The Trans - Atlantic liners were rarely chartered for special groups, but because of the prestige of Bob Hunt and Ralph Dangerfield, co - owners of the Eastern Airlines, a precedent was booked. The 30-years antique had been purchased from Mrs. Cutshall together with ownership of the Viaud School. Estelle and Louise completed the party and the "Good-ship Viaud" again started her engines. Then the class of 1949 sailed high in the

sky for a successful and happy reunion.




