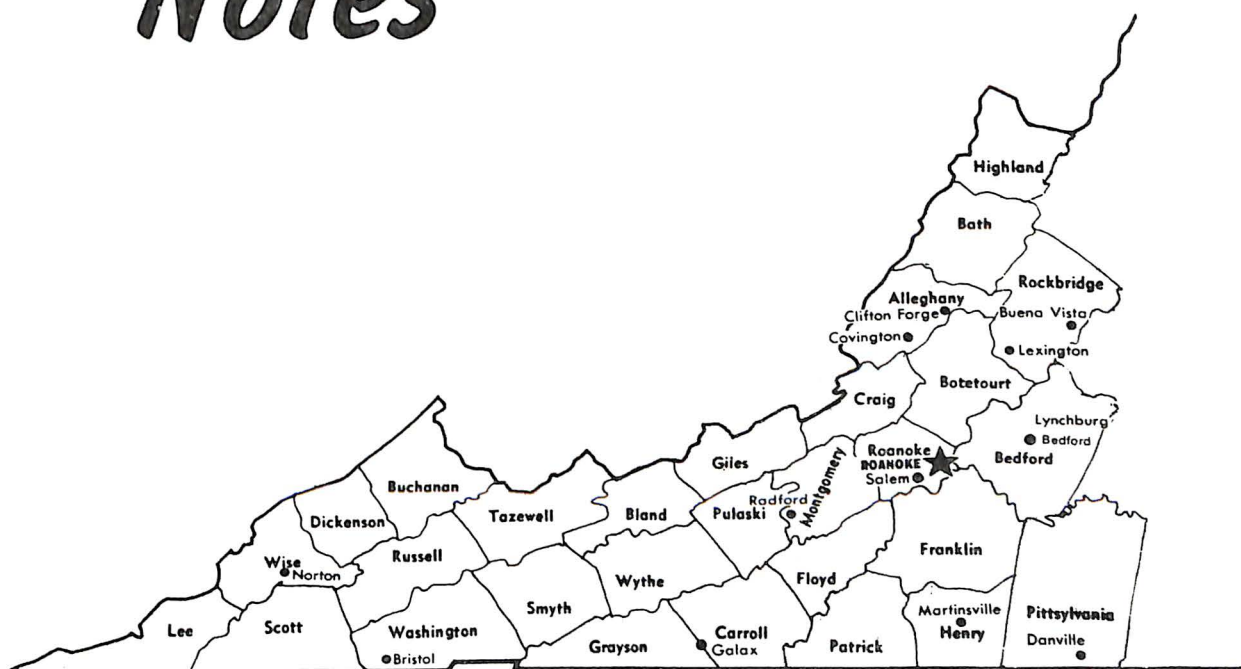

Pine Creek Church Cemetery Survey by Freda Miller

This Primitive Baptist Church, now closed, is near Floyd, Va. on 682 about  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile off 221. According to Semple's History of the Baptists in Virginia and Hassell's History of the Primitive Baptists, the Pine Creek Church was constituted in 1803. However, in the Pigg River Church, Franklin county records, there is a reference to a meeting at Pine Creek Church in March 1799. The early records of Pine Creek were lost but about 1825, an attempt was made to list a few first members.

The following is exactly as copied from the Pine Creek records:

- (B) John Fuller Redenhall Parish, Norfolk, England d. 158/9  
 (A) Robert Fuller Redenhall Parish, Norfolk, England d. 1614

Robert's sons, Edward and Samuel, were passengers on the Mayflower and signed the Compact.

- (1) Edward Fuller -- Baptised September 4, 1575, Redenhall, Norfolk, England came on the Mayflower with wife Anna and son Samuel. Edward and wife died during the first winter. Son Samuel was brought up by his Uncle Dr. Samuel
- (2) Samuel Fuller -- Born England about 1612. Married Jane Lathrop on April 8, 1635. Ceremony performed by Captain Myles Standish Magistrate, in Scituate. Moved to Barnstable. Died Oct. or Nov. 9 Children.
- (3) John Fuller -- 8th child. Born Barnstable about 1656. Died at East Haddan, Conn. between Feb. and May, 1726. Married Mahitable Rowley in 1678. 12 Children. ( Apparently prosperous farmer.)
- (4) Samuel Fuller -- 2 nd child. Born Barnstable about 1682. Died Hartford Feb. 12, 1757. Married Naomi Rowley 1703-04. He settled in Colchester, Conn. ( Marlborough section) 10 children.
- (5) Aaron Fuller -- 4th child. Born Jan 3, 1711, Colchester, Conn. Married Ruth Sawyer June 10, 1734. 7 children born in Colchester. Moved to Cornwall about 1748. 5 children born in Cornwall. No record of his death which probably occurred about 1762.
- (6) Gershen Fuller -- 8th child -- born Jan. 20, 1749/50. Cornwall, Conn. Married Mary -----, Probably Whitehall, N. Y. 3 sons, Aaron, John and William daughter Sarah. Died New Scotland, New York, on June 20, 1837. Married second wife Jane Chereal about 1804. Had Revolutionary War Record.
- (7) Aaron Fuller -- Born June 10, 1773, Bethlehem, New York, Died Jan. 17, 1832. Married Margaret McMiller. 9 children.
- (8) Gershen Fuller -- 3rd child. Born March 21, 1796/7. New Scotland, N. Y. Died August 8, 1828. Married Elizabeth Pangborn, July 6, 1816. 6 children.
- (9) Anna Maria Fuller -- 4th child. Born Jan. 22, 1822. Married George John Reid, Dec. 7, 1839. Died April 13, 1904. 7 children.
- (10) John George Reid -- 1st child. Born Sept. 21, 1840. New Scotland, N. Y. Married Carrie E. Smith Jan. 8, 1866. 5 children- Charles, Herbert, Carolyn, Frances, Agnes Clive.
