Biographical Note:

The Virginia Regional Women's Guild of the Evangelical and Reformed Church was established in Roanoke on March 5, 1941. The purpose of the organization was to unite all the women of the Evangelical and Reformed Churches within its boundaries; to promote Christian fellowship among them and to enlarge their understanding of the entire work of the Church. The purpose of the organization is further defined in the Articles of the Women's Guild as "Looking always to Christ as the motive and source of strength, its purpose shall further be to enlist their interest to the end that every woman shall pray, study, work and give to the fields of Christian service: the Home, the local Church, the Denomination, the Community, the Nation and the World."
