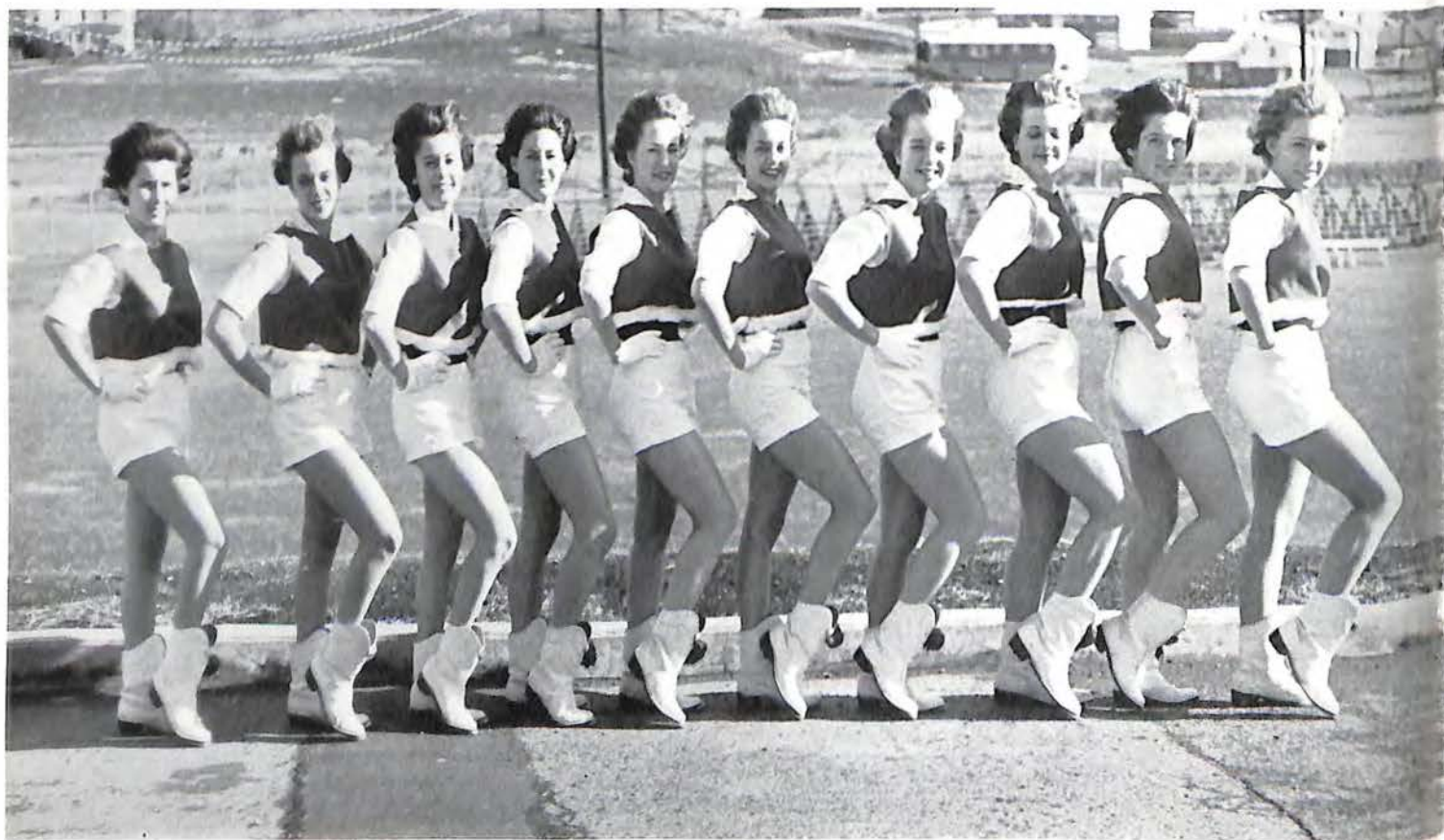

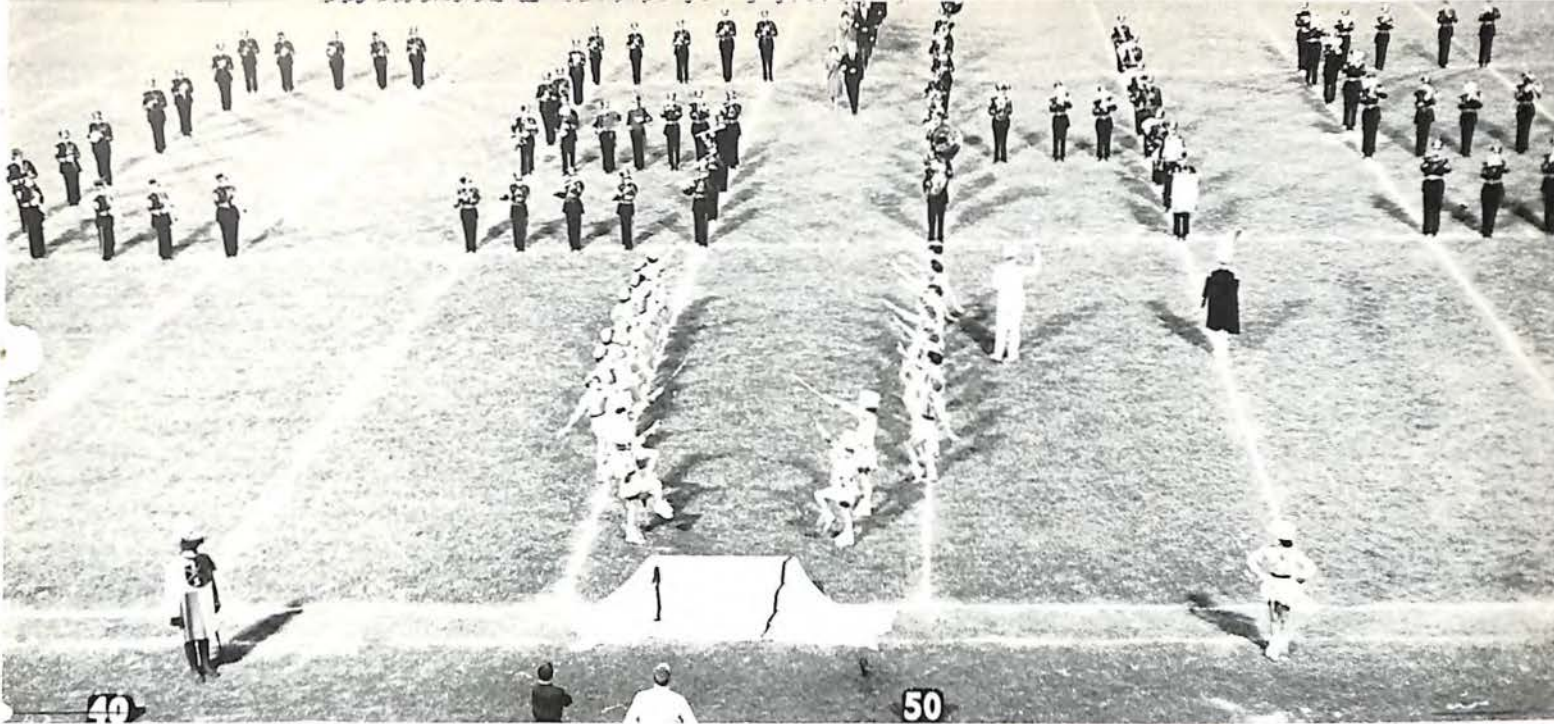

