# The Star-Spangled Banner

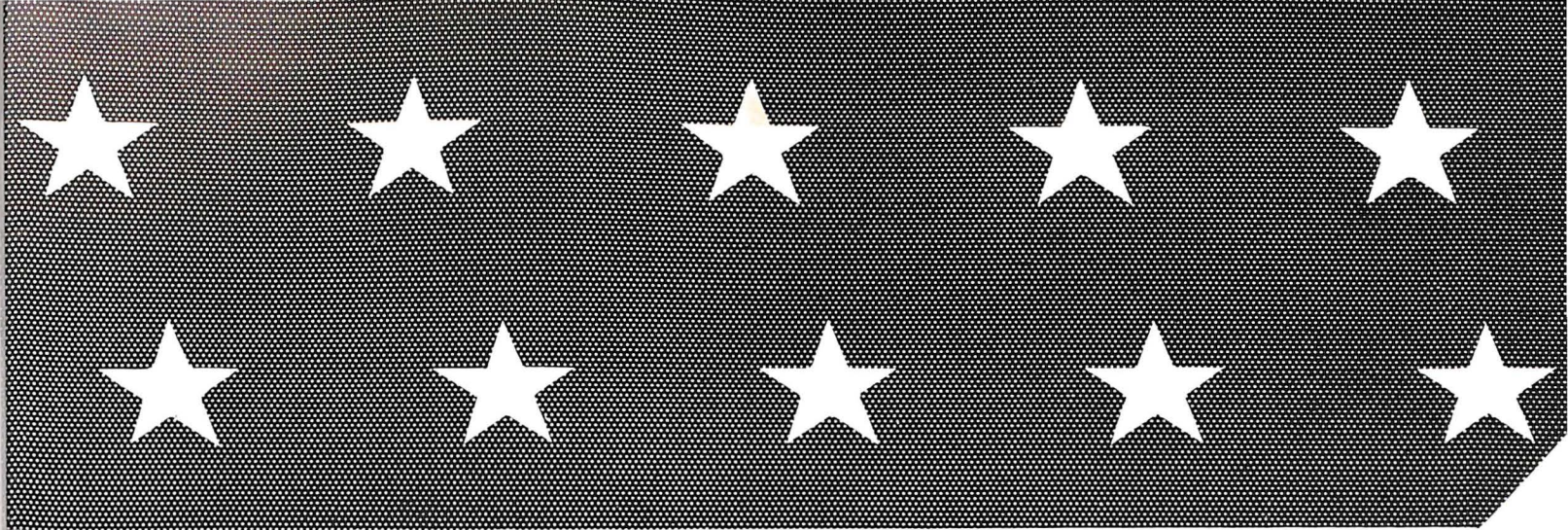
*Oh, say, can you see, by the dawn's early light,

