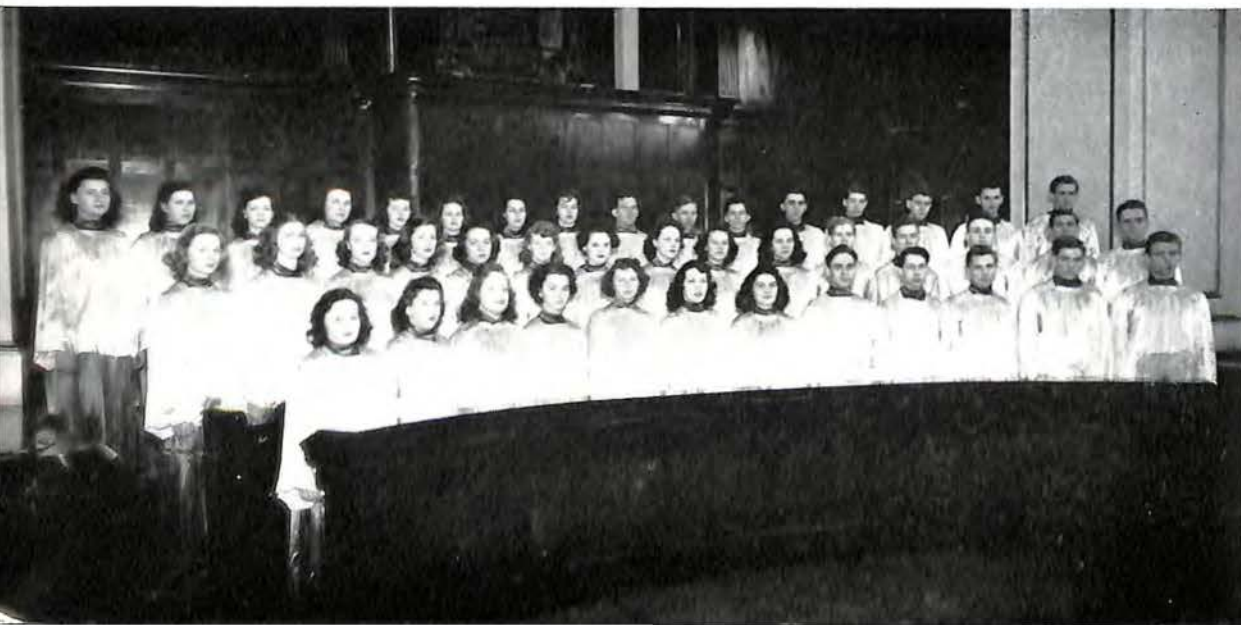
## The Choir

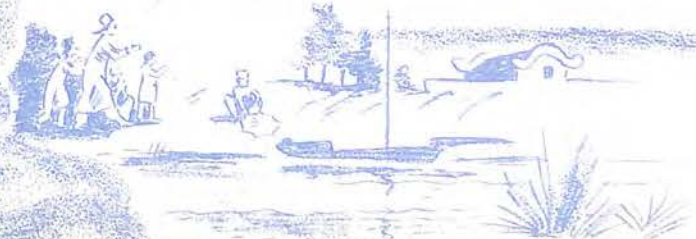

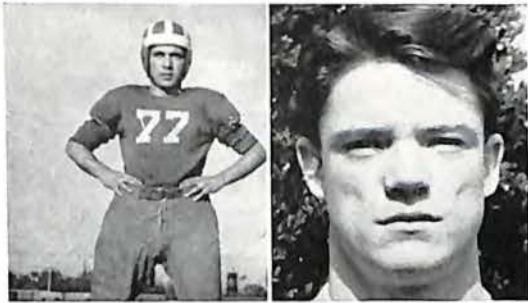

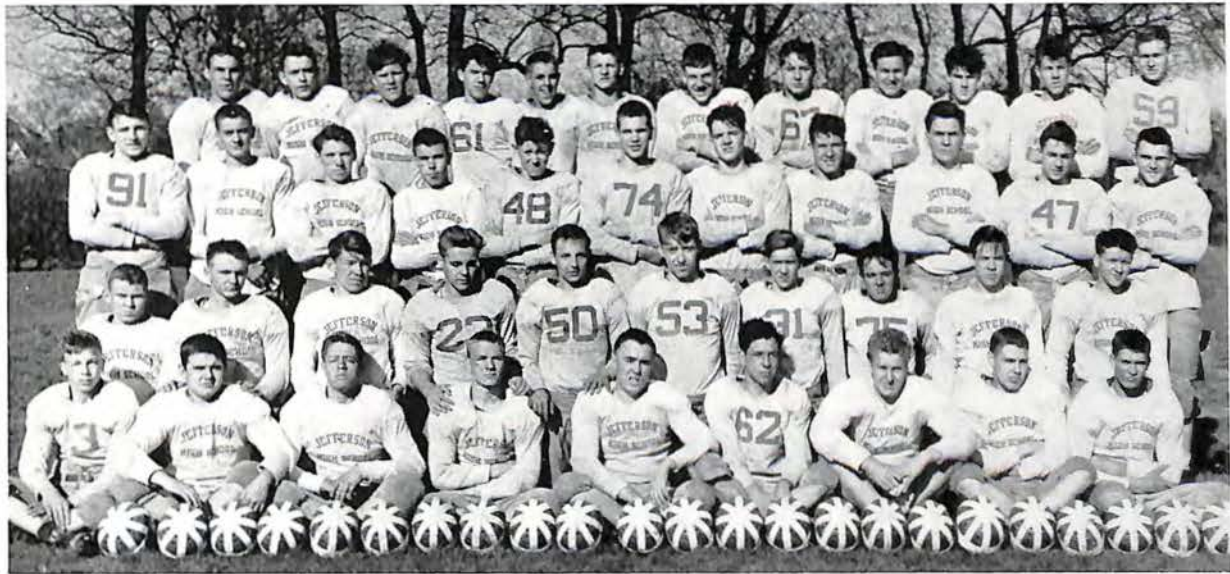
