
The first major duty of newly elected







Our first big step planted us squarely in the middle of a new school, a new faculty and a much larger student body than we had known before.









"Then came the down." The wind blew; the snow fell; and so did we. Danville triumphed twenty to nineteen.




We closed the season with the best record since 1947. Future prospects are yet uncertain. Twenty-seven players are seniors!






