

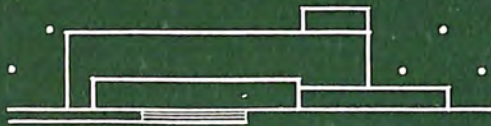

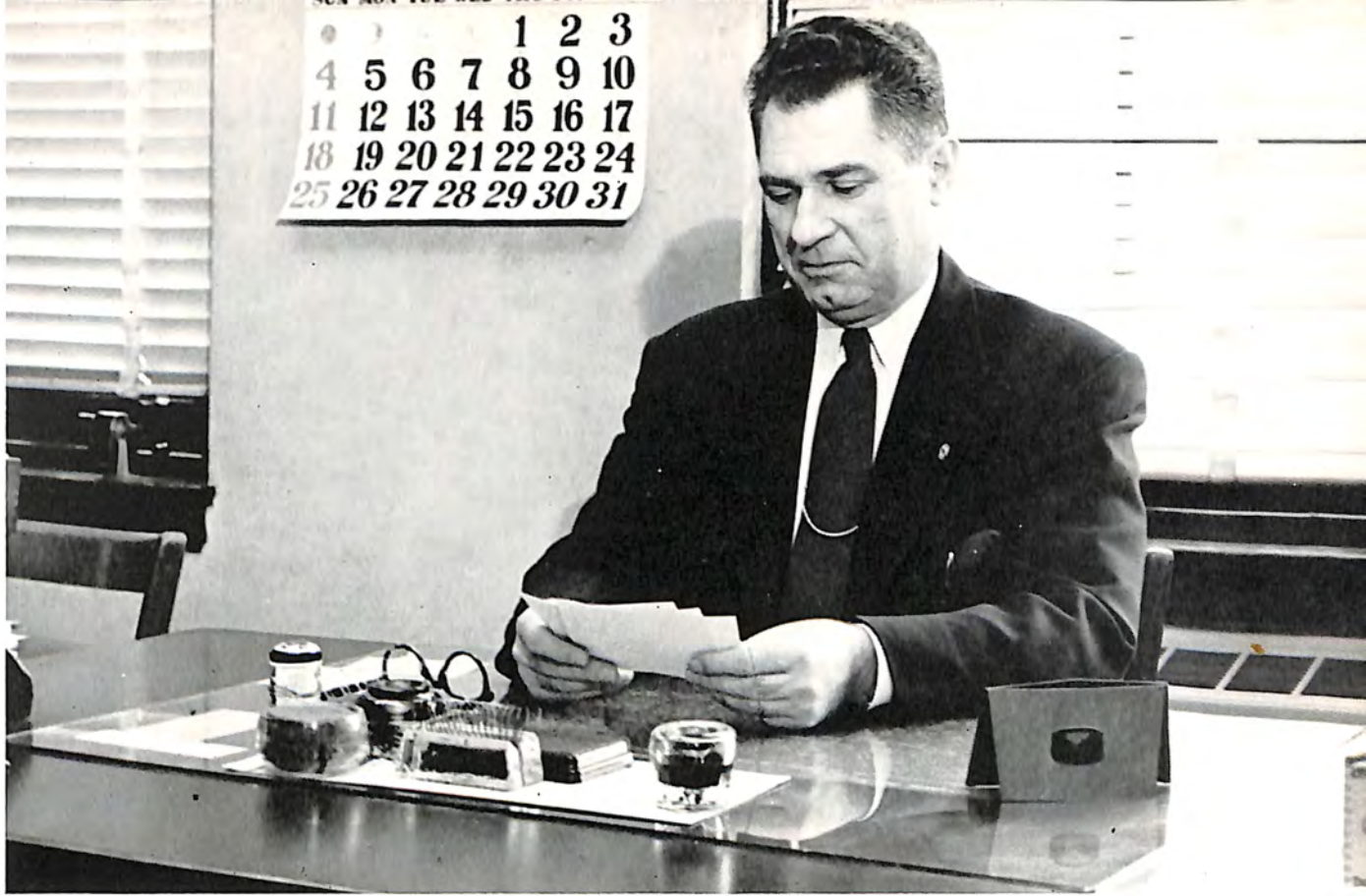

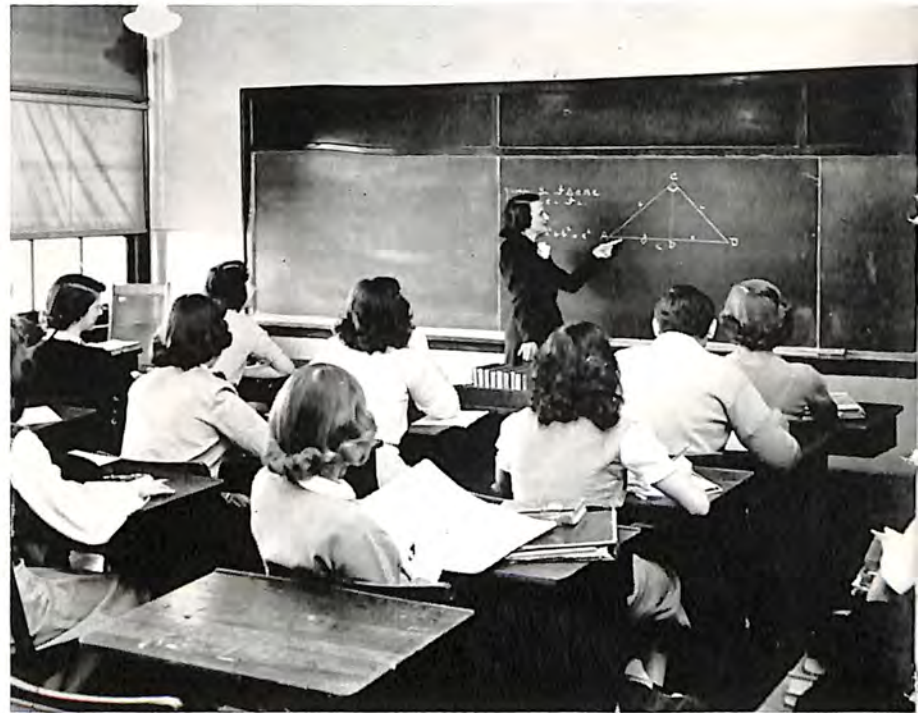

In this, the 1951 Acorn Annual, we the staff have endeavored to portray what is fast becoming an accepted conception: that education is not limited to the classroom walls,

