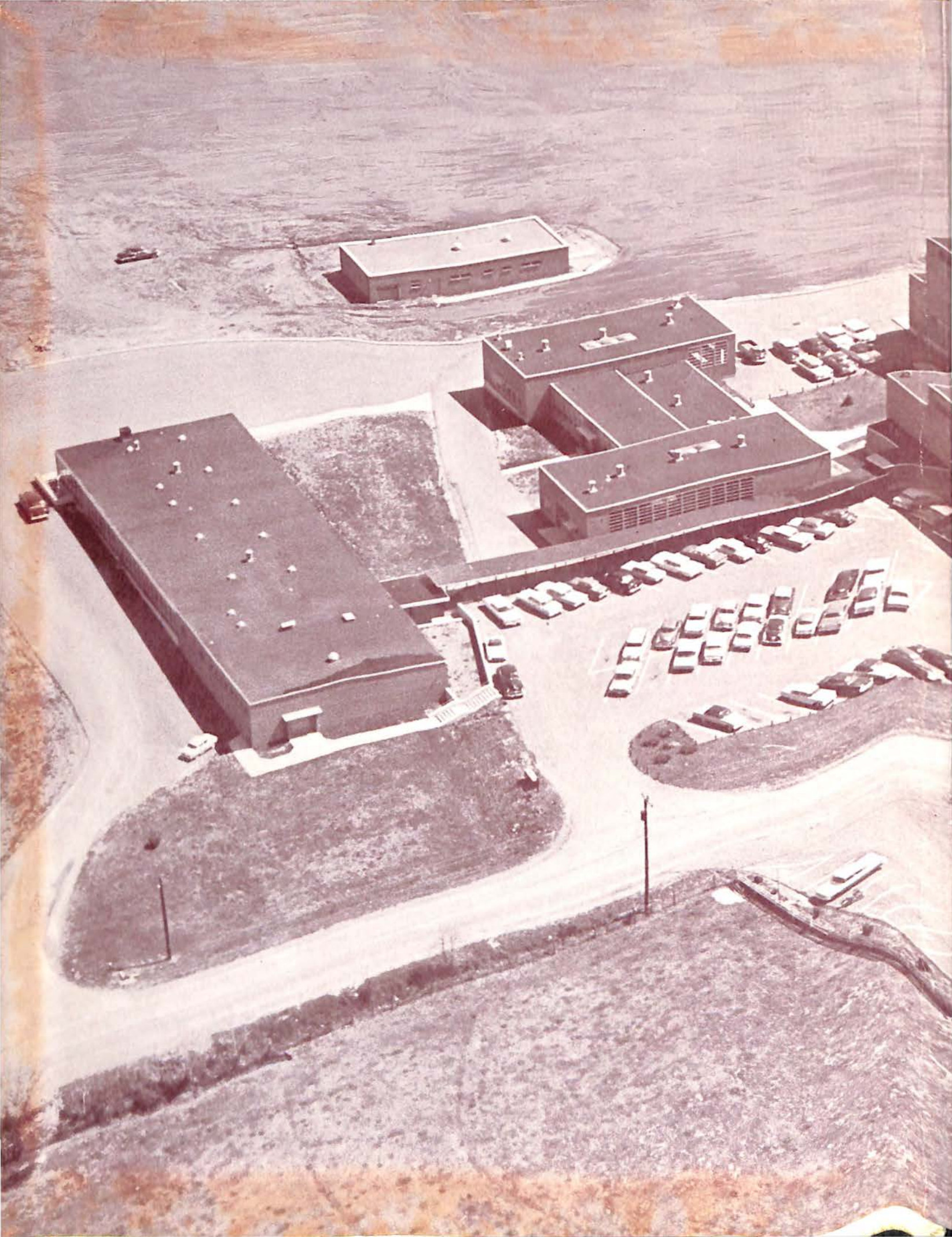

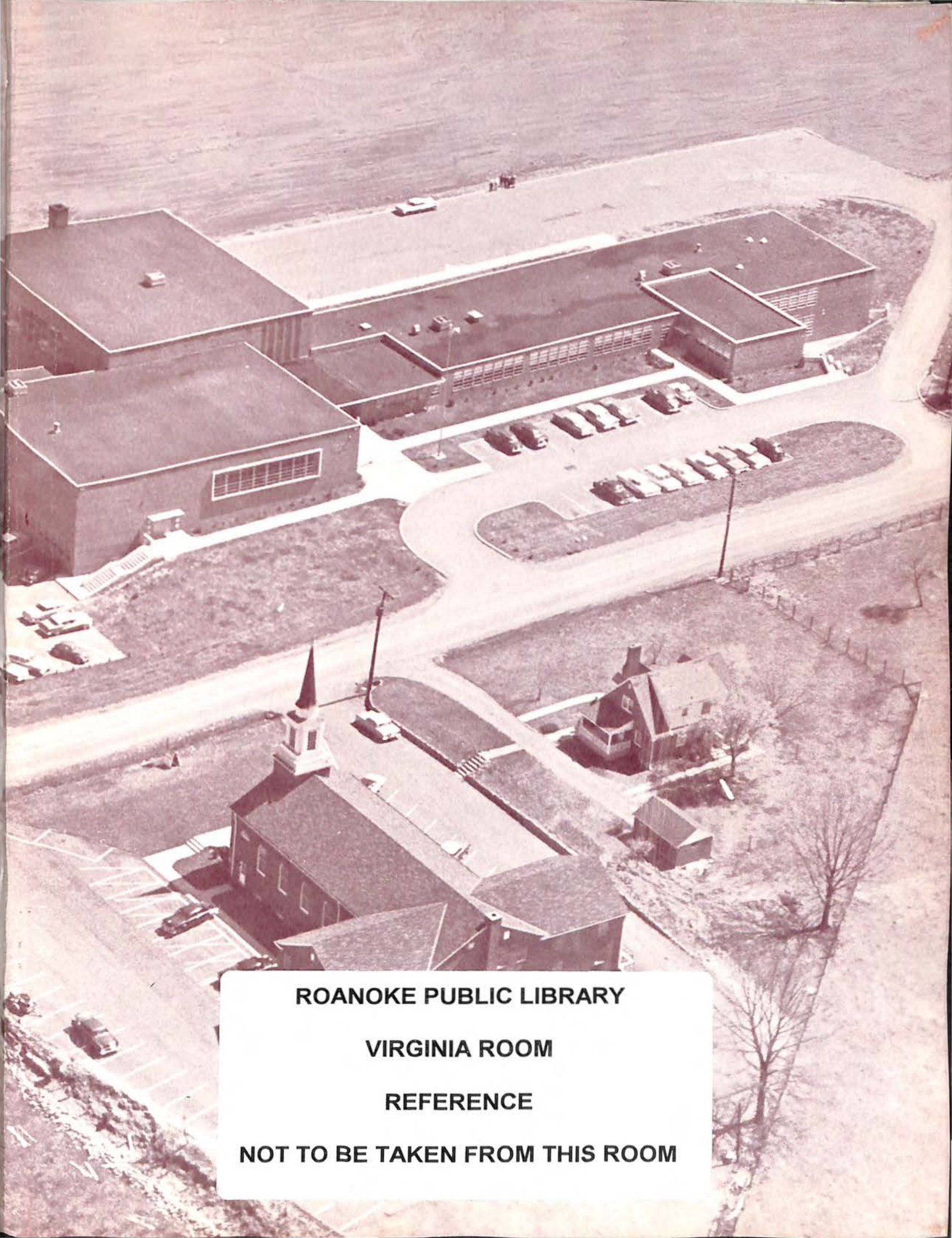

Coming to CSHS as vice principal in 1959, Mr. Crush has done much for our school and its students. Before his appointment at Cave Spring, he served as a teacher and coach in Montgomery County for five years. He also was head basketball and baseball coach at Andrew Lewis High School in Salem, Virginia and held the job of principal at Mount Vernon Elementary School in Roanoke, Virginia. After World War II, Mr. Crush received his B.S. Degree with a major in history and a minor in government.

