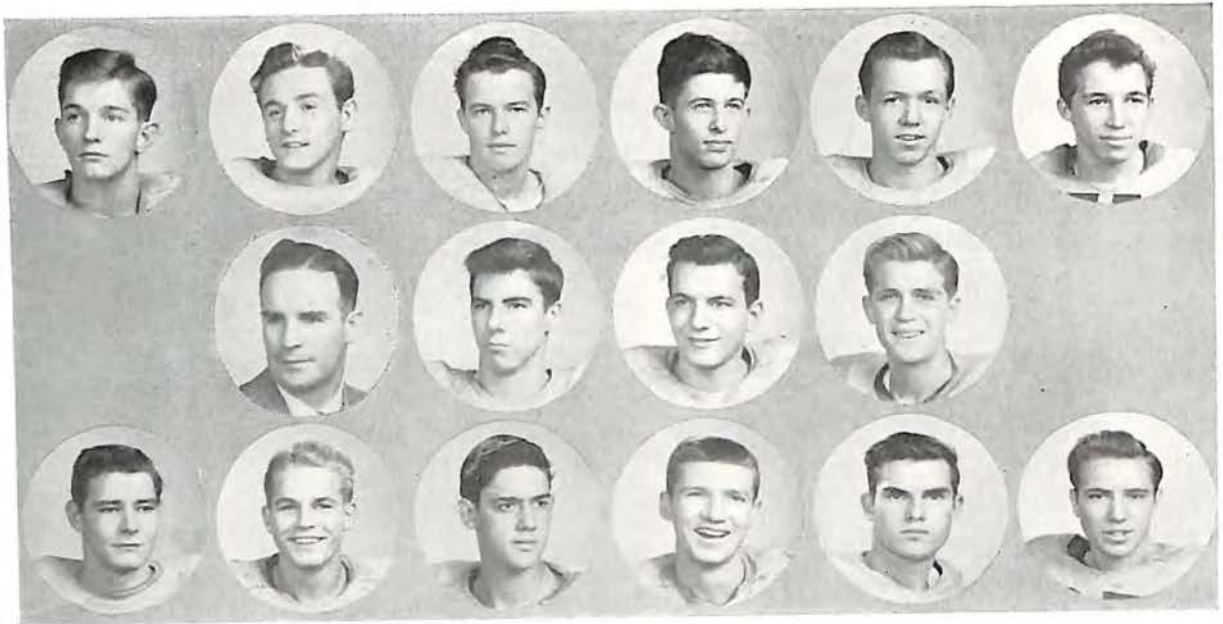
The band organized this year under a new director, Mr. Whitman.

The staff, in order to cooperate with the S. C. A., sponsored a Teen-Canteen on April 19th and had a wonderful time doing it.

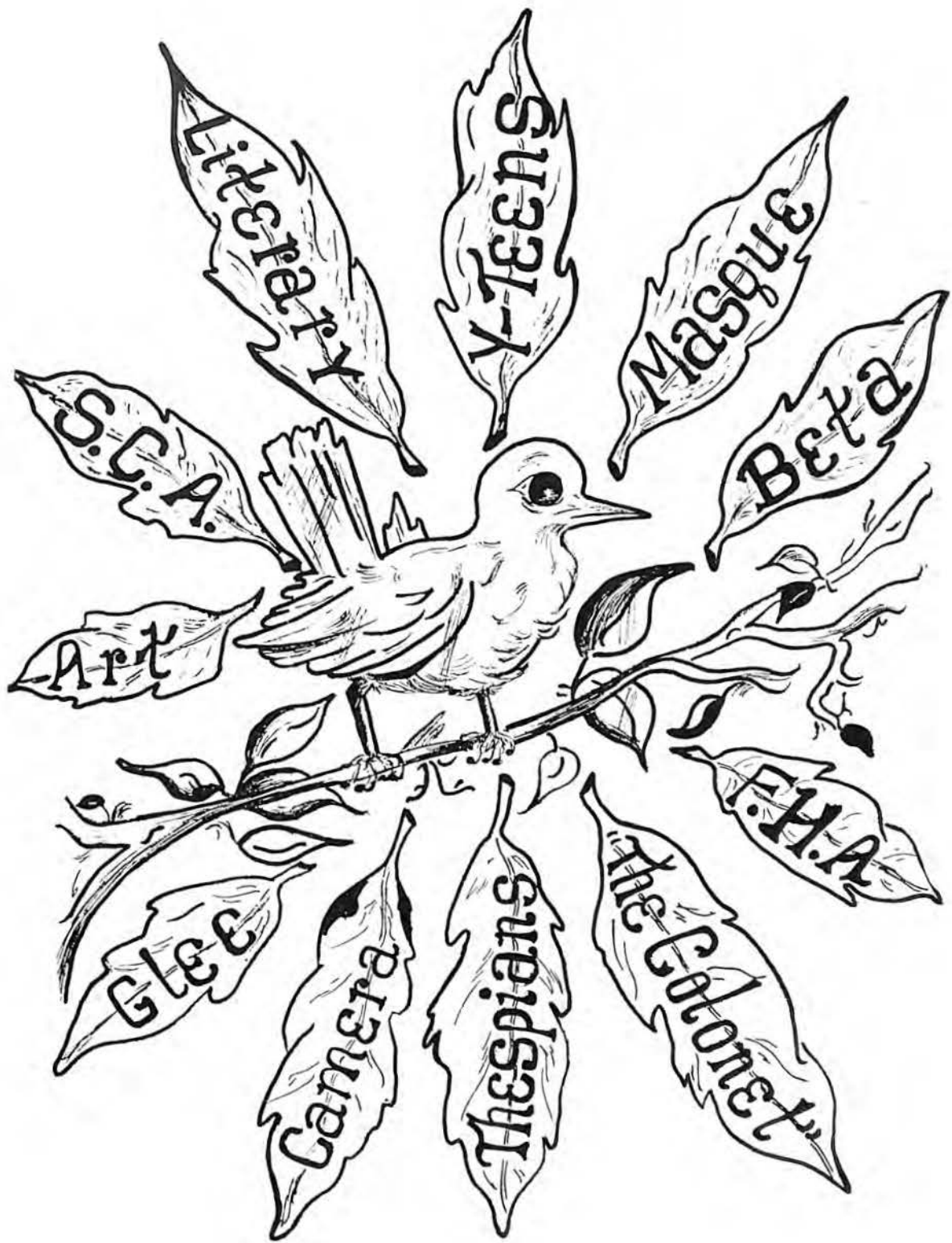
Then, also for the staff's enjoyment, a party was given in honor of both girls' and boy's basketball teams, and the cheerleaders soon after basketball season closed.
