Historical Note:

The Roanoke Valley Preservation Foundation (RVPF) was founded in 1988 as a grassroots, volunteer-driven organization with the goal of furthering the preservation of historic, natural, and cultural resources of the Roanoke Valley—City of Roanoke, City of Salem, Town of Vinton, Roanoke County, Botetourt County, and Franklin County, Virginia. The impetus for the establishment of the RVPF was the threatened demolition in 1987 of the Trinkle Buildings, 118-124 Campbell Ave., Roanoke, and the oldest contiguous block of commercial buildings remaining in Roanoke, which were successfully listed on the National Register of Historic Places and restored. This effort led to the founding of the RVPF in 1988.

Since its founding, the RVPF has worked through education, advocacy, and technical support to preserve a number of important buildings in the region. One early preservation effort the RVPF supported was a revolving loan fund for property renovations in downtown Roanoke. The organization has developed and sponsored tours of local neighborhoods and sites and supported the installation of interpretive markers, plaques, and exhibits to educate the public about the history of the region and its important places.

Additionally, the RVPF has sponsored workshops and lectures on topics such as historic tax credits as well as events to teach schoolchildren about the historic built environment. The RVPF monitors legislation both locally and at the state level, and has commented on a variety of proposed laws, land use decisions, and plans, to ensure they support the preservation of historic resources in the region. The organization oversees the Robert France Revolving Loan Fund, which assists brick and mortar preservation projects in the region, and periodically holds fundraising events to support their overall efforts as well as specific projects.

In 1996, the RVPF began recognizing sites in imminent danger of loss due to deferred maintenance, demolition, or incompatible development to raise awareness and encourage their

stewardship. Then in 1999, the RVPF began its program of Preservation Awards to recognize outstanding preservation efforts in the region.

Scope and Content:
