## The Sophomore Class of Lee Junior

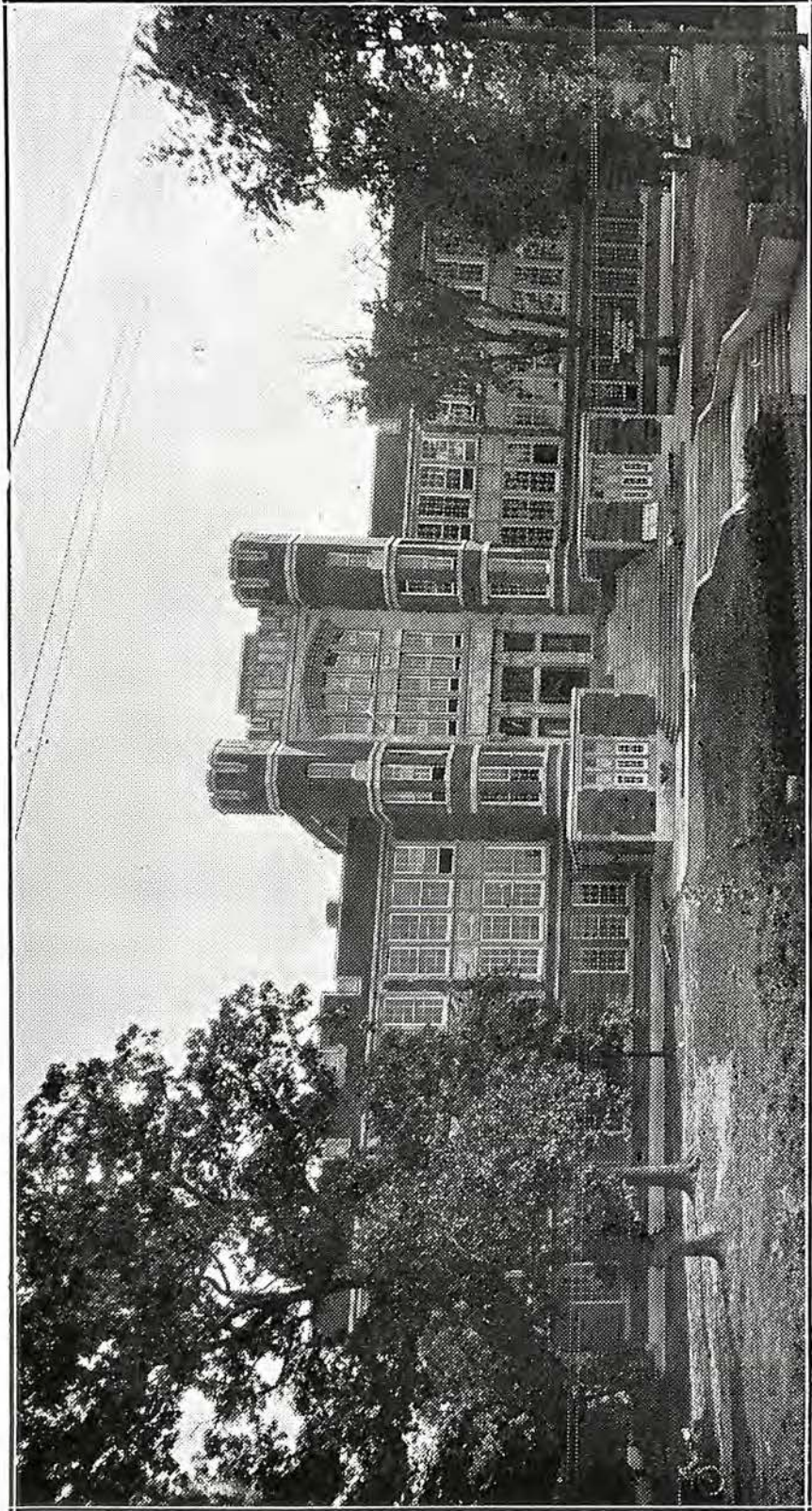


