The Girls' Club members worked willingly and cooperatively at Thanksgiving and Christmas to do their part in helping the needy.

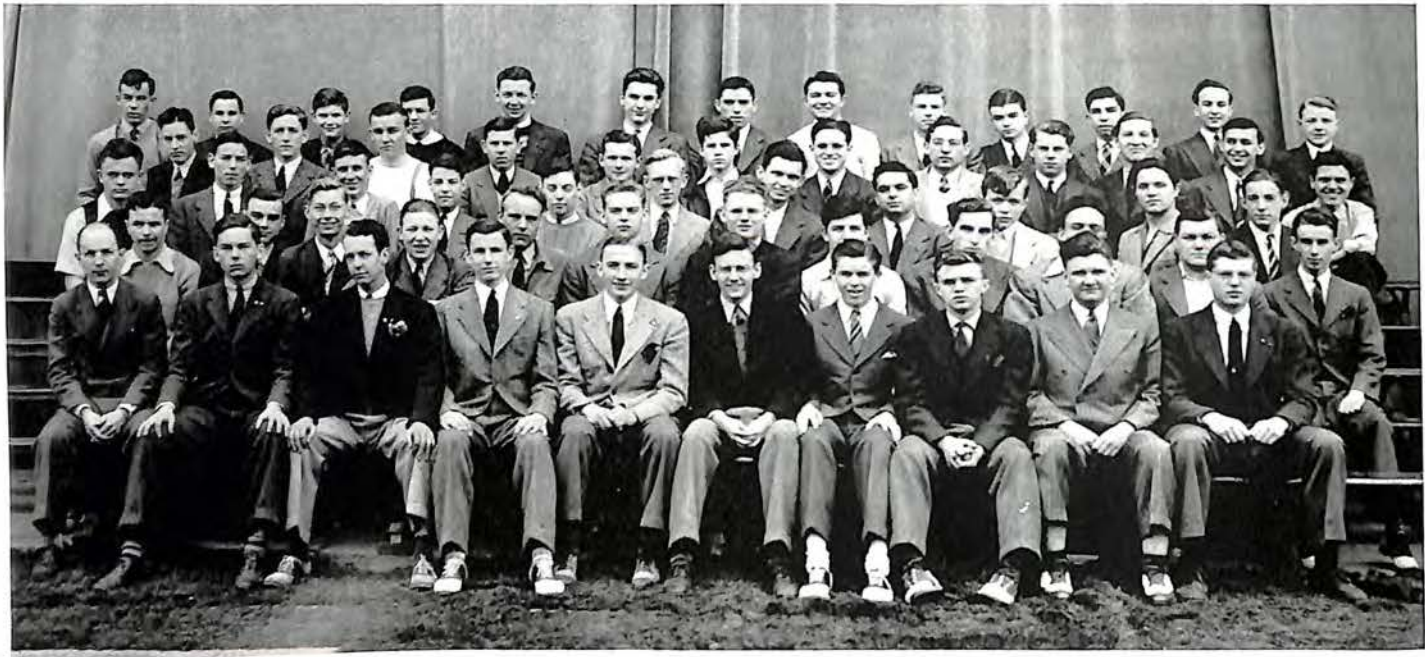

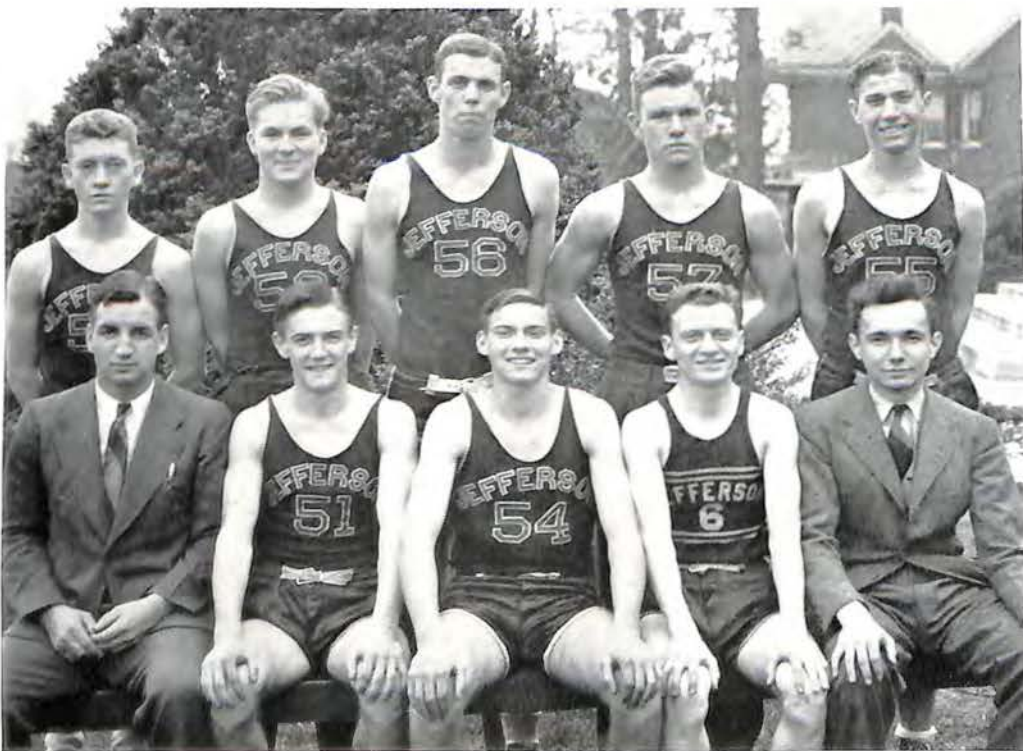
The 1939-40 Basket Ball team of Jefferson was, perhaps, the most irregular athletic team of the school. They lost more "sure" victories and won more "certain" defeats than in any other recent season.

