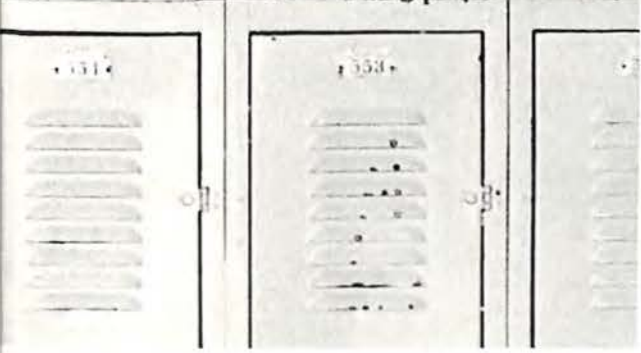
Bobby Aylor, confused as usual, thought he had a student directory.

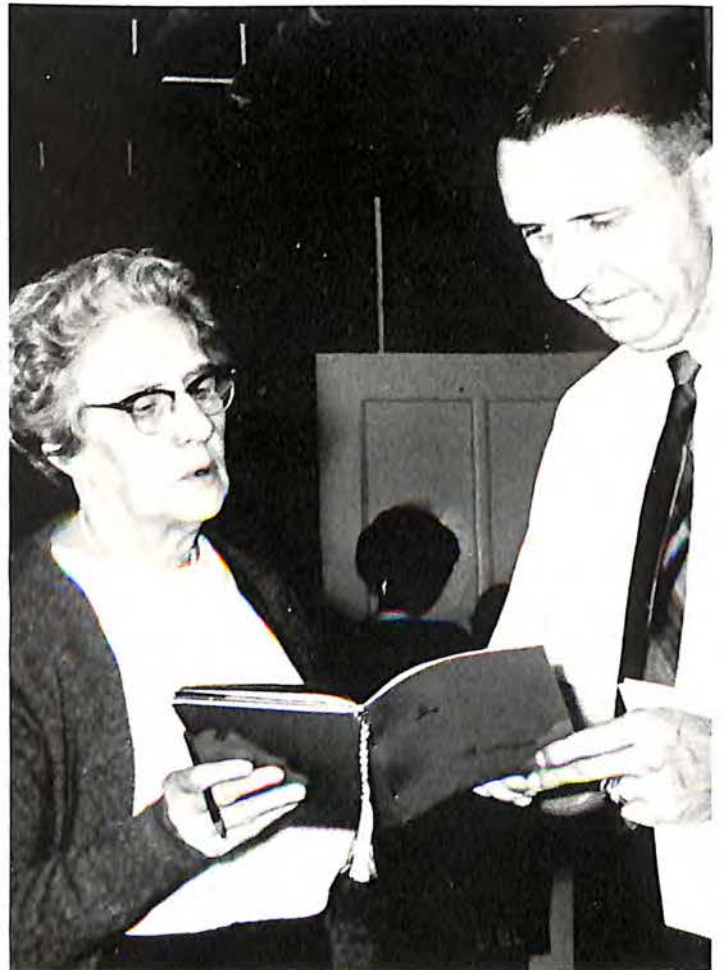
She has a strong interest in each student, strives to be understanding in every situation, and to her Jefferson will always be a special and important part of her memories. She is one who has also devoted many hours to

After the season was over, the girls were permitted to participate in officiating with Sophomore and Junior intramurals.



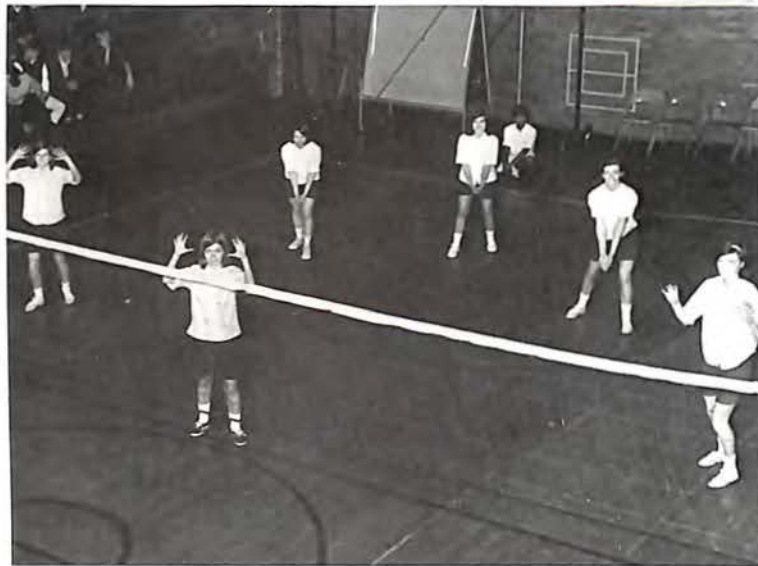

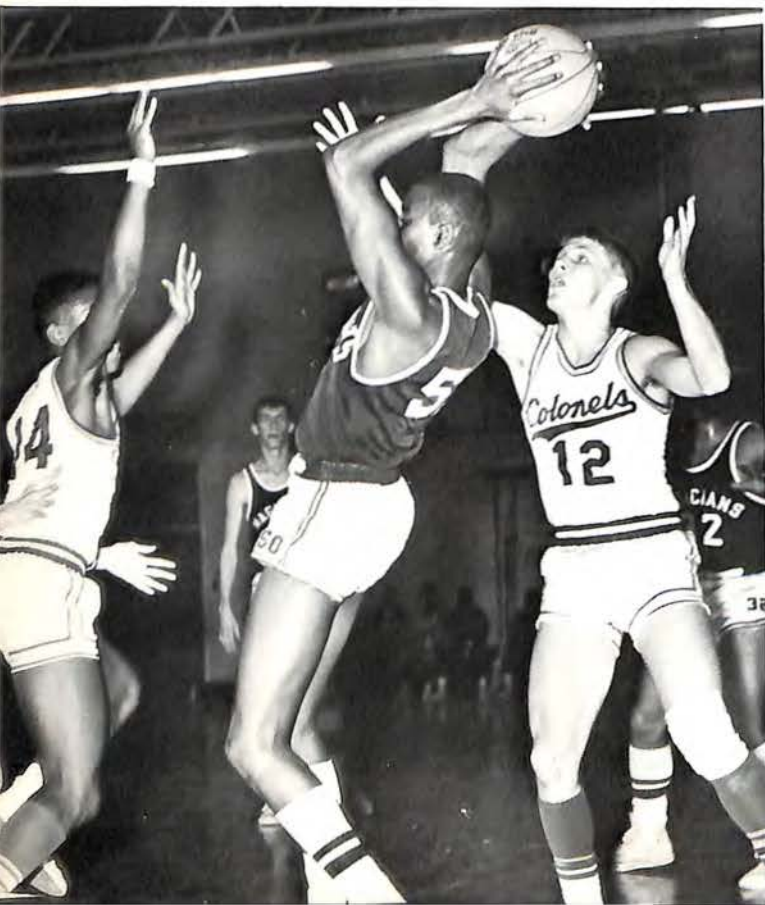