## The Junior World-News

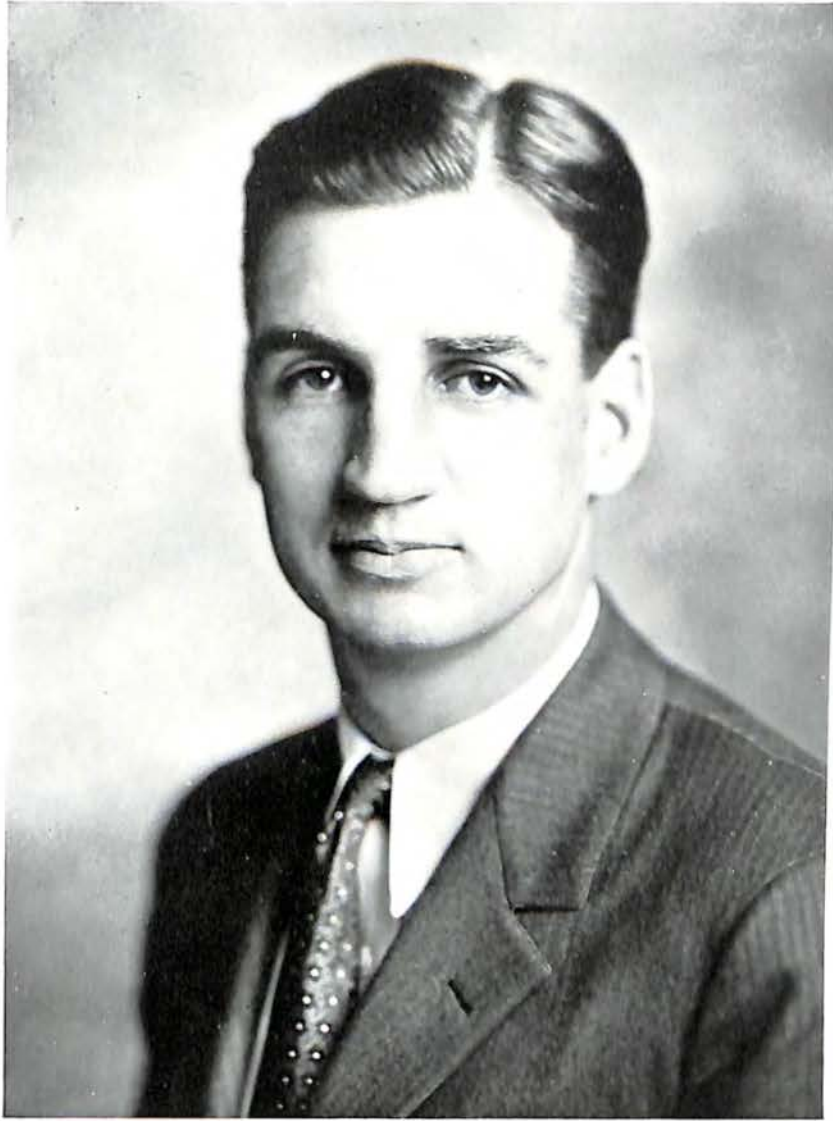