But when Jesse Boston was placed on the All-District team with Watt Ellett on the second team, it tended to "lick their wound."

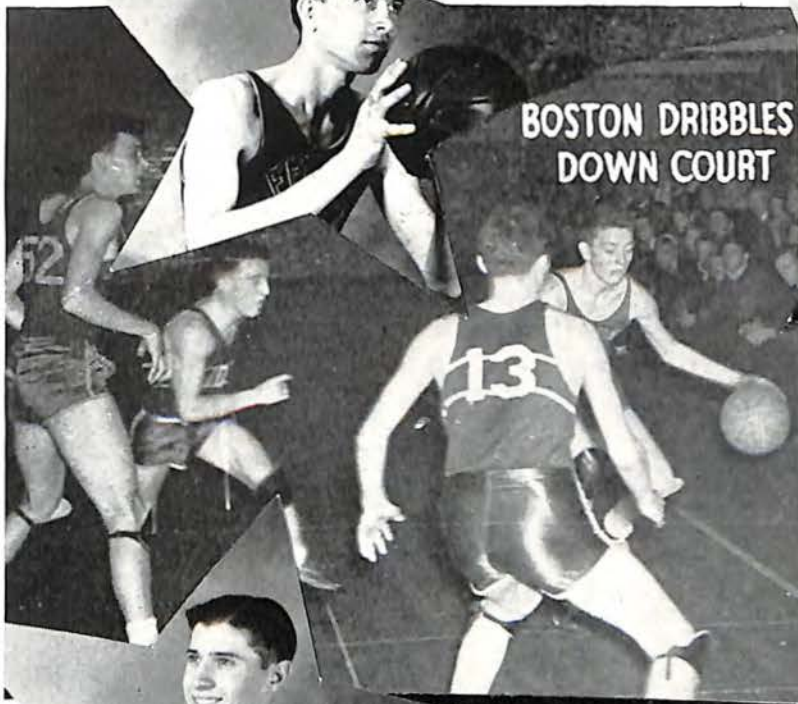
Several boys will be returning next year, among them being Bill Flint and Harry Elliott. Coach Hurt's Squad ought to win the district championship with a more experienced team.