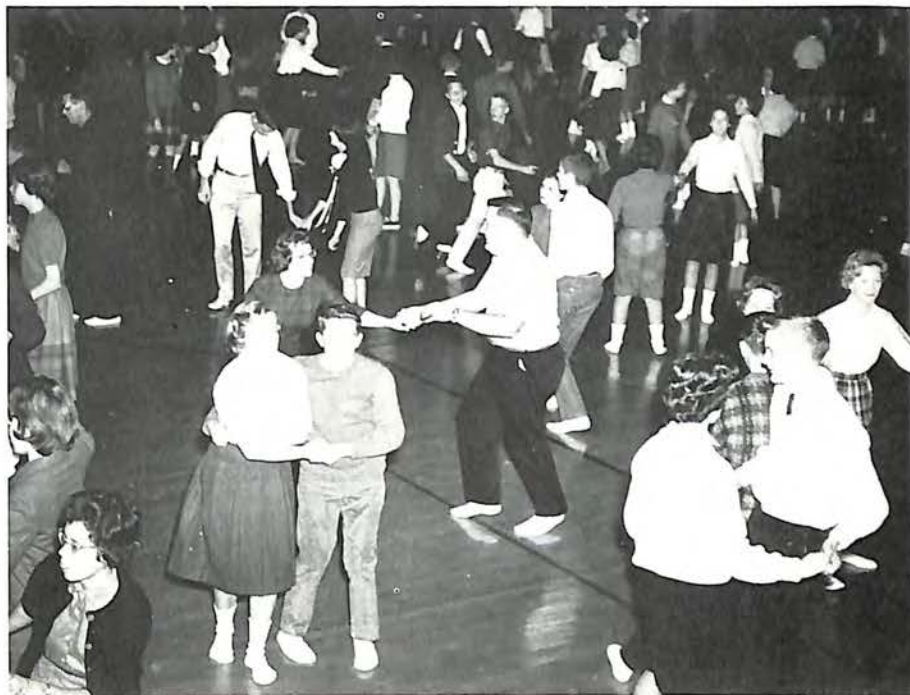

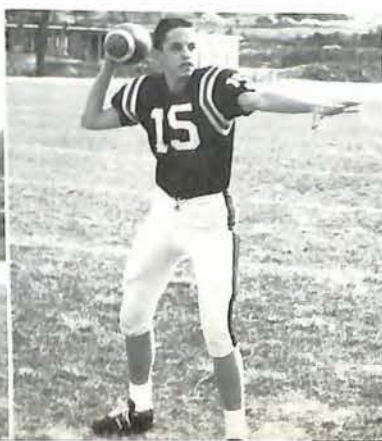
