THE SOPHOMORE CLASS of 1931 was organized with a membership of five hundred and fifty-six.



The organization also worked in conjunction with the Martha Washington Literary Society and Expression Department in presenting "The Jade God," a mystery play, which proved a success.


The success of the past year was climaxed with a banquet held jointly with the Martha Washington Literary Society on May 13th.




The Expression Department

and two first places, State.






The Junior World-News


Football