O'er the land of the free, and the home of the brave.*

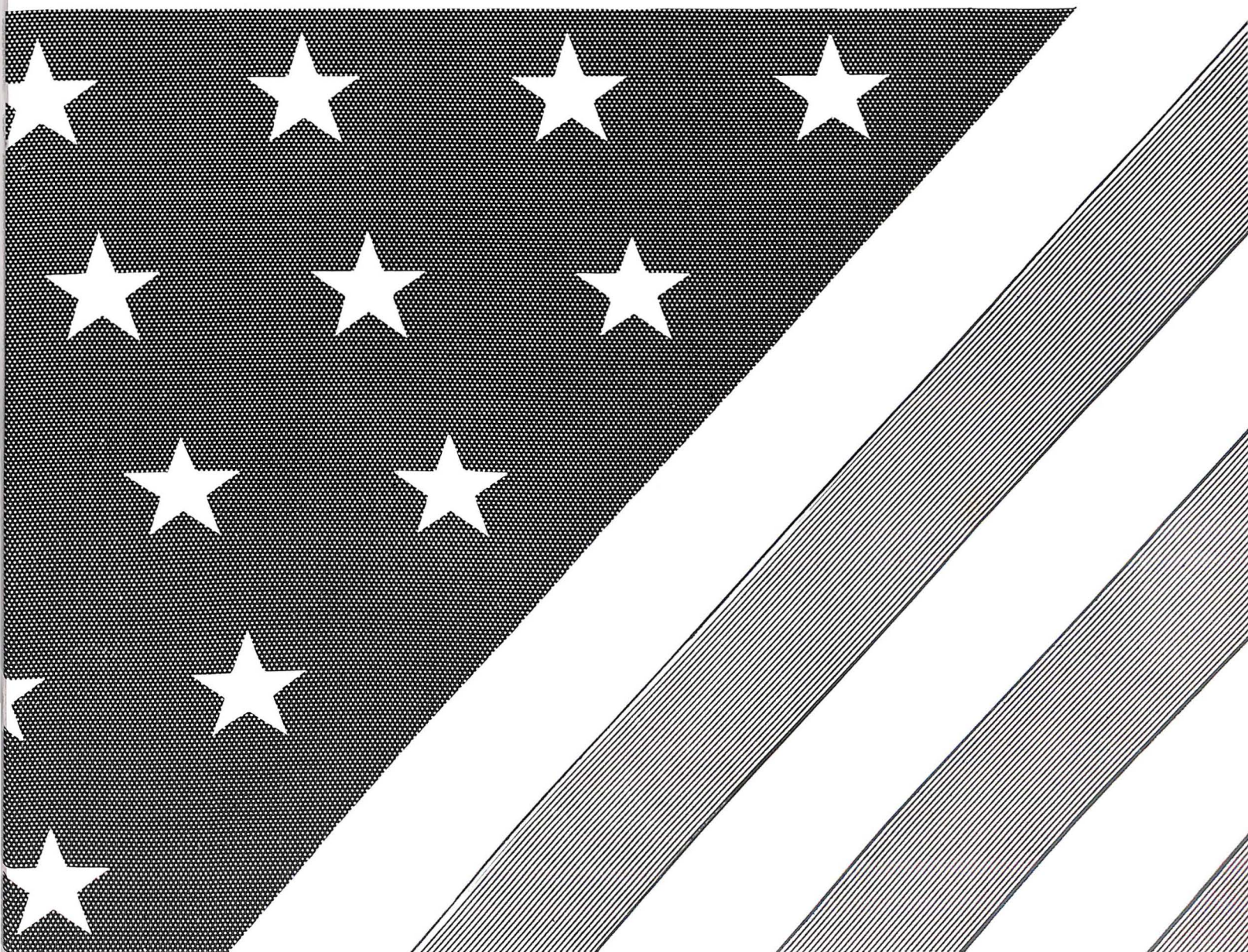
*Oh, thus, be it ever when freemen shall stand

O'er the land of the free, and the home of the brave.*







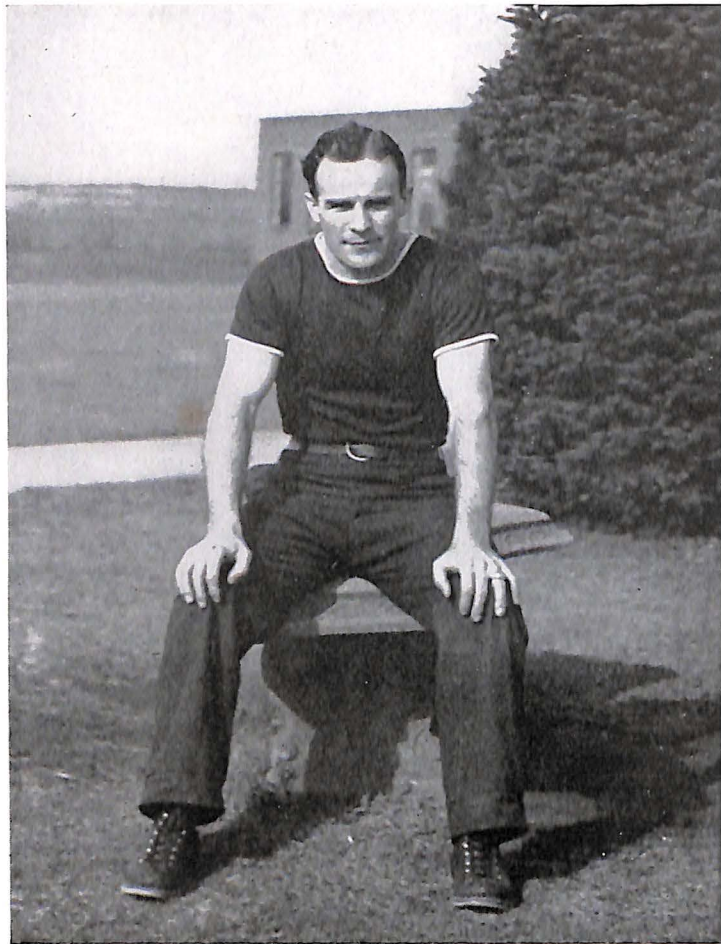

Throughout the entire season the girls have shown ability to cooperate and good sportsmanship. Both of these qualities are excellent training for life.

