THE STARVING TIME

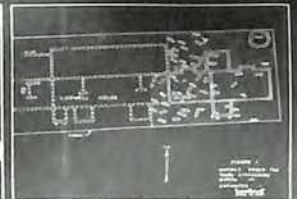
When John Smith sailed for England in October, 1609, about 480 settlers remained in Virginia. Forty of them settled at Point Comfort under Governor George Percy where they survived the winter without incident. Thirty more stole a boat, the *Swallow*, and sailed for England. Another 30 under Captain John Ratcliffe unwisely accepted Powhatan's offer to trade for corn and were killed. Of the remaining 390 settlers, only 60 survived until the following May.

During the winter the Indians killed most of the settlers' 600 hogs, drove the deer away, refused to trade for corn and slew any settlers who strayed too far from the fort. Most of the settlers grew weaker from drinking the brackish water from the shallow wells in the fort. Many died of dysentery and typhoid fever. Some died from famine and starvation.

John Smith, eager to discredit his successors, named the period "the starving time." According to Smith, within six months of his departure only "60 men, women and children, most miserable and poor creatures... were preserved for the most part by roots, herbs, acorns, walnuts, berries and now and then a little fish. They that had a little starch in these extremities, made no small use of it, yea even the very skins of our horses." Smith reported, and Governor Thomas Gates confirmed, one incident where a man murdered his wife, cut her up, salted her down and ate her. He was caught and executed.

Many of those who died are probably buried along the ridge in front of you, to your left to the river and to your right to the Yearley House. Archaeological explorations in about 20 percent of this area confirmed 70 Christian burials. There may be as many as 300. How many were washed into the river before the seawall was erected in 1901 is unknown. Most of these burials were shroud burials where the body was placed in canvas or cloth and deposited in the grave without a coffin.

A few burials are directly underneath the statehouse foundations in front of you. Almost certainly the statehouse was built many years after the memory of the burial ground had dimmed, since the colonists of 1662 would not knowingly have built on top of an earlier graveyard.
