

 ★ Armed and trusting, waiting for your moving orders.


Soon you'll set out to start your great adventurings, Seeking thrills that always lie beyond new borders!

"That our Jefferson boys who have died may know we have not forgotten . . ."


How can we reach across the gap of life—

SCHOOL


I, with your faculty, trust that this year has been a useful one to our graduating seniors, for of his generation, much is expected.

The club's programs featured many prominent speakers, both local and out-of-town.


The lighter side of the activities included a banquet at which Hi-Y fathers were honored. This was balanced by the usual dinner for under-privileged boys at Christmas.


Martha Washington Literary Society


The purpose of this nation-wide club is "To find and give the best." Its members are junior members of the Y. W. C. A.

Beginning with the yearly Minstrel, in which they sang a group of popular songs dear to the hearts of everyone, they stayed busy right on through the year.


At Christmas, besides participating in the Annual Christmas Assembly, a group of choir members sang earols at Heironimus store.

The highlight of the year was as usual the production of an operetta. This year it was "My Maryland," by Sigmund Romberg, the first "name" production ever given at Jefferson.









The team that had the Indian sign on Jefferson was William Fleming to whom the Magicians succumbed twice with scores of 38-30 and 37-14.



Physical Fitness Program

The Little Wooden Soldier found that keeping himself in good condition was not merely a matter of a few exercises and some scrambled games, it was a down-to-earth job, keeping fit for military duty.

C. W. Rohrdanz, physical director, introduced the boys to tumbling and boxing. These sports give the boys the coordination which is so necessary to a good soldier, sailor or flyer. A mind and body that cannot work together are of very little use to the armed service.

Another request of the Army and Navy officials brought about the setting up of an indoor commando course much like the ones in many army camps all over the country and in many colleges and universities. This course includes a rope climb which strengthens shoulder and arm muscles. Many lives have been lost in the Navy because boys could not pull themselves out of the water and climb a rope. A tunnel to crawl under which accustoms the boy to getting himself out of tight places, and a somersault and chinning bar which accustoms him to having his body hanging in all directions, are also included. The boys must run up a wall which develops legs and toughens muscles, swing off the balcony of the gym on a rope to accustom

himself to absorbing the shock of jumping from high places and to the sensation of falling, walk a board set on edge to develop a sense of balance and timing, and swing, monkey fashion, from one horizontal support to another.

In order to give the boys more of a sense of competition among themselves, a new system was installed whereby all the boys' achievements are recorded on his own individual card. This gave the boys more incentive to work.

Along with these came another new conditioner, a calisthenics team. A group of boys of average build and average height were selected from the physical education classes to be the members of this team, and competition for positions was great. This team specialized in drills and different exercises in which timing and precision were very necessary.

Another factor that drove the boys on to added effort was the City Recreational Department's Sports Carnival held at the Roanoke Auditorium March 12th and 13th. The desire for boxers, tumblers and calisthenics team to make a good showing forced the boys to whip themselves into condition. Also a group of boys from the different schools competed in an obstacle course.




