





Let us, then, be up and doing, With a heart for any fate; Still achieving, still pursuing, Learn to labor and to wait. Longfellow







When it is time to decide on the individual who has made an outstanding contribution to Jefferson the choice isn't an easy one to make because there are many to whom we should show appreciation.





Plans are being made to move the library facilities into the old girls' gym which will be renovated into an extremely modern media center.









Jefferson's math department offers a diversified program which enables students, not only to meet their requirements, but also to broaden their interests in this field through electives. Besides offering the usual courses in Plane Geometry and Algebra I and II, the Math department offers Contract Algebra I which is a detailed course requiring two years for comple-

tion; Senior Math which is an elective course in practical mathematics available to juniors and seniors; and Advanced Math. This Advanced Math course has Algebra II as a pre-requisite and consists of studies in Logarithms, Trigonometry, Analytical Geometry, and an introduction to Calculus.

We think one will find that students who take French or Spanish enjoy becoming familiar with customs and traditions of those people in other lands.

These languages are usually taken in preparation for the college bound student.

The languages are learned by the process of oral class drill, listening to recordings, and many vocabulary drills from the text as well as reading stories written in French or Spanish.

Those enrolled in French are taught by Mr. Adams and in Spanish, Miss Brown.

Clubs are also organized to stimulate interest in the languages.

Special Education classes are provided for those students who do not benefit from the regular classes but can achieve success in classes adapted to their specific needs, academic, social, or vocational. These academic and social skills are taught through the vocational oriented material with more emphasis on work study. The students are an integrated part of the school activities and at times the regular curriculum,

Distributive Education is a cooperative work program of education between the school and business community. In the morning, subjects required for graduation are taken. In addition one class of D.E. covers basic courses in product information, display, human relations, salesmanship, and many more. In the afternoon students work in selected distributive businesses. Academic Credit is given for on-the-job training. Earn while you learn.

Home Economics is a course for boys, as well as for girls. This course educates the student in principles of being a wiser consumer, which will then help them to establish and maintain happier and more secure homes.

This course teaches the student things such as sewing, cooking, family and home preparation.

The home economics department also sponsors the F.H.A.








