The whole time thought I was bettering myself and my image, but in reality I was slowly killing myself. Some days I would just eat tuna fish and dink water out of an empty apple juice container. I gained over 20 pounds of muscle in the span of 3 months and I lost over 40 pounds during my irrational weight lost journey. I remember in the summer that year l'd wake up every day at 7:30 and make myself a protein shake and eat a banana. When I did get to the gym, I followed a program that my close friend Deonte Childress taught me. I owe a lot to him because he is the one, in the beginning, who showed me my true potential. I thied to work out at least 4 times to 5 times a week. During those gym sessions, I'd either do day of upper body, lower body, or core. The worstpart about the workout was doing the cardio. No one likes cardio, but it needed to done. I didn't see results until maybe the 2nd week. I was growing out of my shirts and pants. My shoulders were starting to look so broad that it was getting to the point where I would walk around places and notice people looking at my physique. I'd never experienced that before so it all got to my head. I remember one day I was at the gym and this girl was watching me work out, so of course I tried to impress her. I put too much weight on the bench and I got stuck on the 3rd rep. She had to help me get it off of me. But in all seriousness, the exercise was the fun part. That's the part of this process where I can see the best of myself. The eating, on the other hand... that was the hard part.

When gaining all hat muscle mass, of course I couldn't rely on just lifting weights and expecting my results to be major. I literally ate anything and everything. I feel so bad for my family. I'd take everything from the fridge or the kitchen table without consideration. My momma had to make extra rice. I love rice, but the amount of rice I ate was way too much. I tried to drink a gallon and a half everyday of water, and tried to sneak in two to three protein shakes. I eliminated everything that was junk food or high in sodium. What I ate most of the time was tuna, some rice, skinless chicken, and If I was lucky maybe some BBQ every now and then. Though I could see the amount of progress I had made, I didn't realize how much happier and healthier I felt until the true transformation pictures were released online. The impact I had on people was tremendous. I helped showed people that anything was possible. I wanted everyone to know that I 145 polnds and after two years of starteg at dedication, I am happy and have finally tound self-respect 1 am now on track to lean out and I am-aiming to be 205 . I am currently gो 210 . After seeing the way I looked after changing dramalloally from a fat kid to a bo derlne anorexic $k$ io I knew if I had conitinued in at way I would have seriously endghgered my health. I still wanted to play sports and the way I looked before was not gohg to hold up in college athletics. I am now planning on being a college lacrosse player next year and could never be as happy as I am now. My confidence disappeared back in the day, now I am as confident as I ever been. I hope my story is a good one, and whatever battle you're dealing with at this moment, I want you to know that there are people around you that love you. ## BE THE Change


"This past summer, I went on a trip through Rustic Pathways to the Dominican Republic. On the trip, my group conducted 5 major beach clean ups. One of them we even got in the water and picked up trash in the bay. We also got to replant mangrove forests and create bases for coral gardens. The trip taught me a lot about how we have negatively impacted our oceans. The chemicals we dump in the ocean as waste and our CO2 emissions have caused the corals to begin bleaching. The corals reefs are the main ecosystem in the ocean and acts as the ocean's primary oxygen source. They also act as protected barriers against our shores. They break up currents and slow weather patterns that come to shore. Because of the climate crisis, however, the corals are getting sick and bleaching themselves. Nearly $50 \%$ of our coral reefs have begun bleaching, and have died. This has affected me immensely and has encouraged me to get involved in the climate movement here in Roanoke. I started working with the Appalachian Youth Climate Coalition this fall. We have focused on building the youth climate movement in the Appalachia and plan to conduct multiple strikes throughout the year. The AYCC is also passionate about raising awareness of local problems. We have fought against Mountain Valley Pipeline and the mountain top removal methods for coal mining. Both of these issues have further endangered many local species in the Appalachia that are important to the ecosystem and are encouraging people to think about the environment the next time the vote because scientists feel that we are reaching the tipping point where these changes will be irreversible."

## FORGED In the Fire


"At an early age, my father introduced me to metalworking through the business he founded, and continues to run to this day, Iron Mountain Fabrication. Generally metalworking consists of lots of blueprint reading, and eventually putting tools to the metal that you're working on, laying out designs, cutting them with saws, or blowtorches, and fitting them together in patterns. Once fitted, you usually use a welding machine to hold all the pieces together, and give them the ability to handle a lot of stress, or weight, pressing on them. At Iron Mountain, we primarily work with steel, either mild, or stainless steel, although occasionally we work with specialty metals like aluminum, or bronze. One of my favorite things about learning how to be an ironworker is that over the years of practice, you eventually get much better at what you're doing, and you get to spend a lot of time around some very intelligent people. Sometimes the quietest, most collected people in the room are the wisest, and in my experience. sometimes they're the ones that are capable of building the building you're in."
