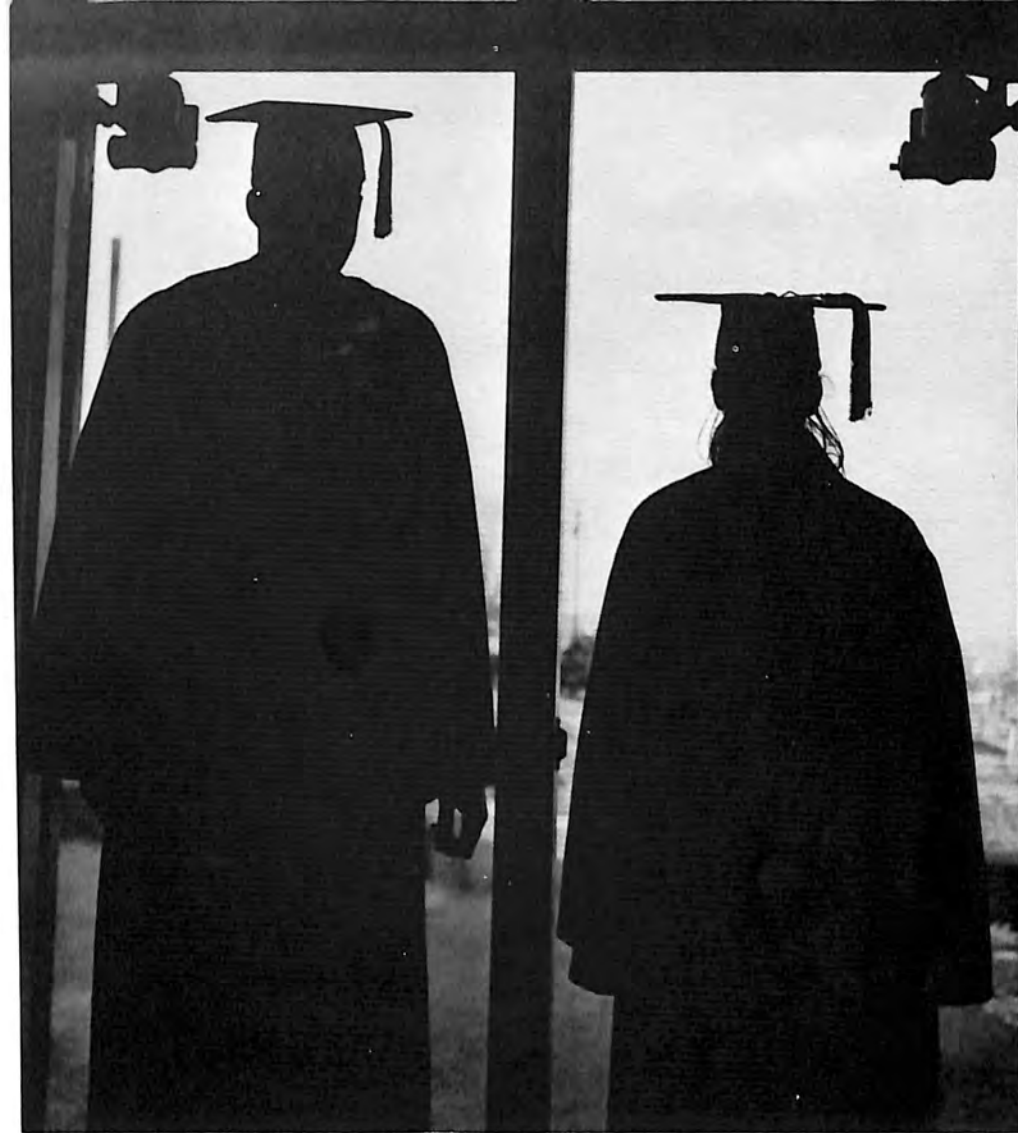

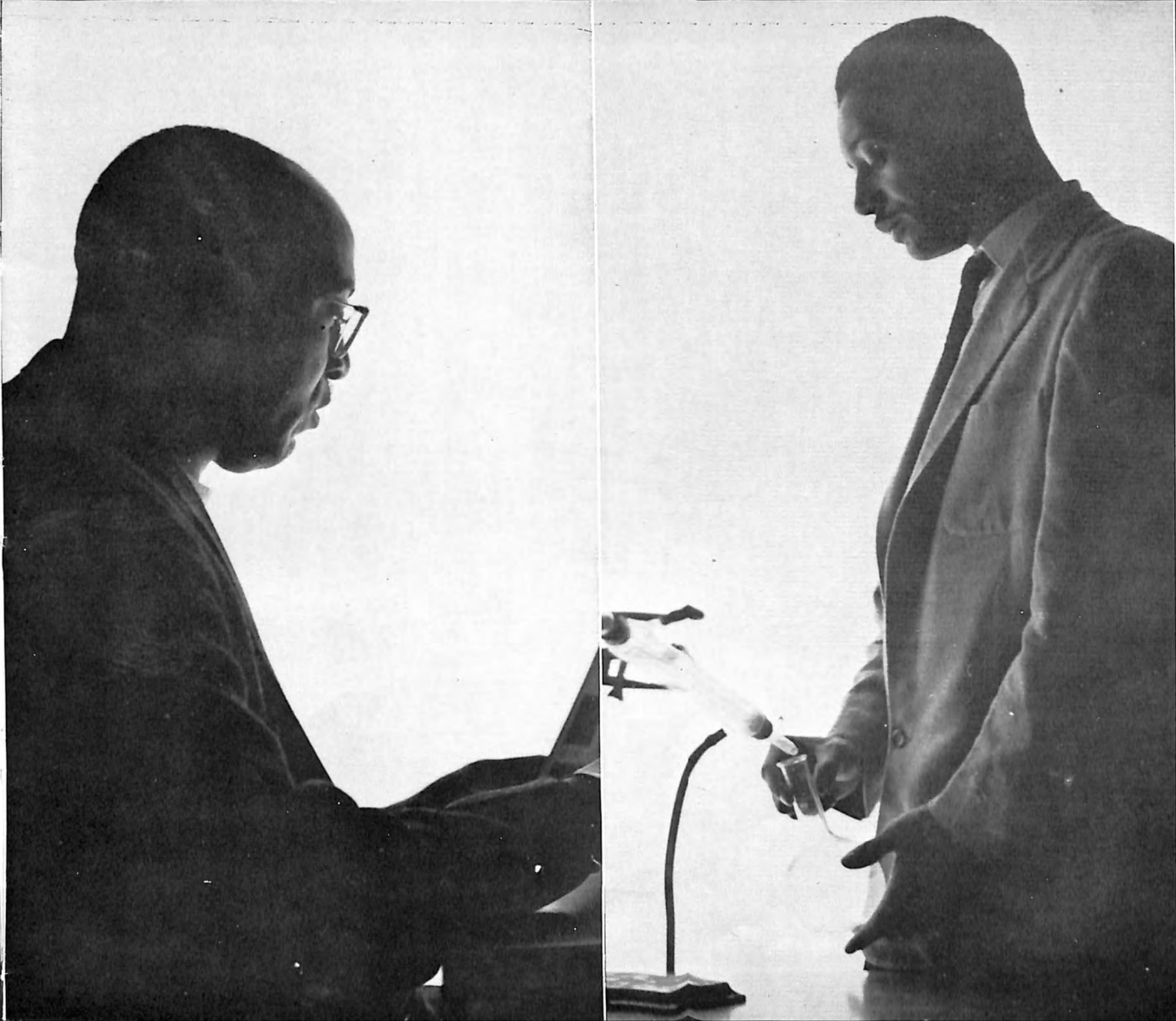

