# PROGRESS

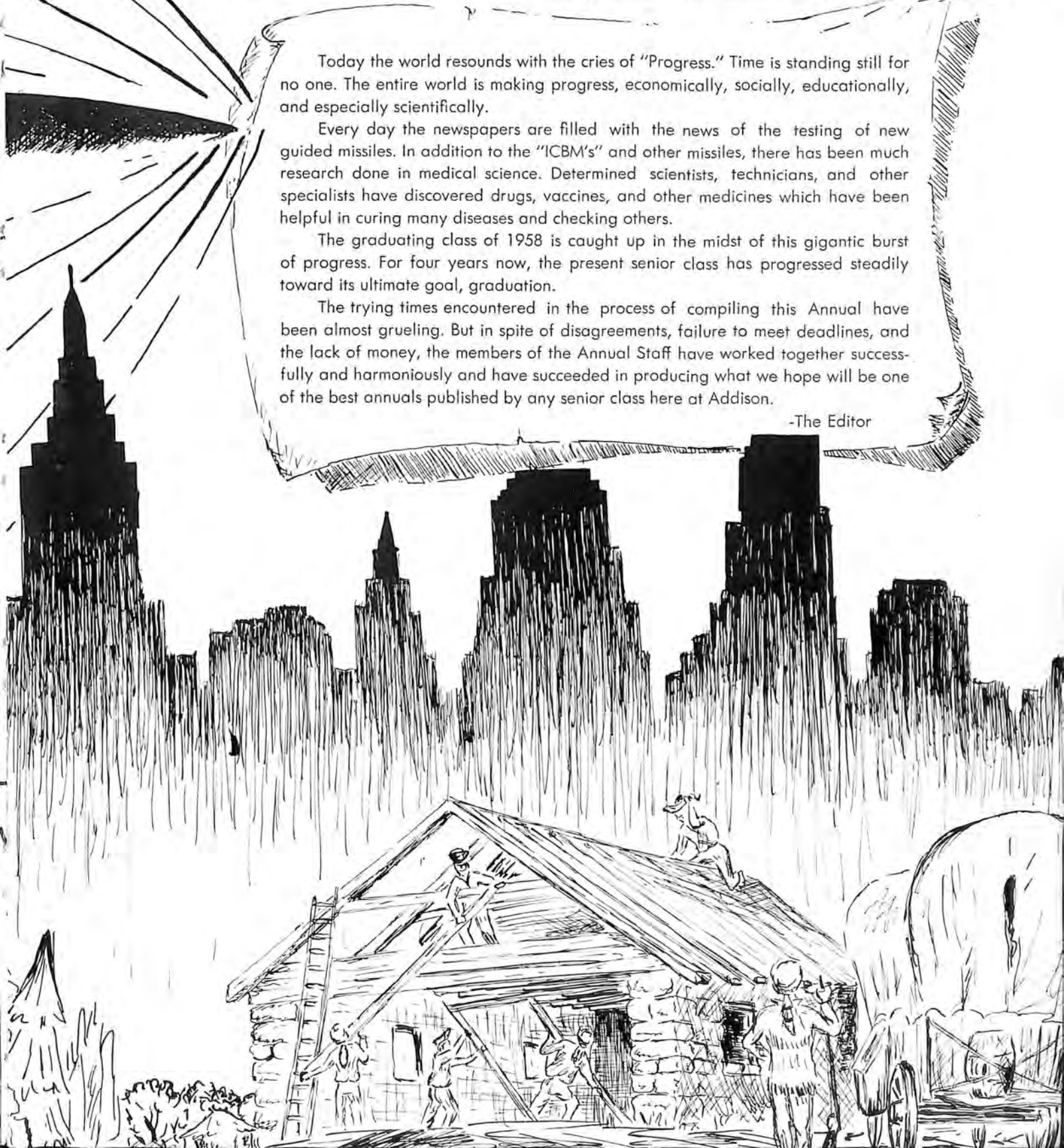
Today the world resounds with the cries of "Progress." Time is standing still for no one. The entire world is making progress, economically, socially, educationally, and especially scientifically.
