Downtown



Bridge, all school sports, reading, and guitar playing were his most enjoyable leisure time activities.


We, the students and faculty, were HAPPY to welcome MR. JOHN R. GRAYBILL to Jefferson as our Principal.

Smiles and suggestions about good books for reports, research themes, or just for enjoyment were part of the atmosphere of our library.




She has a strong interest in each student, strives to be understanding in every situation, and to her Jefferson will always be a special and important part of her memories. She is one who has also devoted many hours to






Miss Virginia East Physical Education Health


Under the direction of Mr. Gene Ferguson our choir enjoyed daily rehearsals as well as various public appearances.








