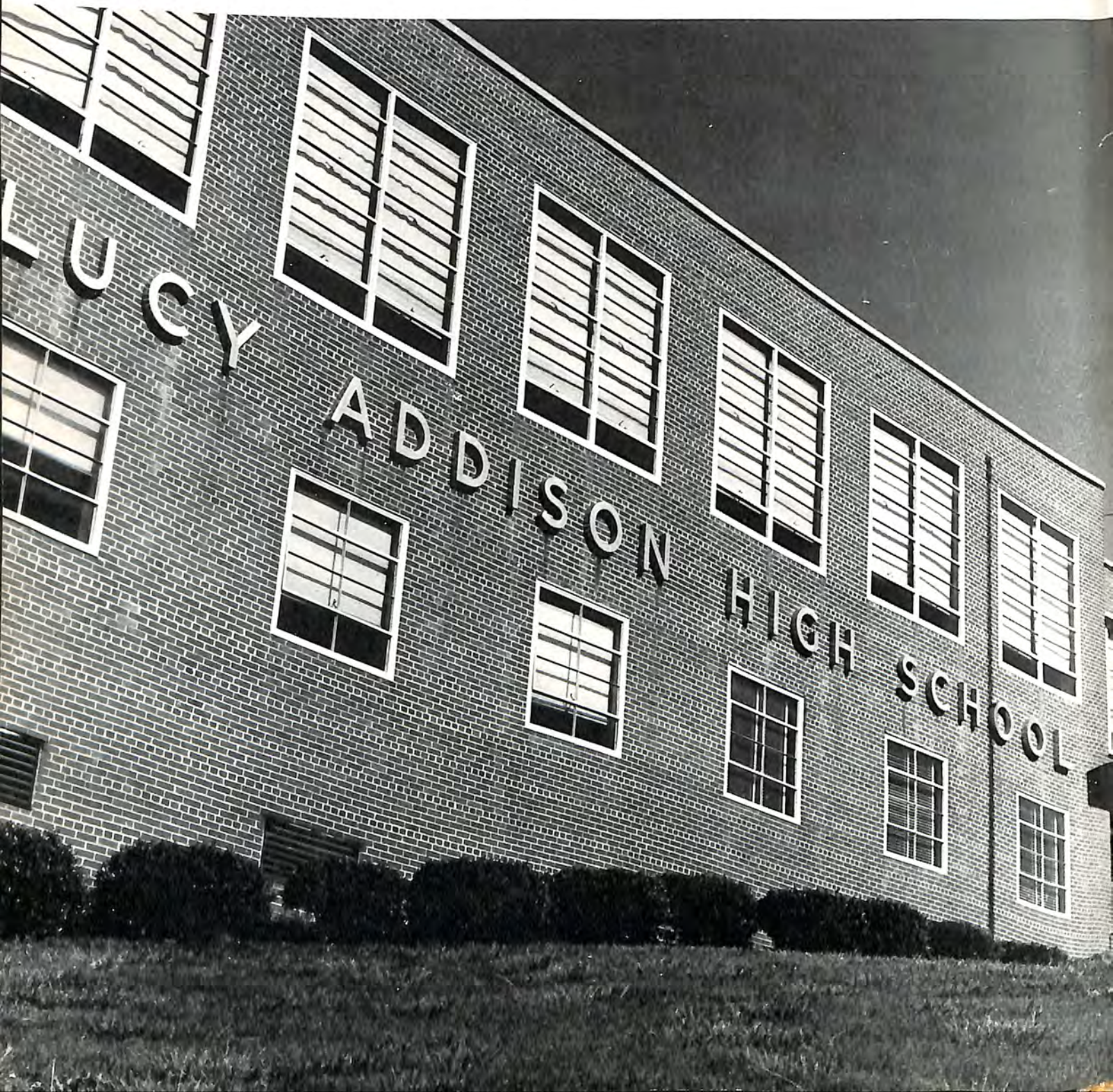

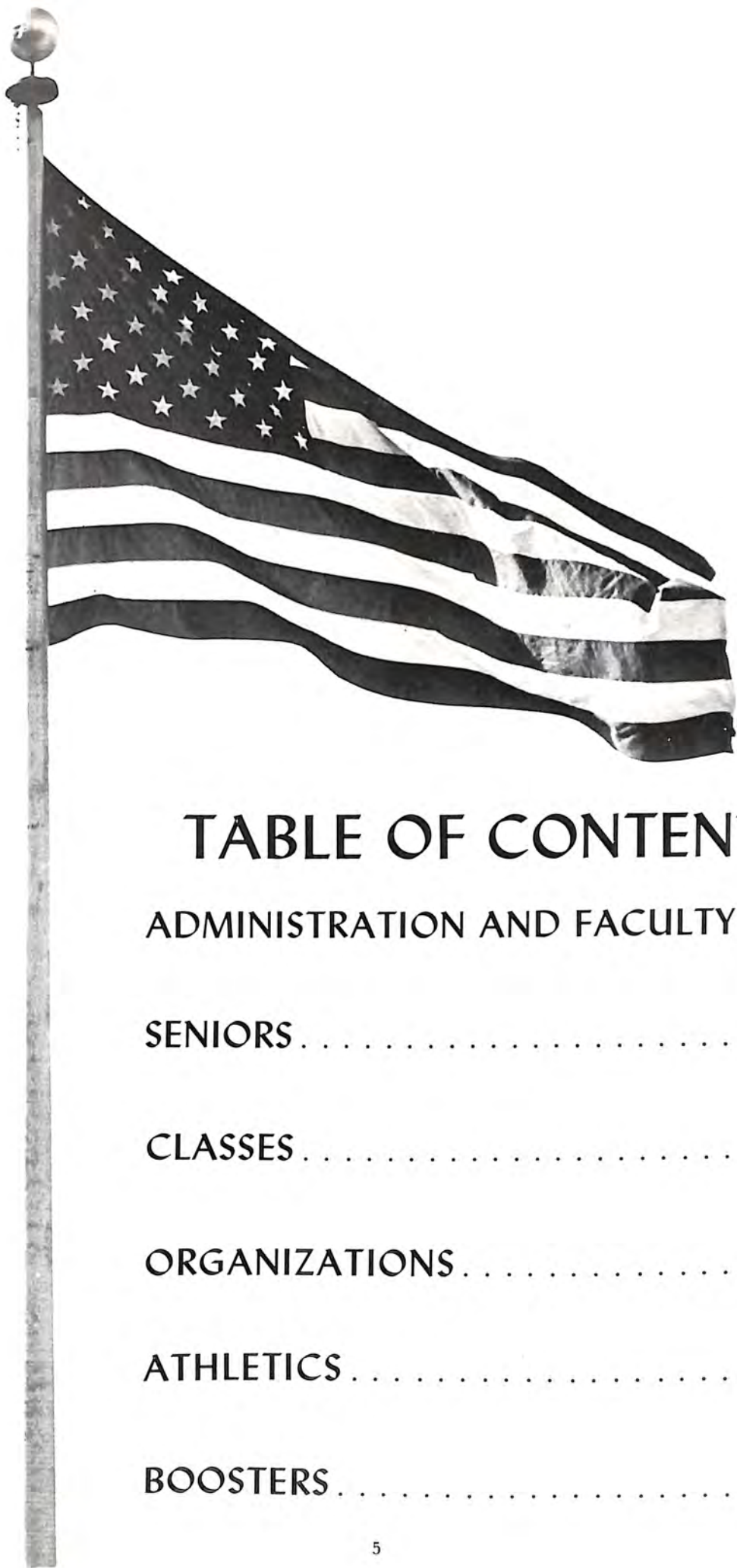
Throughout our high school careers we have participated in many activities offered at Addison. The dramatic group, the basketball, football, and track teams, and choir are among those that helped in our social development.
