

A Senior's Quest



One of the outstanding achievements of Student Government this year was the establishing of a chapter of the National Honor Society in Jefferson High.



THE SPEECH DEPARTMENT

In this age of broadening conceptions of education, a well-organized speech department fills a vital need. In its functions, it contributes to the creative, the dramatic, and the individualistic in our make-up. We have such a department at Jefferson. It includes classes which provide for specialized work in debating, public speaking, reading, spelling, and dramatics. Teams were organized to compete in the various literary meets, and the play, "The Unknown Dimension," was sent to Charlottesville for the State Contest. The general outcome, on the whole, has been very favorable for the Jefferson contestants.

The dramatic department, covering all the phases of stage work, is complete in itself. The classes begin with expression, graduating to stage craft, and from thence to the more advanced class in play production. These classes acquaint students with a knowledge and an appreciation of dramatic art and with the intricate workings behind any stage production. The students study plays, prepare skits and cuttings from long plays, build sets, experiment with make-up, and study voice, diction, lighting and stage effects. The material is particularly adapted to individual expression and it provides an opportunity for the participation of a large group. In the practical application of the knowledge acquired in the classes, plays and assemblies have been presented and managed by students, under the direction of Miss Clara Black, who heads the department.

"MRS. MOONLIGHT"

The major production of the year was the three-act play, "Mrs. Moonlight," by Benn W. Levy. The production was entirely in the hands of the students and was directed by Miss Black. To give more students an opportunity for a part in the play, it was presented on two evenings, each with a different cast. Student directors were assigned to each cast. It was an interesting experiment to note the different interpretations given the parts by the separate casts. The advertising, tickets, contact, costumes, make-up, props, and the house were managed by the students, and the stage crew was comprised of students. Each department in the school contributed toward the finished production.

The time of the play covers more than forty years, giving unlimited opportunity to apply all knowledge of make-up, costuming, setting and characterization. The moods of the play run from hilarious comedy to stark drama, combining romance and pathos. The enthusiasm with which both student-actors and the assisting committees went into the work, and it was hard work assigned them, and the capable instruction through which they were qualified were solely responsible for the success of the play.

THE LATIN DEPARTMENT


In the fall a chapter of the Junior American Classical League was formed at Jefferson. This is affiliated with the American Classical League, with headquarters in New York University.


Members of this society have seldom missed contributing to the literary points received by Jefferson since the institution of the Virginia Literary and Athletic League.






The closing down conference and the installation of new officers were held again at Camp Tree Top—a sad occasion for the graduating members, but an inspirational one for those left behind.

Several times a year they make a special trip to the Veterans' Hospital to give concerts to the patients.




THE LITERARY TEAM






BASEBALL




GOLF