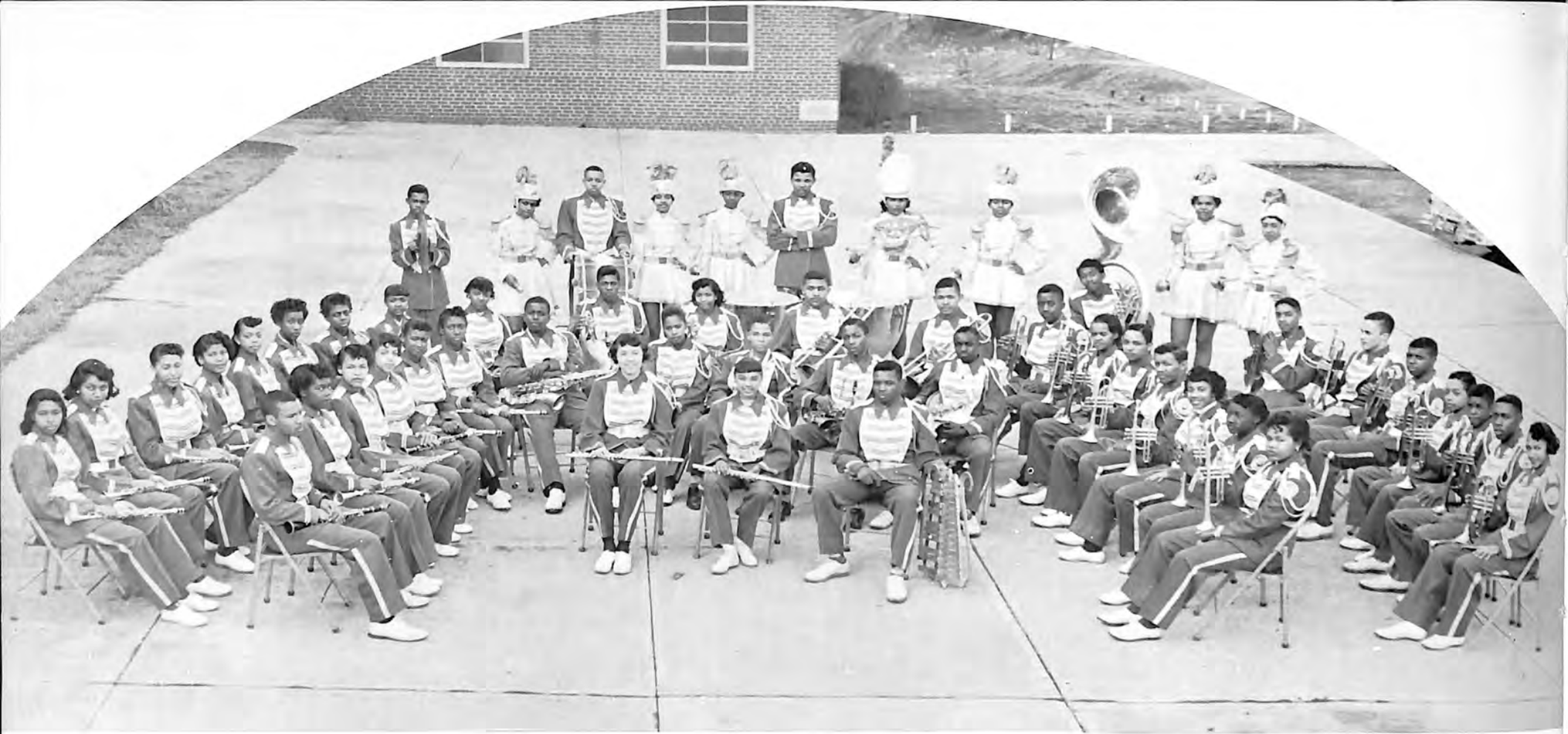

Class History
