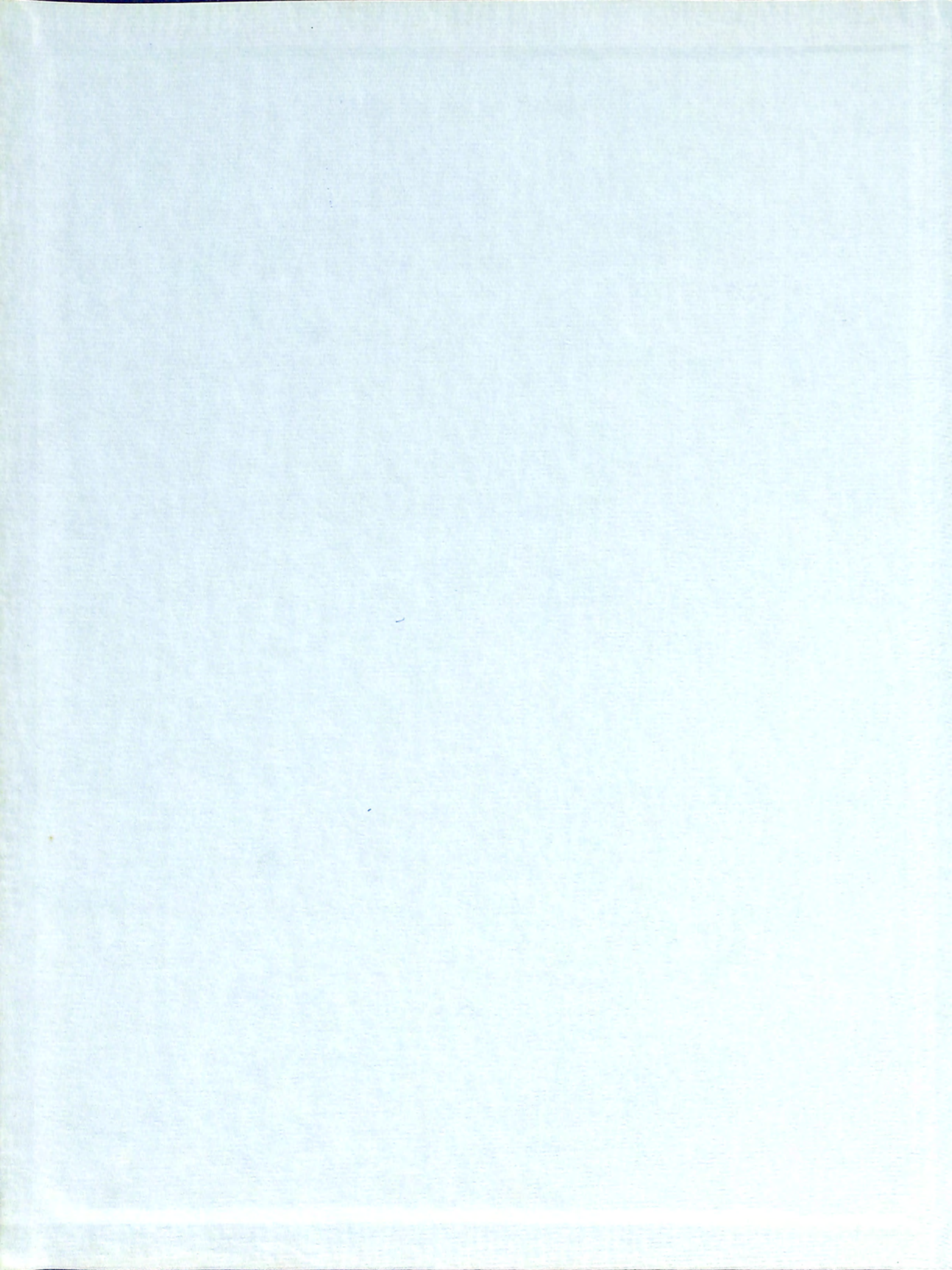

As a record of our achievements during the past four years, we now present to you the 1968 edition of the ADDISONIAN.