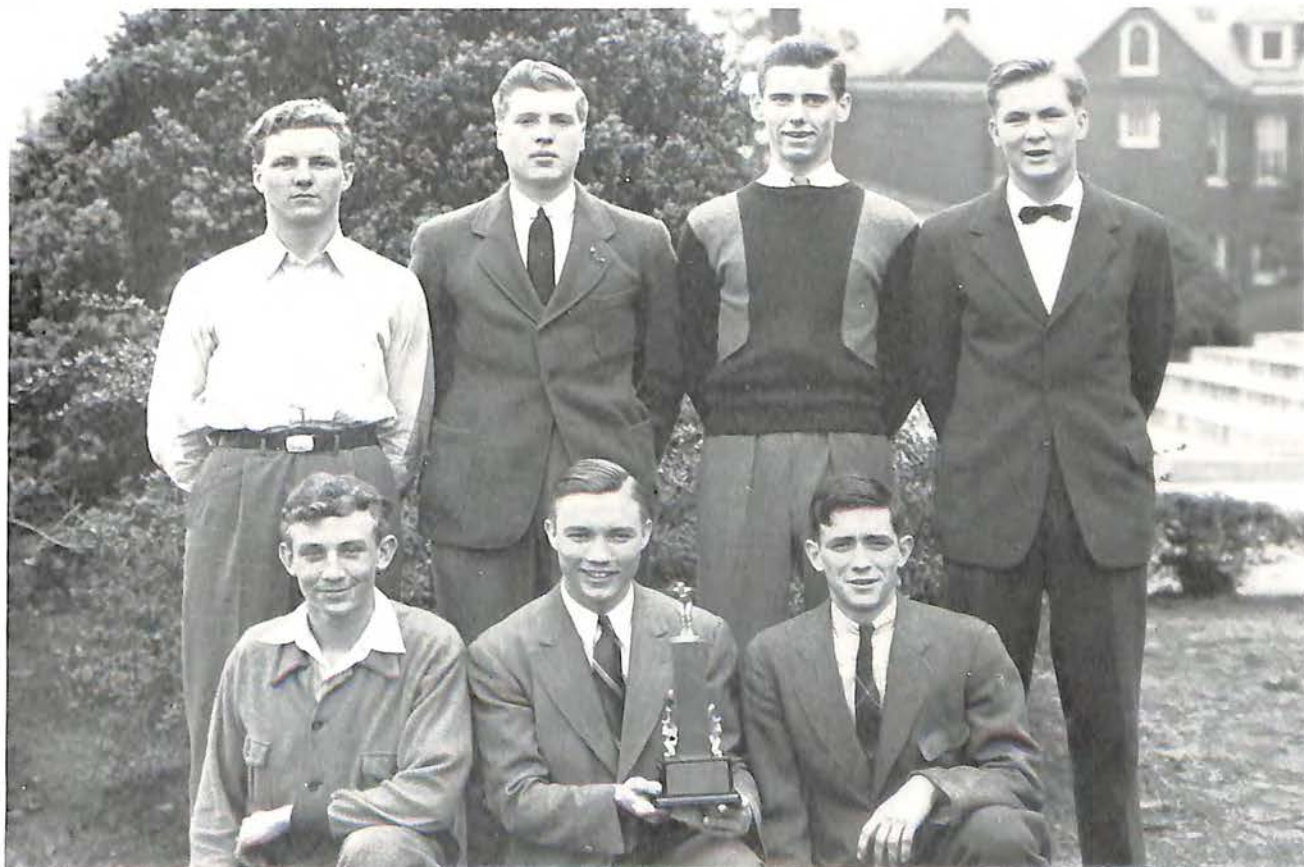
