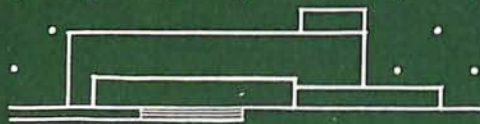

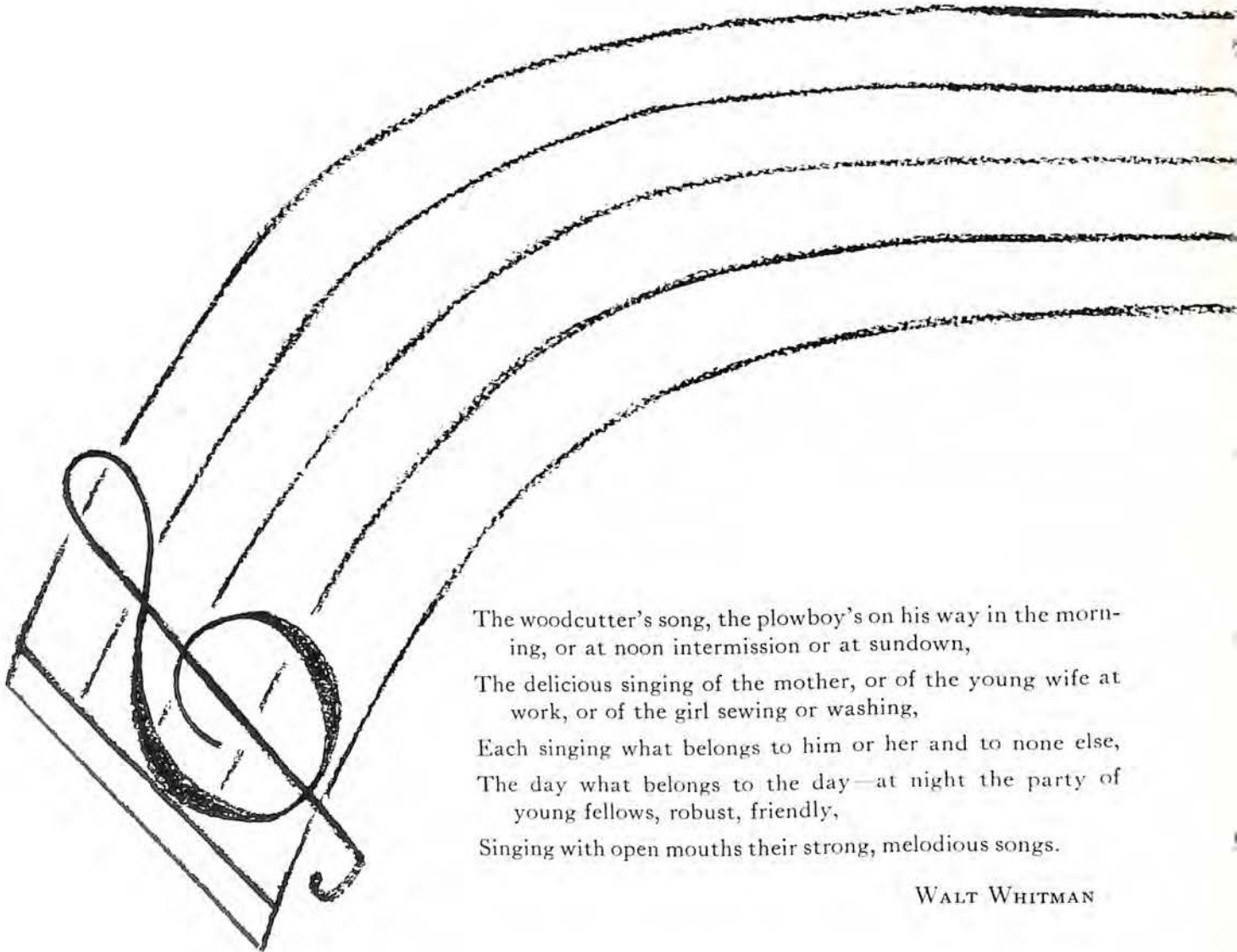

Singing with open mouths their strong, melodious songs.

