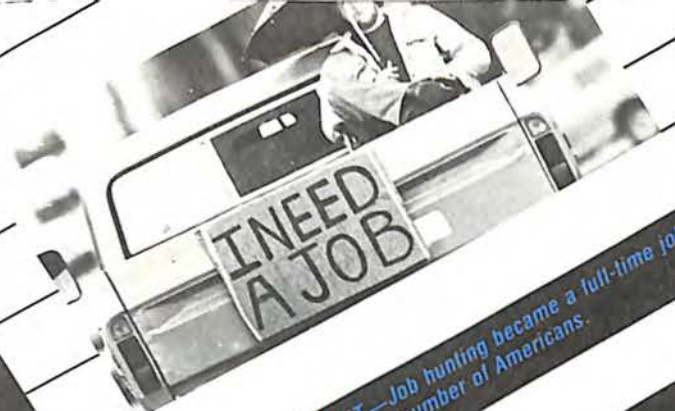

EXTRA TERRESTRIAL—E.T. stole the hearts of millions and became a household word after Steven Spielberg's hit movie.



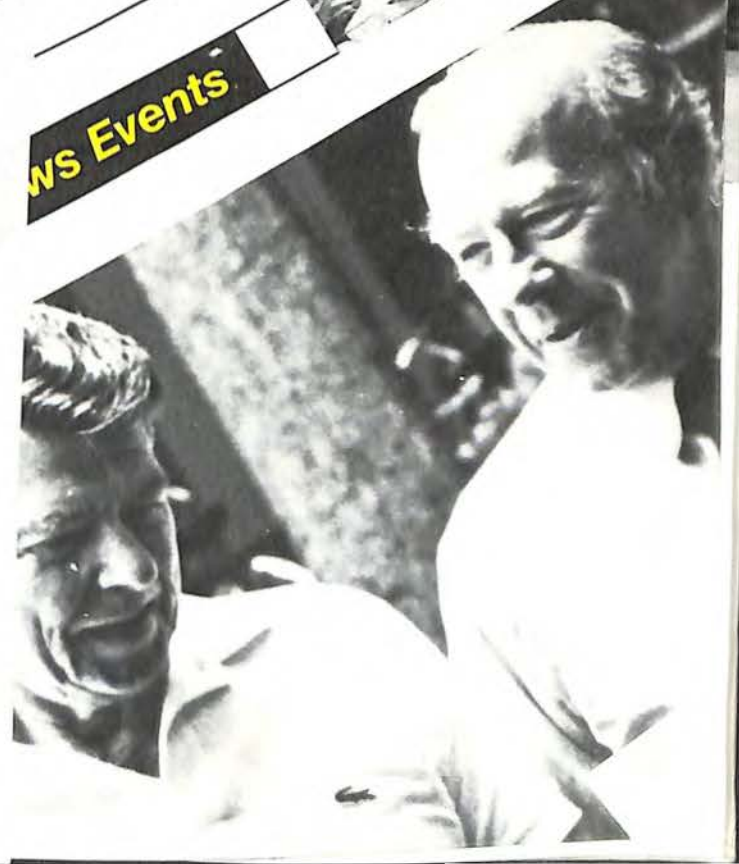

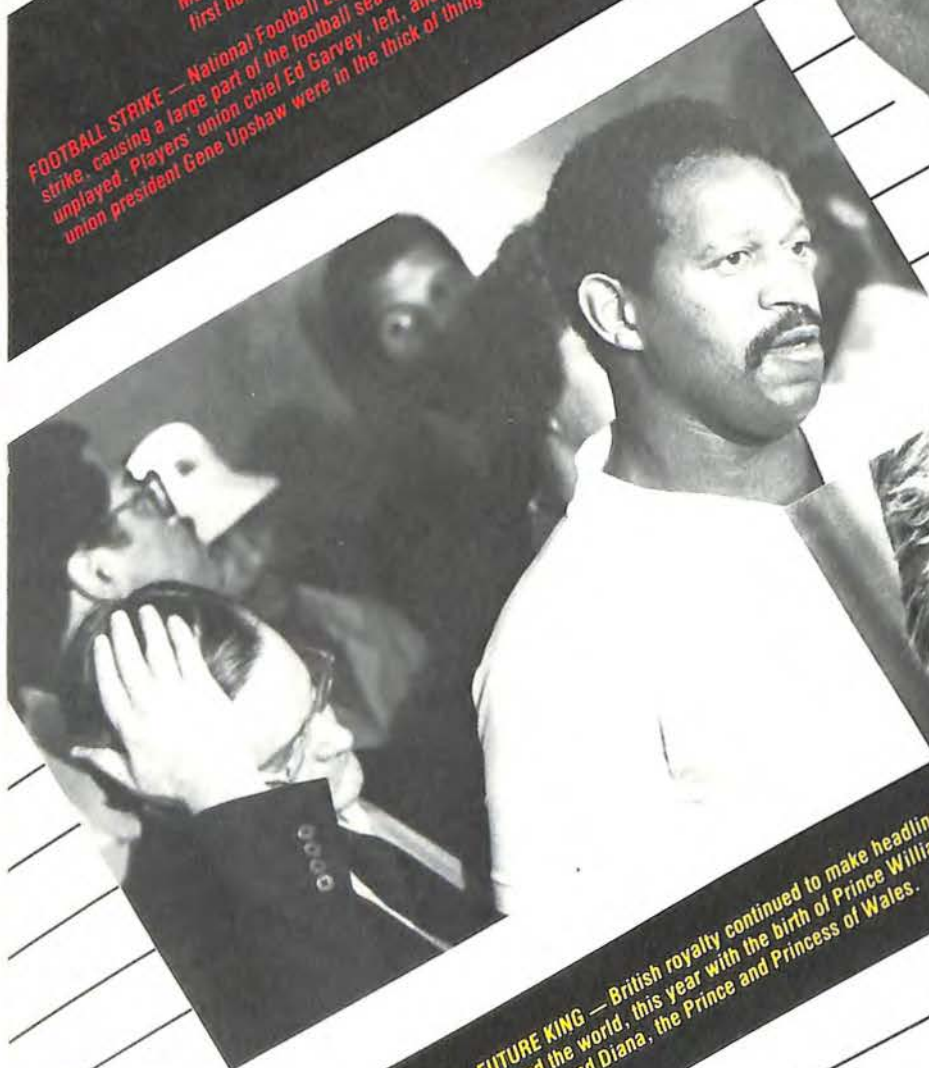