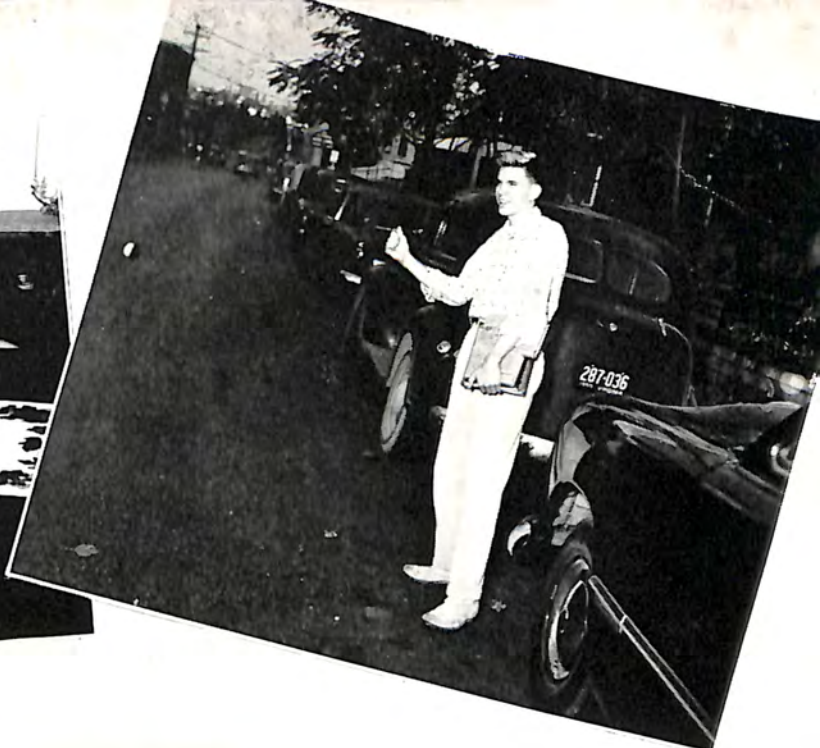

