## Historical Note:

The Ladies United Aid Society was founded in 1893 as a benevolent organization when hospital care was not available to Roanoke's African American community. The organization's primary mission was to assist each of its members during times of sickness, misfortune and death. The Society was chartered in 1899, with the charter being signed by Judge John W. Woods and the Society's founding members. Founding members were Rachel Harth, Mary Evans, Jennie Thomas, Susie Oliver and Mary L. Brooks. The Ladies United Aid Society is still active today and includes many legacy members.

## Scope and Content:

- The Ladies United Aid Society Collection is comprised of one (1) oversized record storage box.
- The majority of the collection consists of a scrapbook which was assembled by the Ladies United Aid Society in 1991. The scrapbook consists of photographs, news clippings, funeral programs, correspondences, programs, a City of Roanoke Proclamation and other documents relating to the members of the Society. The wooden cover of the scrapbook was handcrafted by Curtis C. Reeves, husband of Society member Virginia M. Reeves. Also included in the collection are document and news clippings relating to the Society's 125th

anniversary as well as a brief history of the Ladies United Aid Society compiled by members.

- This collection dates from the early 1900s to 2024.