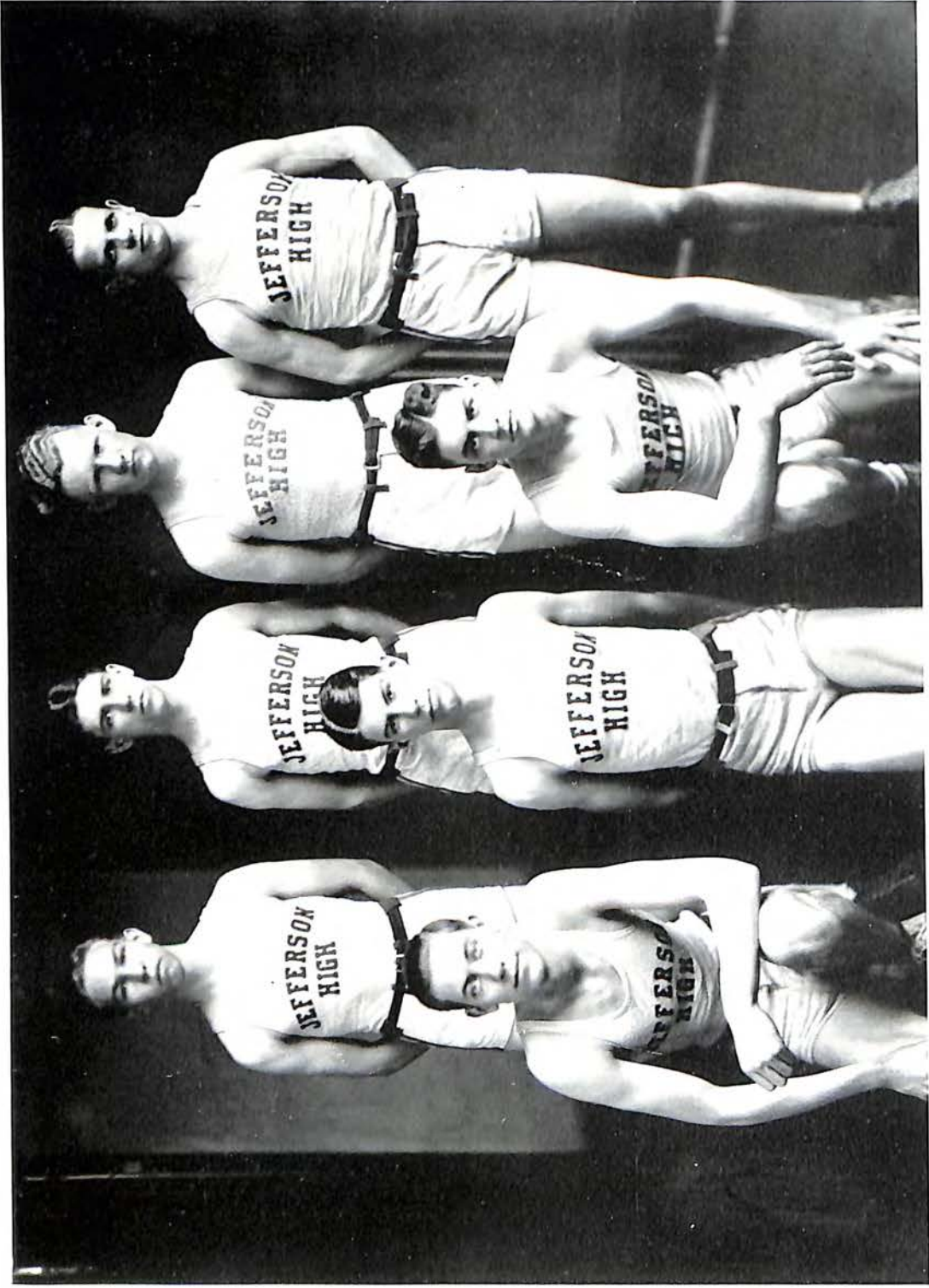
## Football

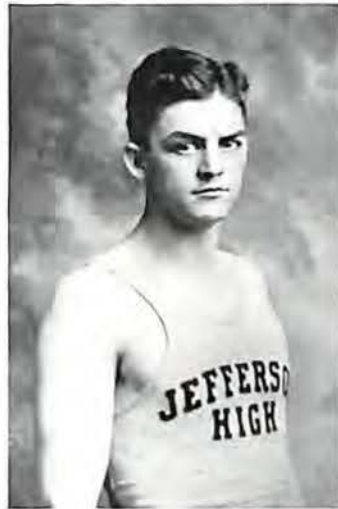