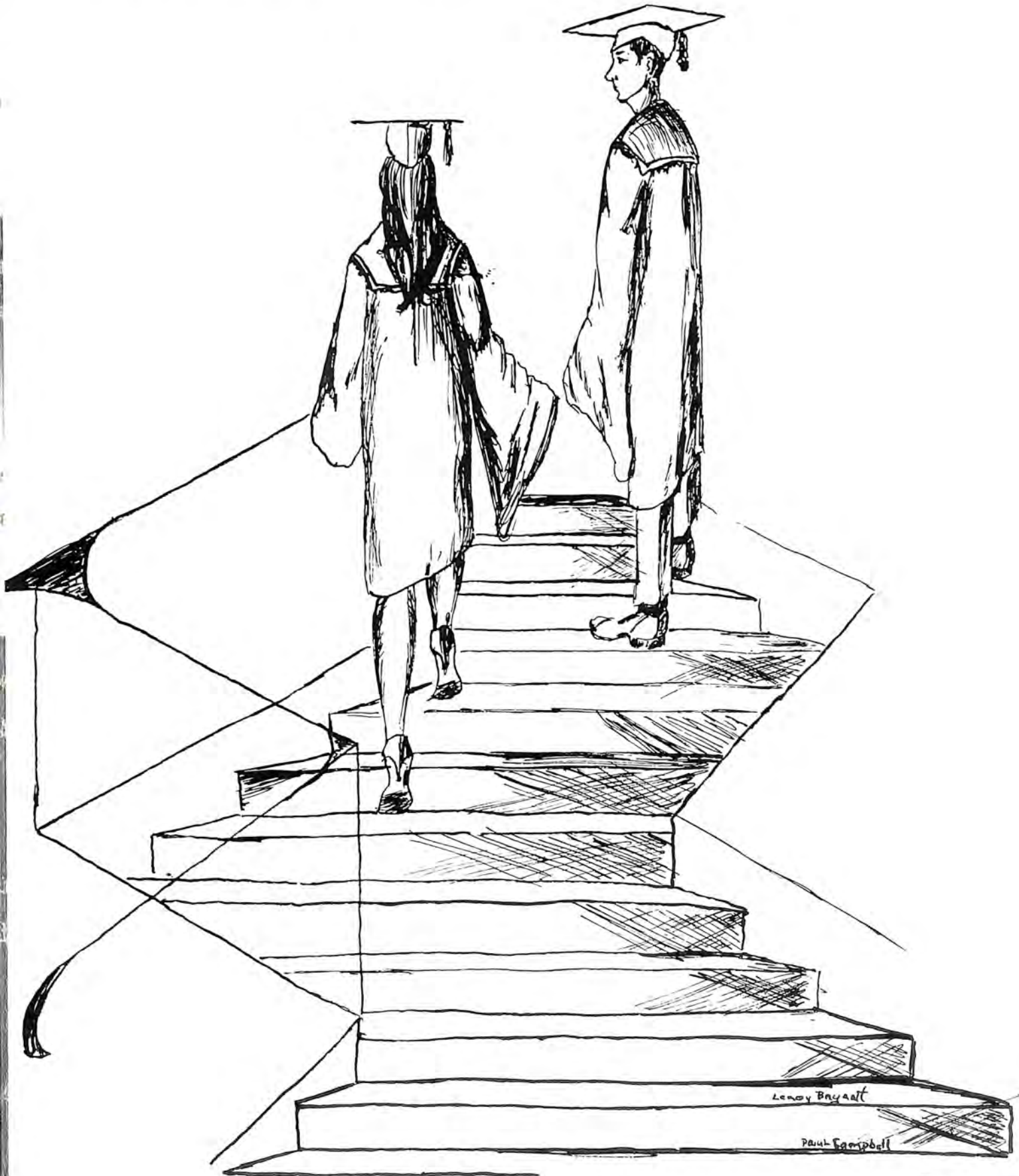
We trust that fate will lead us step by step through many interesting, exciting and challenging adventures to the pinnacle of our endeavors where we will surely find that "Success is our Destiny."

On September 5, 1964, one hundred and fifty freshmen enrolled in Lucy Addison High School while approximately one hundred spent their freshman year at Booker T. Washington Junior High School.

Seen in the bright lights of our freshman year were: Johnnie Riles, Jerelean Perdue, Linda Jones, Jeanne Grogan and William Stuart who won recognition in the Annual Science Fair; Aileen Hooper, Harriett Hickman, Linda Jones, Alonita Vannoy, Jerelean Perdue and Beverly Fisher who participated in an independent world geography class and received an "Independent Study Award"; Mary Sue Jackson who received a Library Certificate for her assistance in Library management; Jerelean Perdue who was presented the "Scholarship Award" for her academic success; Alonita Vannoy and Beverly Fisher who were recipient of the "D.A.R. Good Citizenship Award".

Records indicate very little progress during our sophomore year as we spent most of our time making decisions, mistakes and adjustments.

In no time we were juniors – just two more steps away from graduation. This year we really showed the Addison Family how truly great this class could be, and we made giant steps toward success.

Anthony Wade was elected Vice President of the Virginia Student Participation Association; Ruth Hylton was a runner up for Miss Homecoming; Harriet Hickman, Mary Sue Jackson, Jerelean Perdue, Linda Jones, Alonita Vannoy and Aileen Hooper were initiated into the National Honor Society; Gearl Thompson won second place in the DECA State Junior Board Member Contest; Johnnie Riles won third place in the Negro History Poetry Contest; Bernice Steptoe, Alonita Vannoy and Wanda Thomas received scholarships to attend the 1967 Humanities Institute at Bennett College; Wanda Thomas ran for Miss Junior Achievement in the Roanoke, Valley; Robert Brandon won second prize in the City-County Boys Division of the Science Fair.

As a result of much preparation and hard work, we entertained the 1967 Seniors at the Junior-Senior Prom. The theme "Rhapsody in Blue" was beautifully carried out, making this effort the highlight of our Junior Year.

In the area of athletics, Gearl Thompson won first and second place for her performance in the four hundred yard relay in the tenth and eleventh grades respectively. Milton Brown, Tellis LaMar, James Bradshaw, James Montree, Melvin Clarke, Alvin Hayes, Michael Terry, Paulette Colston, and William Pannell are among those who have made headlines for our class.

Nineteen Hundred and Sixty Eight will long be remembered as "The Year That Was" because this was our Senior year.

Gearl Thompson and Bobby Perkins were elected D.E. Students-of-the-Year in the Addison Chapter of DECA; Linda Jones was selected by the student body to be Miss Addison, and Debra Powell was crowned Miss Homecoming.

The Senior Class officers were Alonita Vannoy, President; James Bradshaw, Vice-President; Jerelean Perdue, Secretary; Mary Jackson, Assistant Secretary; Aileen Hooper, Treasurer; William Hodnett, Chaplain.

We have come a long way in four years and are proud of the progress that we have made. Although our hearts are saddened at the thoughts of ending our high school days, we look forward to the future and hope for a successful, happy life.
