CLASS HISTORY

After the excitement of the Prom, the Heralds for the Vespers and Commencement were selected. This, too, we count as an honor for they are chosen by the principal. These honorees were: Dolores Caldwell, Margie Dent, Oglivia Hackley, Jacqueline Hairston, and Gloria Parker. Now we were ready for the summer which proved to be exciting for all of us but especially for Harriette Pawley who received a scholarship to do Science Research at Howard University Laboratory.

At last, our goal is in sight, for it is now September, 1962. Victory, for which we have anxiously been awaiting, is assured. Our class officers for this year are: President, Shirley Kasey; Vice-President, Stanley Hale; Secretary, Bettie Thompson; Assistant Secretary, Ernestine Foy; Treasurer, Richard Dudley; Business Manager, Harriette Pawley.

Senior officers on the S. P. A. are: Oglivia Hackley, President; Pearl Alexander, Secretary; and Ezra Jones, Reporter. Doris Martin was elected Editor-in-Chief of the Spotlight Press for the year, 1961-62.

This year, our boys took over the leadership positions of the sports activities. The three Captains of the Football team are: James Cabbler, Bobby Baker, and Douglas Taborn. To lead the Basketball team through the year, Douglas Taborn was elected Captain and Marcellus Edwards was elected Co-Captain. The Track team also elected Marcellus Edwards as Captain.

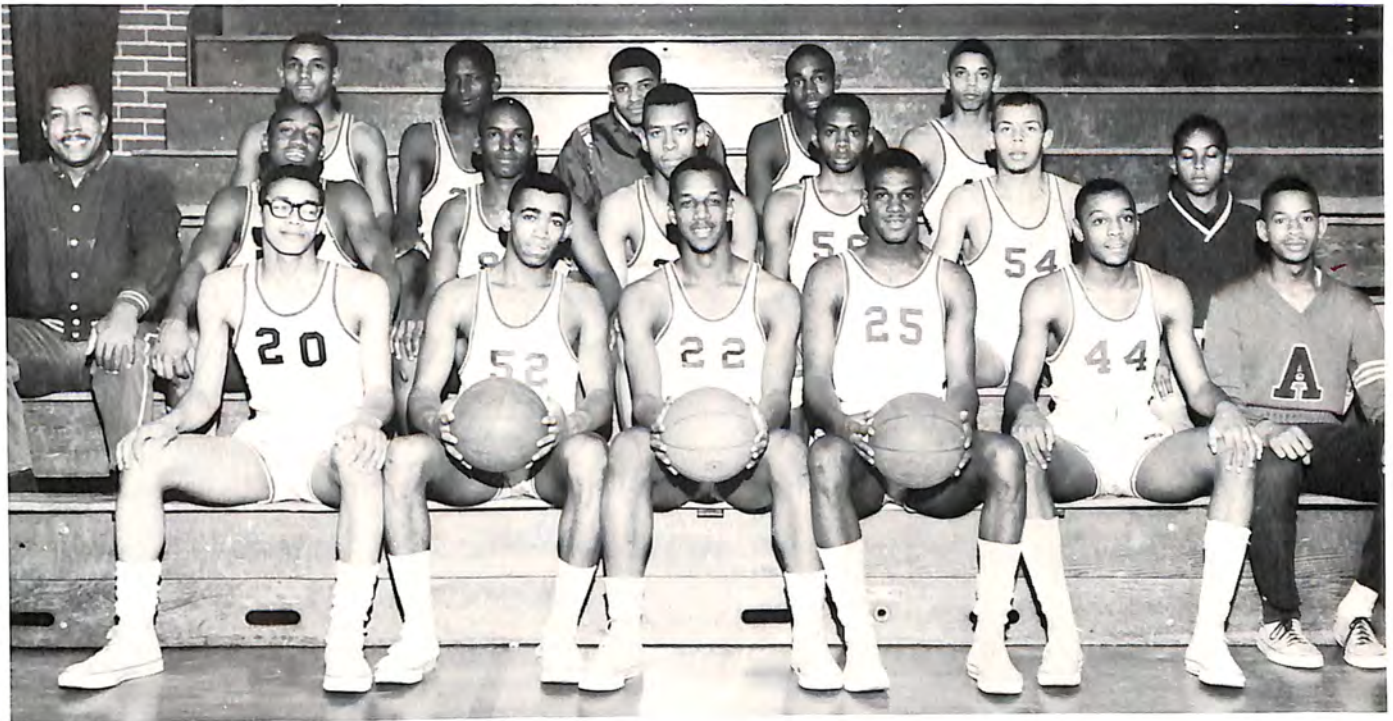
