This year the department was enlarged by the installation of a choric verse speaking course, which is devoted to the recitation of stories, poems, etc., in harmony.

Christmas to do their part in helping the needy.





Gala events, indeed, were the district conference at Lynchburg, Mothers' Banquet, induction of new members, the hay ride, truth


conference, and Ladies' Night.

Several boys will be returning next year, among them being Bill Flint and Harry Elliott. Coach Hurt's Squad ought to win the district championship with a more experienced team.










