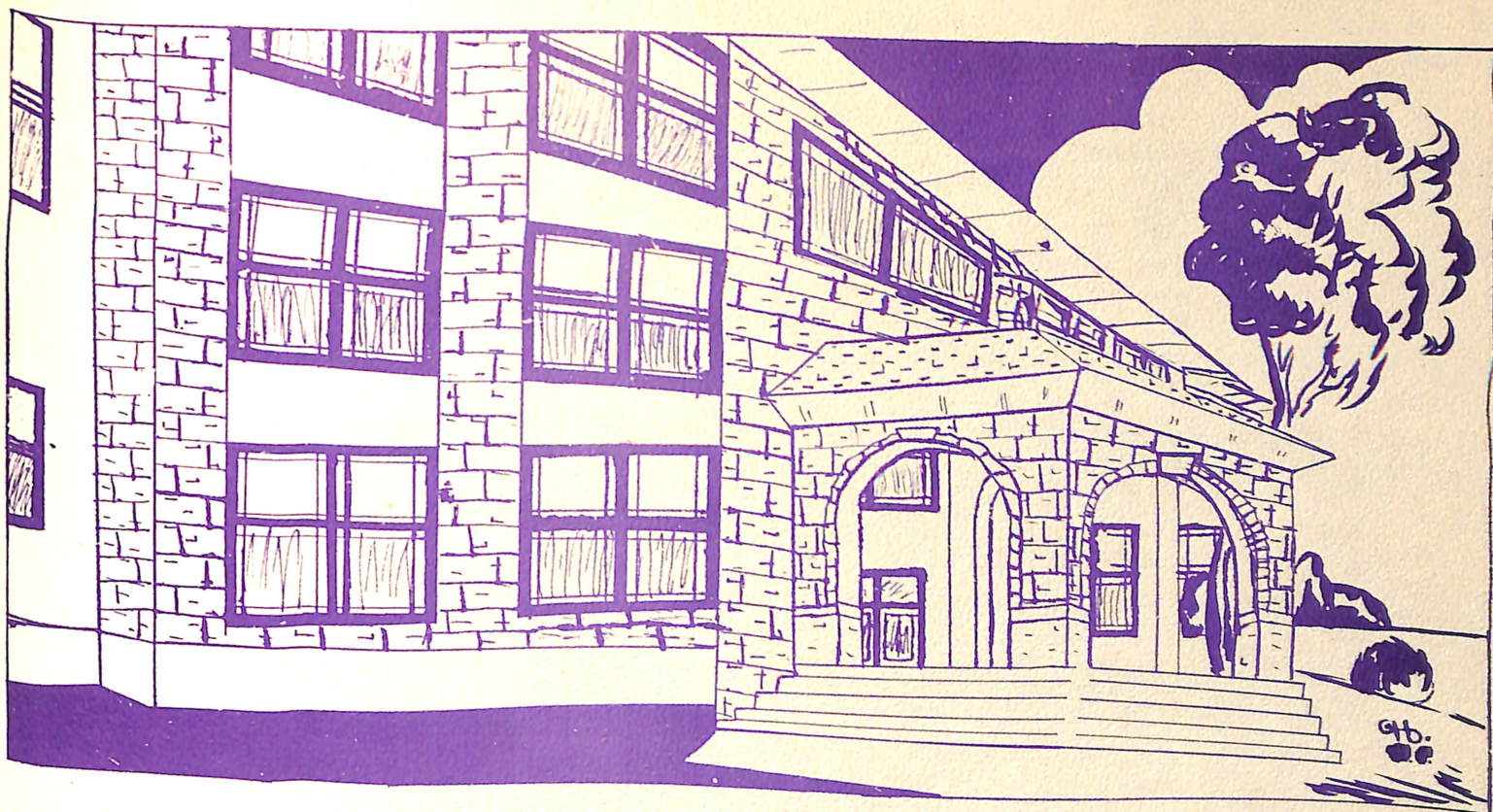
HONORS

- VII. In the District Music Festival at Martinsville the Lee Junior Choir received first rating, the Girls' Choir received first, and the boys second.