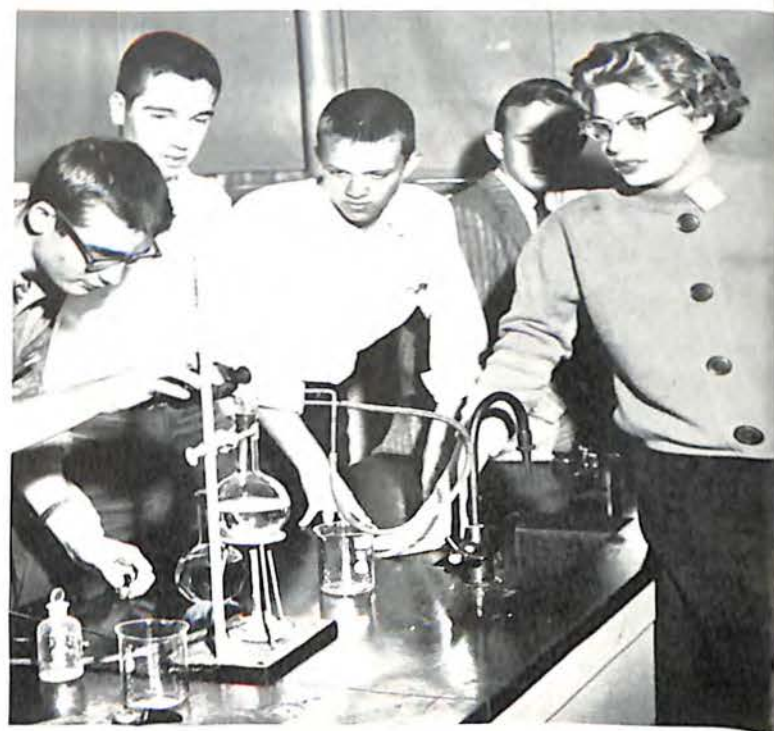

For Commercial students the Math Department stressed problems which would be encountered in the business world. For vocational students, formulas, measurements, and vocational finances were offered. College-bound students were prepared by receiving as much technical knowledge as possible, and for students not going on to higher math, general math knowledge was presented.

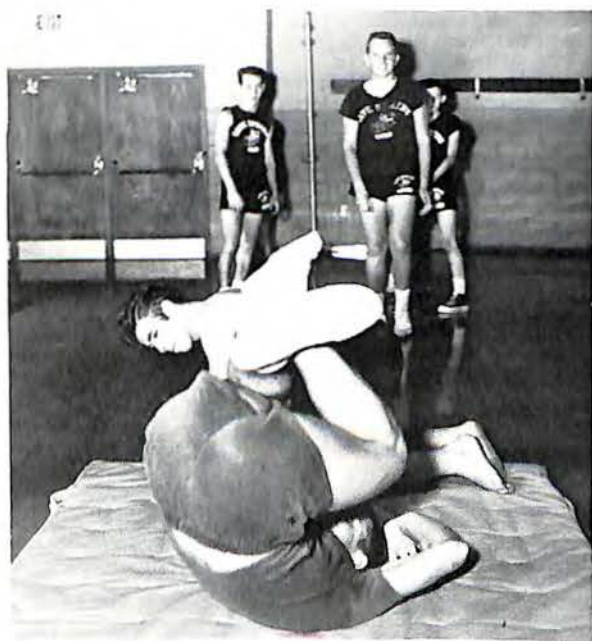
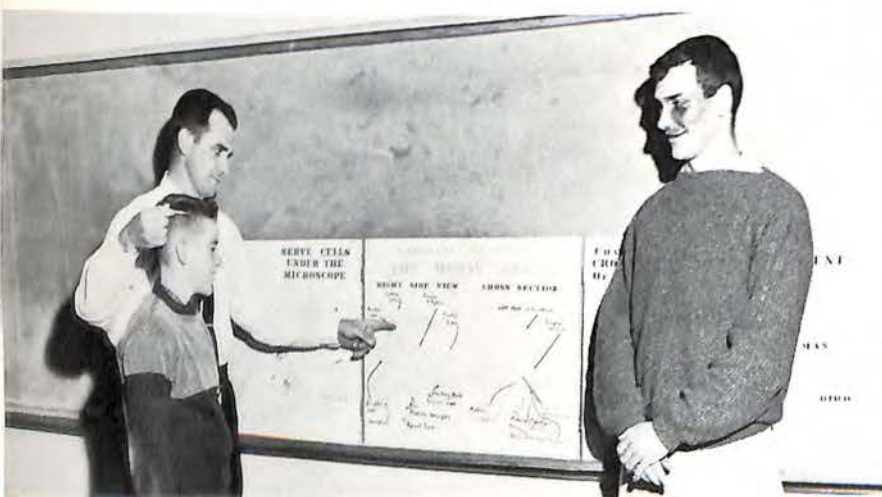
