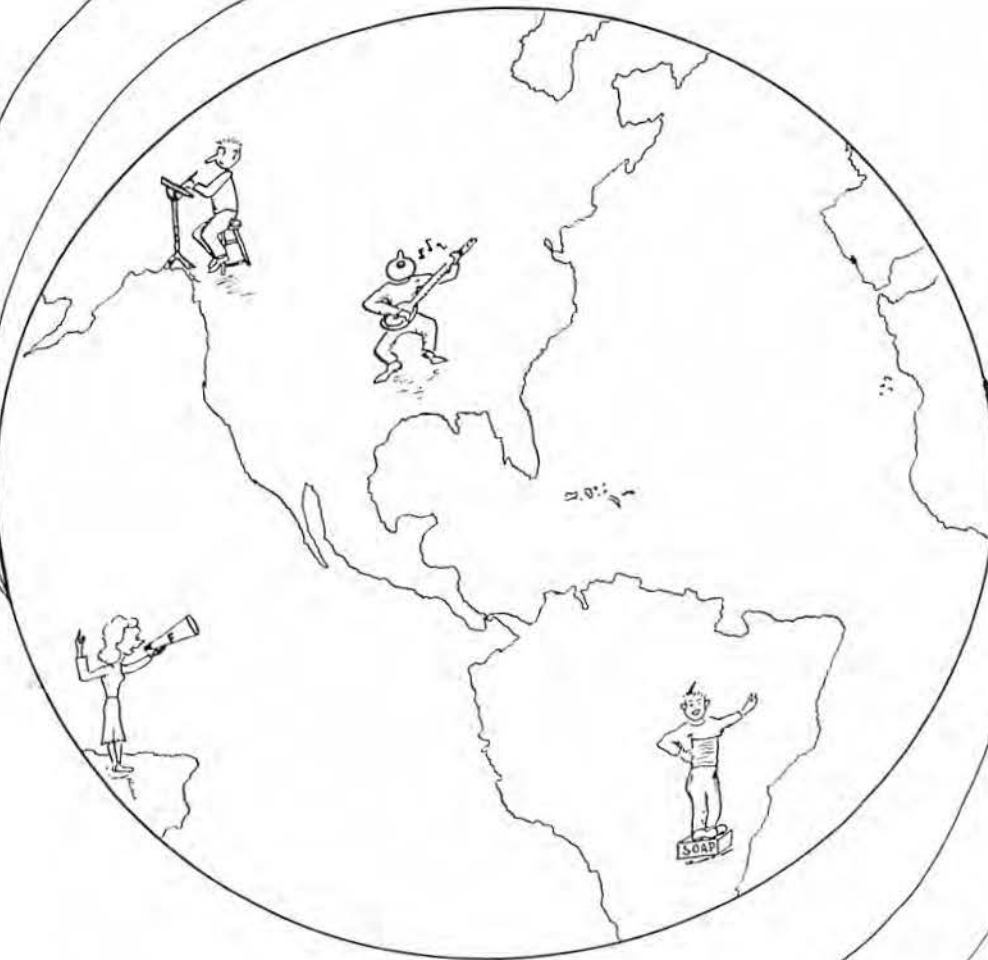

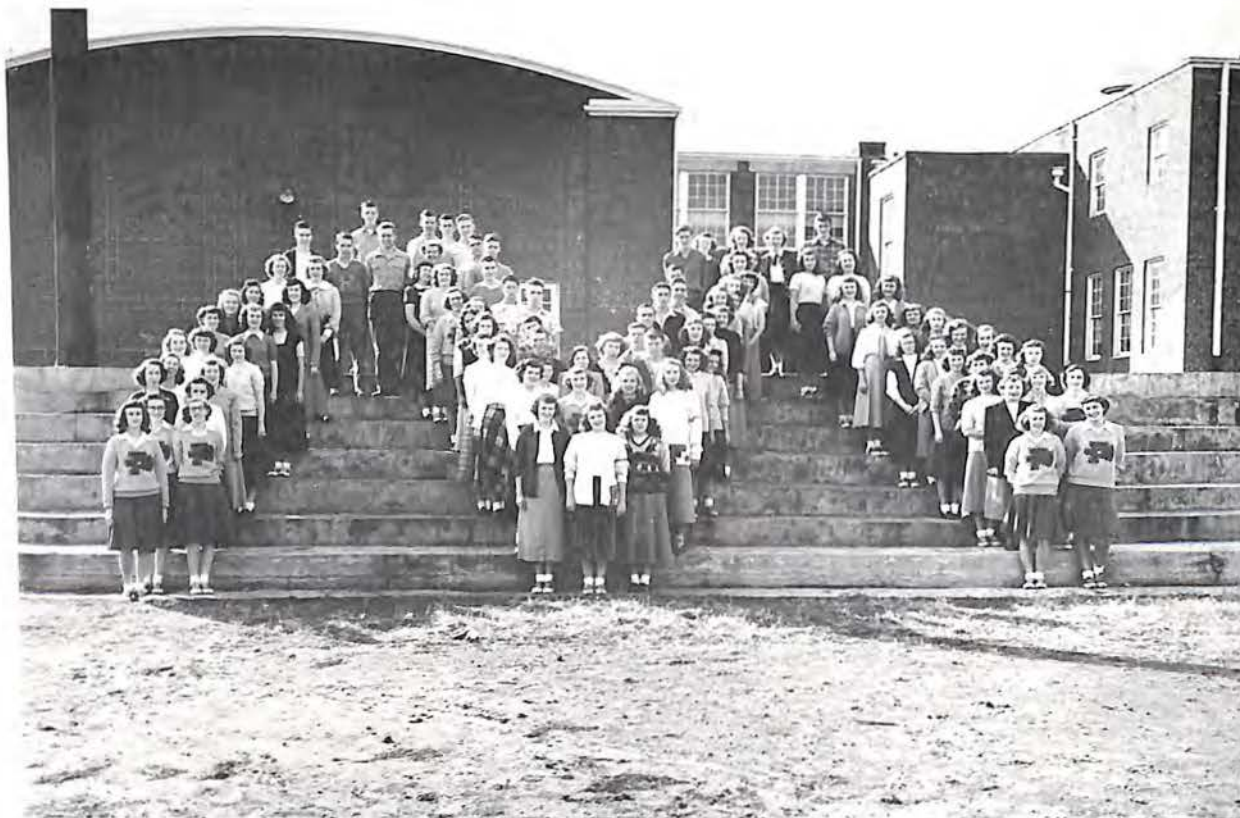

We conducted a separate interview with each candidate who was interested in