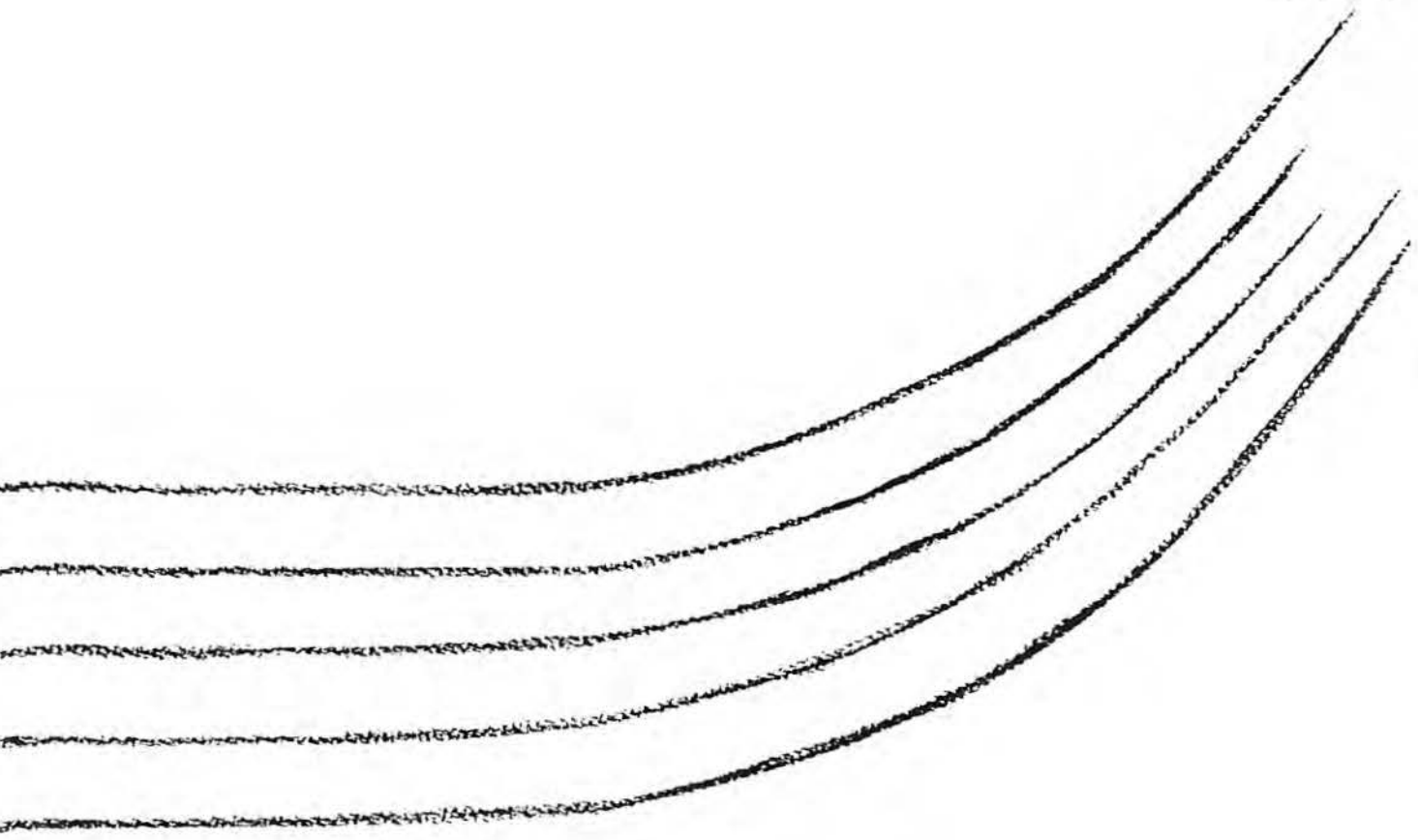

In February of this year, eight members were selected for the All-State band of one hundred and twenty-five pieces, which performed in Lynchburg for three days.