THE BASKET BALL TEAM



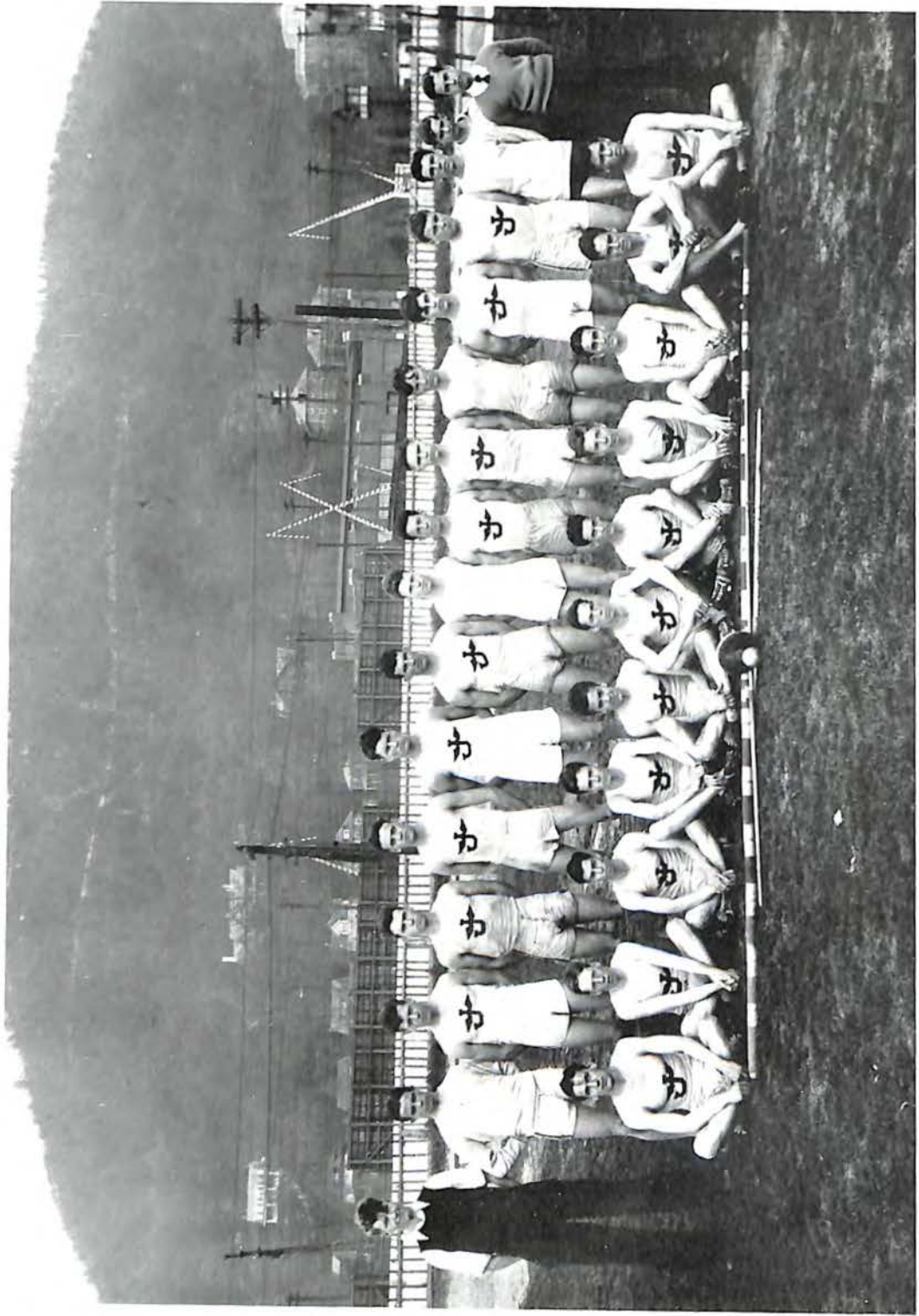
## Basket Ball