joining our club. Our induction service was held on January ninth, and at that time, we took in forty-three new members.

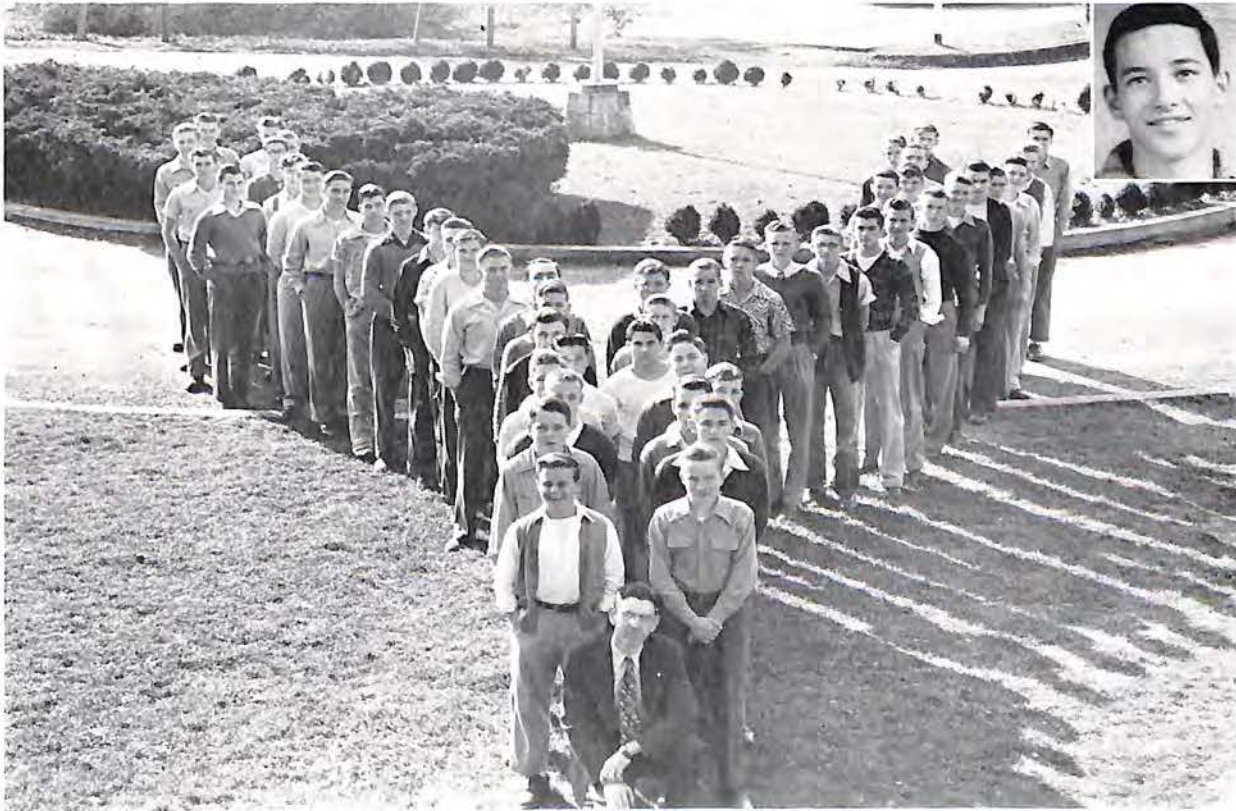