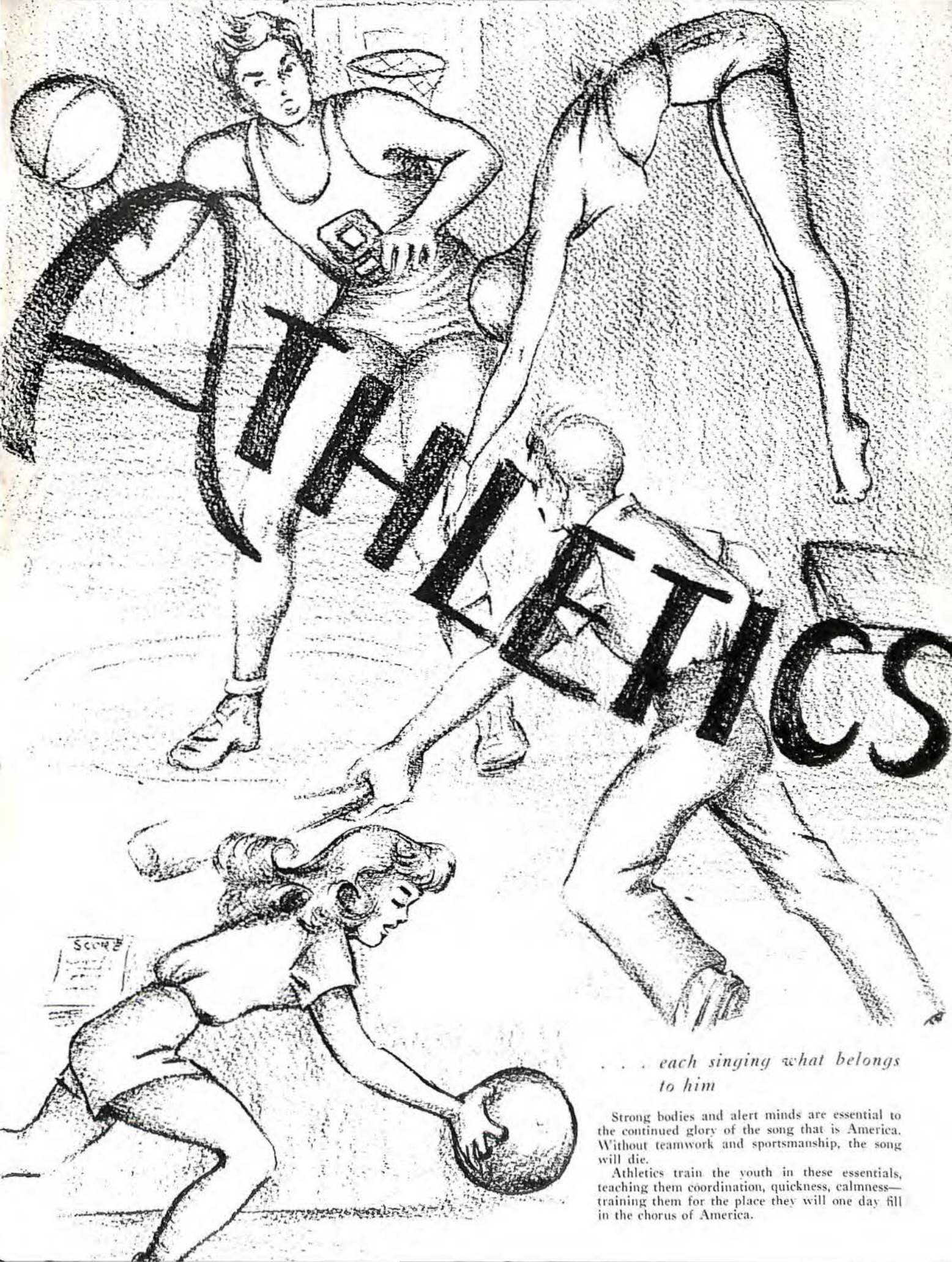
In March, the band, two ensembles, and two soloists took part in the District Music Festival held in Roanoke, and won first place.