CAVE SPRING 27 — BEDFORD 13

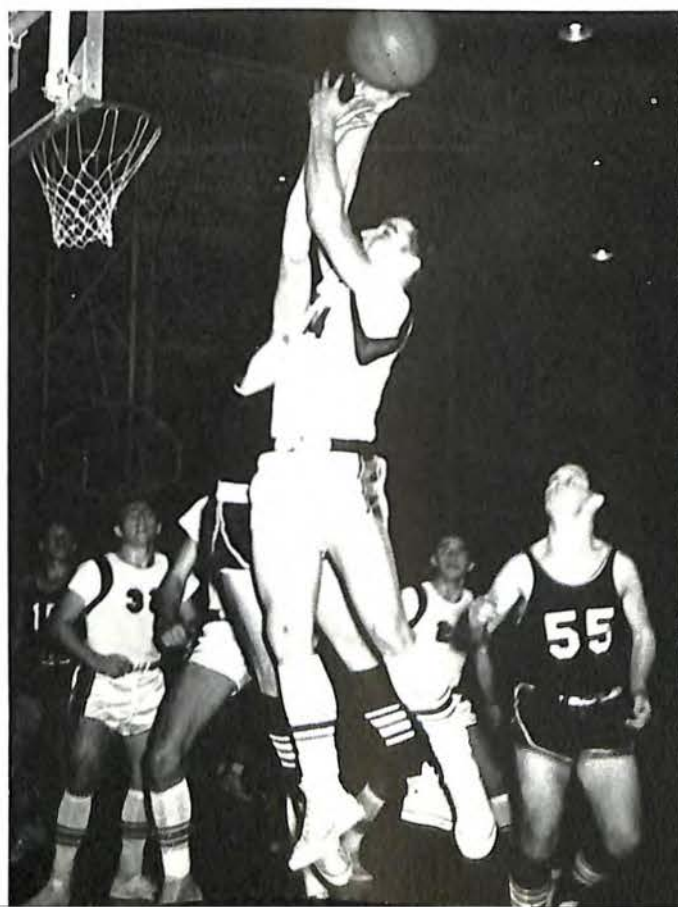
