## **Biographical Note:**

Moorman Pendleton Heller was born on 20 December 1898 in Pomeria, South Carolina to Evelena Garmany Heller and Ernest Heller. At a relatively young age he moved to Roanoke, Virginia and married Lucy Blanch Robinson on 28 August 1929 in Roanoke, Virginia. They produced one son, George Henry Robinson Heller, who was born on 8 October 1933. Moorman retired from the American Viscose Plant in Roanoke, Virginia. He was a member of First Baptist Church Gainsboro and was active in many organizations including the Hunton Branch YMCA, the Boy Scouts, and served as devotional leader for the Fellowship Breakfast Project. Moorman died on 8 October 1977.

Lucy Blanch Robinson Heller was born 21 March 1902 in Roanoke, Virginia to Ophelia S. Leftwich Robinson and George H. Robinson. She graduated from Hartshorn Memorial College in Richmond, Virginia in 1922 and then attended Virginia State College in Petersburg, Virginia. After completing her education, Lucy taught at schools in Maryland and North Carolina returning to Virginia to teach music at Susie G. Gibson High School in Bedford, Virginia and later at Gainsboro School in Roanoke. She was the founder and director of Heller Kindergarten, which is considered to be the first kindergarten in Roanoke for African Americans. Lucy was also active in many organizations including the Order of the Eastern Star, Phyllis Wheatley YWCA, and the National Council of Negro Women. She was also a member of the Jesse Fauset Reading Club at the Gainsboro Library. Lucy died on 23 June 1989.

George Henry Robinson Heller graduated from Lucy Addison High School in 1951 and attended Virginia Union University, graduating in 1955 with a degree of Bachelors of Arts in History

Education. He began teaching in 1956 in the Public School System of Nelson County, Virginia. From 1959 to 1962 he worked for the Public Schools of Shenandoah County, Virginia. He then taught at St. Emma's Military Academy in Powhatan, Virginia until 1965 when he he began working for the Carver High School in Chesterfield, Virginia. George received his Masters Degree in History from Virginia State College in 1976. He married twice, first to Zeola C. Baldwin in 1962 and Emelda P. Johnson in 1976. After retiring from education, George moved back to Roanoke, Virginia where he became active in historical preservation. He served as President for Gainsborough Southwest Community Organization, Inc. and the Project Area Committee during the 1980s. George died on 15 January 2017.

**Scope and Content:**

- The Heller Family Collection is comprised of one (1) record storage box.
- The collection is made up of one (1) photo album, that is approximately 8x6”, as well as loose photographs in both black and white and color; various ephemera, including a vinyl record, and social club programs; and various paper documents relating to the family and their careers.
- This collection dates from approximately the early 1910s until the 1980s.
- The collection primarily contains items related to the lives of Lucy Blanch Robinson Heller and George Henry Robinson Heller.
