from a Mrs. Jean Patterson in TN.; dated 1/22/1972; asking Mrs. Ball about any genealogical information on the Bramletts of Bedford County. Ball's handwritten notes are taped to back of letter

Folder 3- folder of correspondence from a Ms. Ann Ryan of San Clemente, California; undated but most likely are from the late 60s-early 70s. Ms. Ryan is looking for genealogical information on Chapman family. Mrs. Ball has added pages of handwritten notes to end of folder.

Folder 4- contains copious correspondence with a Ms. Florence Cates from Kingman, Kansas; letters date from 1962-1969. Mrs. Ball's notes are also included, along with genealogical charts of the Cates, Hess, Cunningham, Trumbo, Rinker, and Cleveland families.

Folder 5- folder houses correspondence with a Mrs. Mary Neal Routzhon of Harlan, Kentucky looking for information on Coulson family; the letters date from the early 60s-early 70s. Mrs. Ball added notes regarding different sources for information on Coulson family

Folder 6- contains a letter from a Sybil Barker, dated November 15, 1972, regarding Sage family. Folder also contains numerous genealogical charts for the Sage, Cornett, and Barker families.

Folder 7- contains ample notes on Cox family, while there seems to be no originating request or letter from a patron for her services, Ball notes the name of a Mrs. Lucille Cox Jones along with her address.

Folder 8- Letter from a E. Cutchenson in Atlanta, Georgia; dated march 19, 1984, asking for help tracing back Delp-Rhudy lineage and attached genealogy chart. Folder 9- general index of marriages of Scott County females; dating from 1800s-1930s, mainly looking at Elam clan

Folder 10- Ball's brief note on Francisco family will search; undated

Folder 11- Notes dated 1978 for a Gaddy family for a Mrs. Ruth Maxwell from TN.

Folder 12- Numerous copies of different records for Glass family, again, no letter or patron request attached