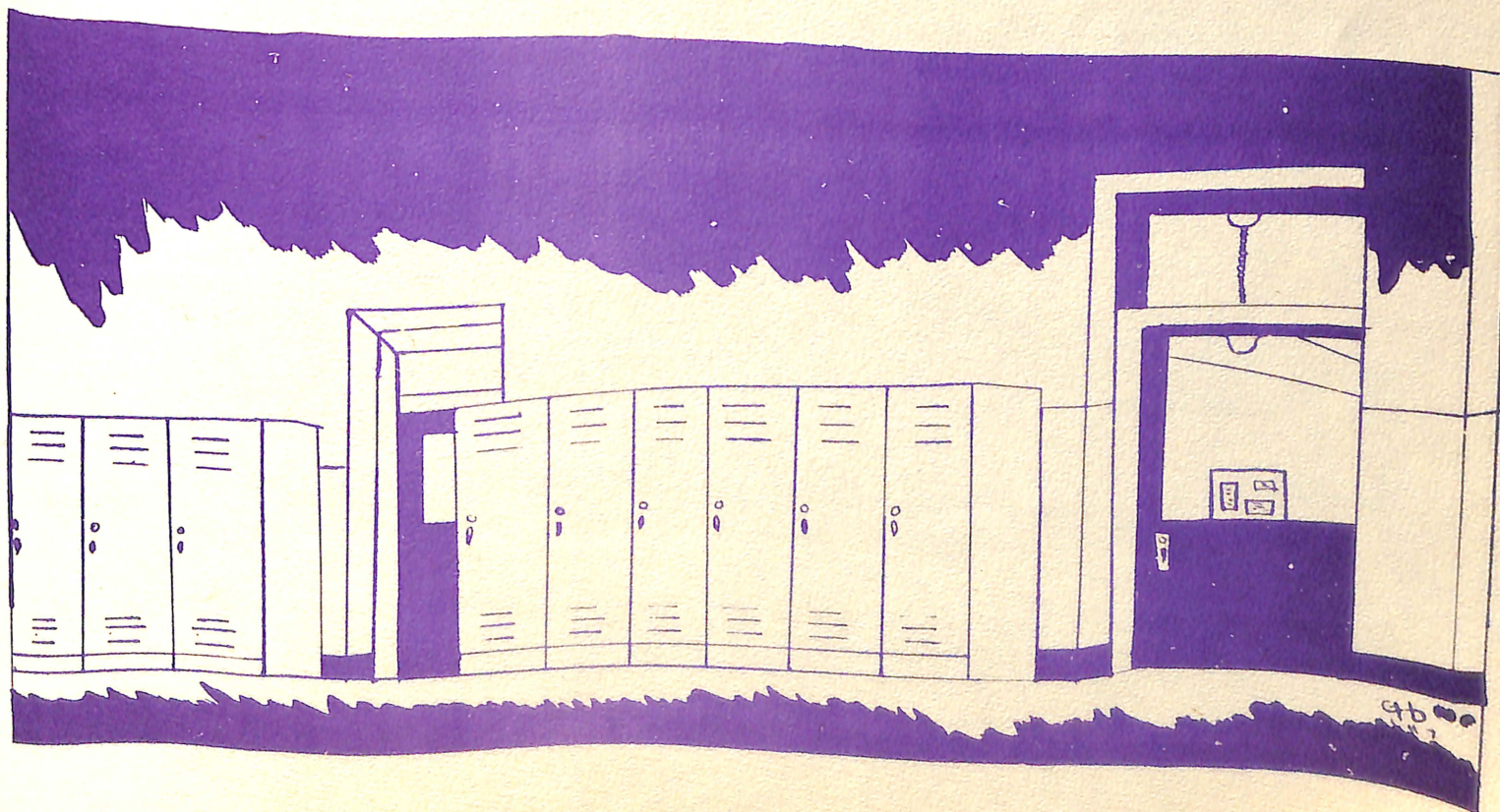
