


Our New Office Machines Are Always in Use


As we, the Sophomores, came to Jefferson for the first time, we were bewildered by the strange faces, the new teachers and just being in a high school.











The Hi-Y helps the school by parking cars before home football games and delivering baskets at Christmas time.










