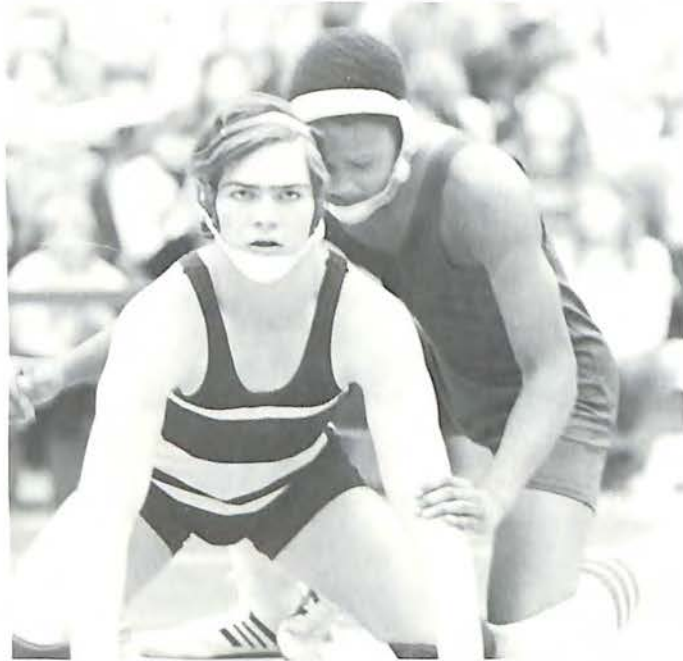
Sara Beamer is the new proprietor of the State of California, says "I love the sunshine!" She is now negotiating with the Indian government to buy the Taj Mahal.
