William Ruffner Junior High School, constructed in 1970, was named after William Henry Ruffner (1824-1902). Ruffner served as a pastor, chaplain, and geologist. He then became the first superintendent of Virginia's public schools. The names "Saints" and "Ruffner Rock" derived from his last two vocations.

Our school emblem is the fleur-de-lis. Our school colors, forest green and gold, were chosen by Mr. Dennis Cummings before Ruffner opened.