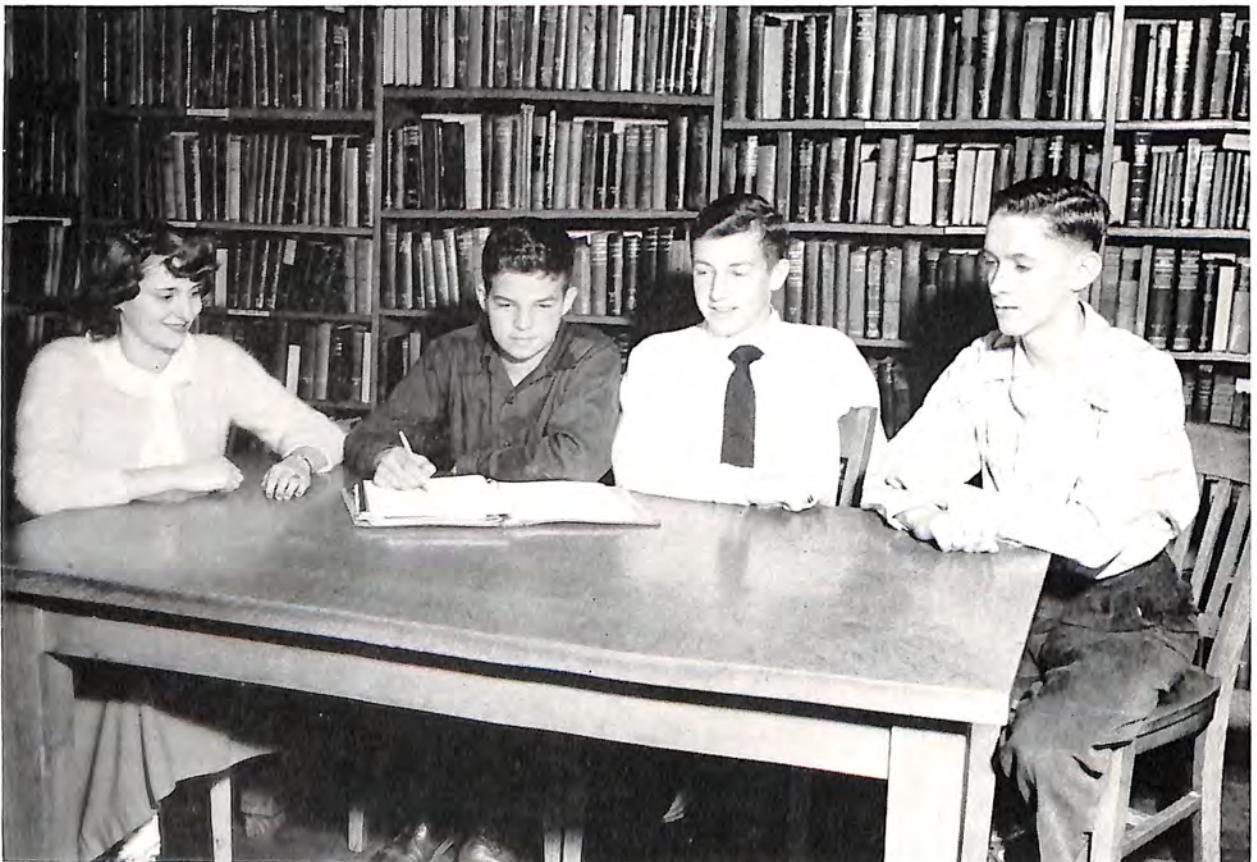

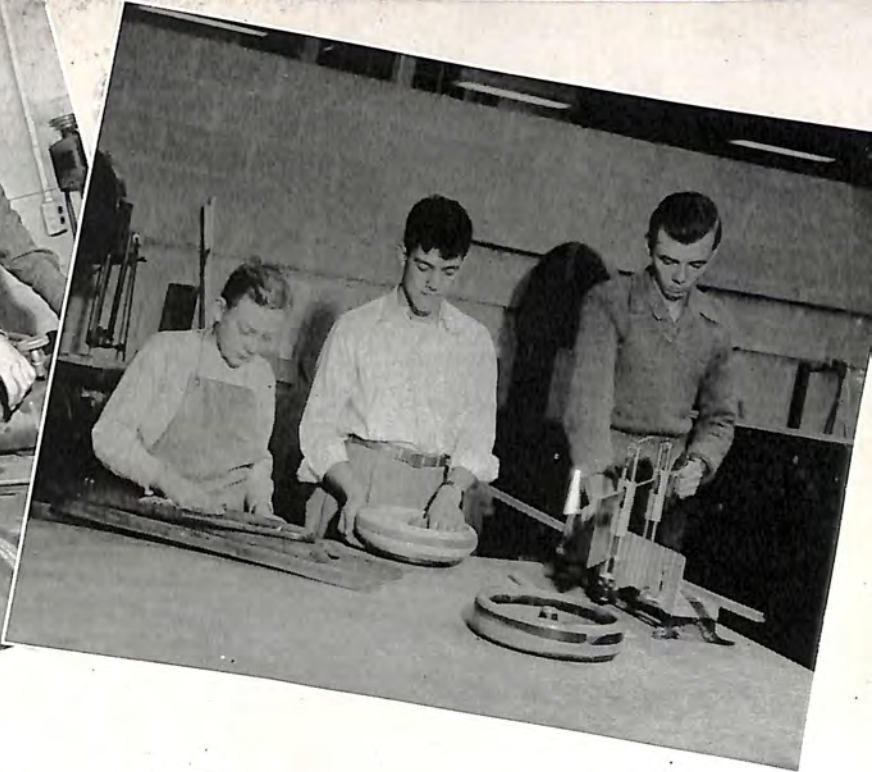