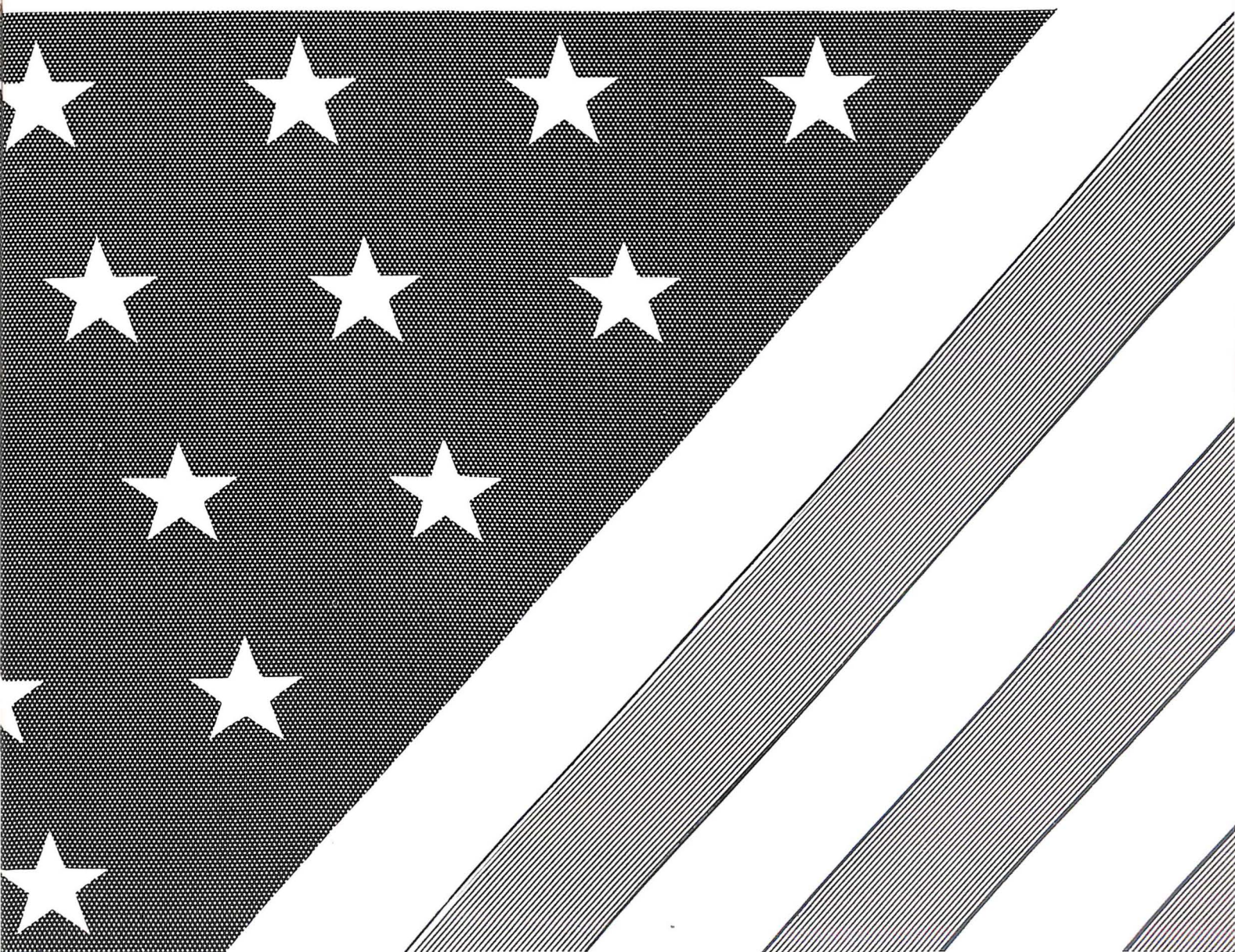