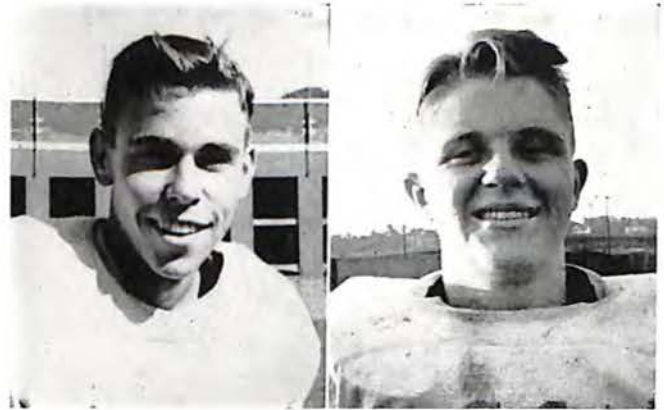

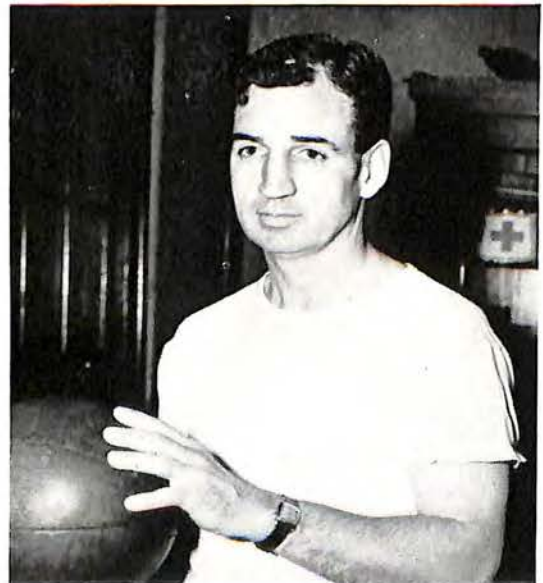

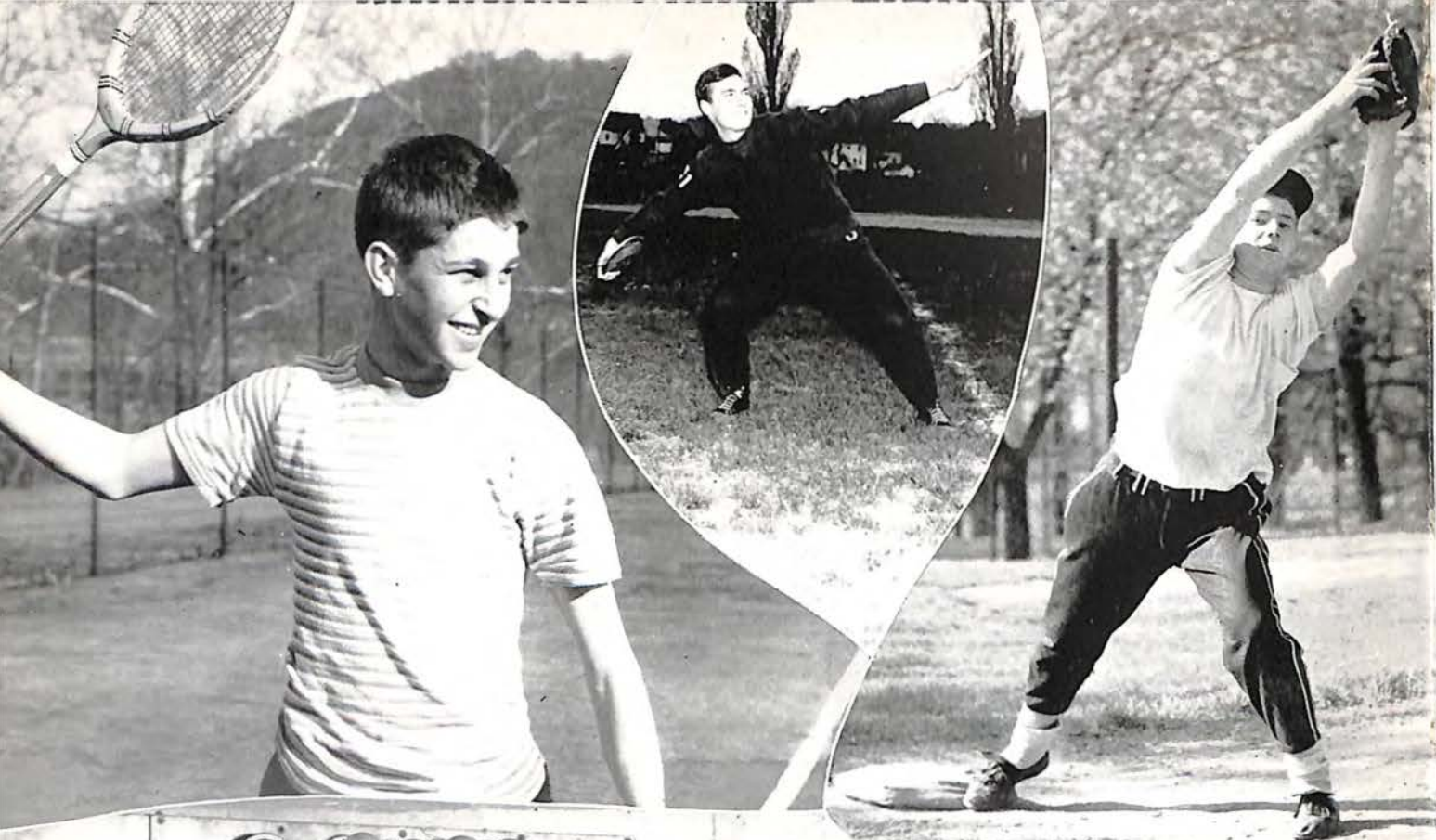
