Historical Note:

Science fiction fantasy fanzines are amateur, semi-professional magazines published by fans of science fiction and/or fantasy. Several fanzines were published in the Roanoke Valley. The Nelson Bond Society was Roanoke's first organized sci-fi and fantasy club. Named after its mentor and science fiction writer, the club began publishing the *Jinnia Clan Journal*, so titled after Bond's "Meg the Priestess" tales, a loosely integrated series which included one short story, two novellas and an associated full-length novel. Nelson S. Bond was an American author who wrote extensively for books, magazines, radio, television and the stage. The 1998 recipient of the Nebula Author Emeritus award for lifetime achievement, Bond was a pioneer in early science fiction and fantasy. His published fiction is mainly short stories, most of which appeared in pulp magazines in the 1930s and 1940s. Many were published in *Blue Book* magazine. He is noted for his "Lancelot Biggs" series of stories and for his "Meg the Priestess" tales, which introduced one of the first powerful female characters in science fiction.

The Nelson Bond Society and the *Jinnia Clan Journal* influenced a number of other local fanzines included in this collection.

Scope and Content:

This collection consists of 1 document storage case of materials related to Roanoke Valley sci-fi fantasy fanzines. Included are issues of the *Jinnia Clan Journal, Jinnia Clan Journal Junior, Wyrd, Overflow,* and *Marturian*. Programs from early Mysticon and RoVaCon conferences are also included. The bulk of material runs from 1974 through 1983. There is no full-run of any one of the above mentioned fanzines in this collection.
