Pep Squad









Student Deputies





Bible Club




Study of the Bible is the main activity of the Bible Club. Students examine the moral and social implications of this historical document and apply them to their own lives.

Chess Club




Understanding and playing chess and checkers may help one improve his logical thinking. Members of the club derive enjoyment from competition.

Music Club




This activity strives to enrich the lives of students through musical experiences.


