BRICK UNION CEMETERY

Botetourt County, Virginia - near town of Troutville.

The first record of this cemetery was compiled in 1958 by Jacqueline H Rader. Additions and revisions to this record were made by some on Nov. 1, 1964, Mar. 20, 1966, and Mar. 22, 1966, after some work had been done there to clear away heavy undergrowth. Many graves are marked only with field stones and a few metal funeral home markers remain with legible or partly legible inscriptions. There were also a few graves marked with thick boards, rotting away, that may have had inscriptions on them many years ago. These boards were destroyed when the grounds were burned over in 1964.

Mr. Frank Brugh, who helped to dig graves there in his youth (the late 1890s and early 1900s), told the compiler of this record that the cemetery was even then so crowded that often the gravediggers would accidently strike the corner of another casket while preparing a new grave. Therefore, there must be well over 200 people buried there.

It is very likely that several members of the Housman family were buried in this cemetery, including Christian Housman and his wife, Eve. According to Botetourt Deed Book 42, page 615, they donated the property on which stood the old Brick Union Church. This was not adjacent to the cemetery, but was within sight of the Brick Union burial ground. No deed for the lands of the cemetery has been found.

The colored section of Brick Union Cemetery is inclosed in a secondary fence -later removed - in the upper (west) corner. According to information given by Will Girty, several Negro slayes were buried there; also six or eight other colored men from other locations who died while working on the construction of the railroad in the 1870s and early 1880s.

The names in this record that are preceded by an asterisk (*) are those who are supposed to have been buried in Brick Union Cemetery, but whose markers were not located. Some of these never had a marker of any type. Other markers could very well be buried beneath the soil; one was accidently discovered under leaves and dirt by sound it produced when struck with the end of a walking stick.

Some dates and indications of family relationships that did not appear on markers in the cemetery have been added from the genealogical files of Jacqueline H Rader. Such information appears in parenthesis along with information from other sources.

In 1958 a legacy of \$3000.00 was willed for the purpose of perpetual upkeep of 3 cemeteries in Botetourt County: Brick Union Cemetery, the old Linkenhoker-Cline family cemetery, and Wheatland Cemetery. The donor was Miss Margurate Linkenhoker who died in Washington, D.C., on Jan. 31, 1958, at the age of 82 yrs. and 5 months. On Nov. 27, 1959, the Virginia Society for Crippled Children and Adults was appointed successor trustee under the will. However, no work was done at Brick Union Cemetery until the spring of 1964 when some locust trees were cut and honeysuckle burned in the cemetery. The cemetery soon was smothered again by Wild vegetation. Extensive cleaning of the grounds and a few repairs to graves and stones was done in the early part of 1966, but by mid-summer the undergrowth was again so heavy that it was not safe to enter the grounds and few tomestones could be seen from outside the fence surrounding the cemetery. Once-a-year cleaning accomplised very little under these circumstances.

Brick Union Cemetery (con't)

On Feb. 21, 1967, five local trustees for the lands of Brick Union Cemetery were appointed by the Botetourt County Circuit Court. These were: John W, Rader (Jack), Jacqueline (Jackie) H. Rader, Neville L Brugh, Dorothy C. Hughes, and Robert H. Murray, Jr. Under the name of "Botetourt Cemetery Association", this group seeks better care. All damaged stones were reparied and reset by a professional in 1970 and a chain link fence around the 220' x 160' area was erected in 1973.

- FRANKLIN, Fannie J., June 9, 1803 July 11, 1895, "In memory of Fannie J. Franklin; erected by Mattie E. Whitlow" (Looks like stone, but is hollow metal)
- *GIRTY, Frances Nelson, Mother of Will Girty, died 1909. (Colored; info. from Will Girty)
- GIRTY, John, died May 21, 1924, aged 82. (Colored. Rader funeral home marker; Will's father) (Near southwest corner of fence.)

*GRADY, Juet Henry, June 15, 1829 - Apr. 13, 1879. (Info. from Pernie Overstreet)

- GRADY, Mary Elizabeth, died Dec. 22, 1922, aged 70. (Metal funeral marker inside low cement wall near entrance. Her date of birth was July 10, 1852 and she was the wife of Juet Grady and dau. of ______ Dooley. Info. Pernie Overstreet)
- HACKLEY, Elizabeth, May 9, 1833 Nov. 28, 1895. (Colored; Will Girty's aunt)
- HAMMOND, Lewis, son of Peter & Margaret (nee Housman) Hammond, died Nov. 10, 1828, aged 3 yrs., 8 mo., 5 days. (Near Geo. Housman stone)
- HEPLER, Elizabeth, wife of Henry Hepler, died Mar. 23, 1874, aged 84 yrs., 5 mo., 6 days. (born 1790. Buried in upper section by husband. Her stone had been displaced when cemetery was cleaned off and was found propped against a tree several feet up the hill on Nov 1, 1964. It was still there in Mar. of 1967.)

HEPLER, Henry, died April __, 1863, aged 79 yrs. (Born 1784)

*HINER, Bessie, dau of Lewis & Sarah Hiner. (Info from Pernie Overstreet)

*HINER, Jim and his wife.

" " .. *HINER, Sarah, wife of Lewis Miner. *HINER, Sarah, 1st wife of John Hiner. HIPES, J. H., 1858 - 1937. (Near Shay plot) HOUSMAN, George, died Apr. 29, 1826, aged 21 yrs., 3 mo., 17 days. (Badly worn and leaning round-topped stone near corner of secondary fence and near the oldest Keseler stones.) *HOUSMAN, - There are probably several other Housmans buried here. Especially Christian and wife, Eve, who gave land for Brick Union Church nearby. A number of their slaves are also buried here in unmarked graves in the colored section. In 1958, a large, thik board, than rotting away, marked one grave near that of Geo. Housman. No trace of it remained after the cemetery was burned over for cleaning. Another very old round-topped stone with no legible inscription, but with delicate border design, marked a grave near the wooden board. *HOUSMAN, a slave $\frac{1}{2}$ day old owned by Christian and Catharine 'Houserman', d. Aug. 15, 1860. (This info. from Bot. Co. Record of Deaths, page 27.) JAMES, Rebecca Jane, Mar. 16, 1845 - Oct. 6, 1854. JONSON, Sarah Fanney (?), aged 6 (?) yrs., 5 mo., 4 d.(?) - (no date found on old double-carved stone in upper corner above secondary fence and abt. 25' from upper boundry fence. This stone found after cemetery was cleaned off.)

, about a dozen unmarked graves between Jonson stone and small slab stone of Geo. W. Rader, Jr., at corner of secondary fence. Each grave clearly outlined and well mounded; heads along border of secondary fence.

There are many field stone markers in Brick Union Cemetery and, before the cemetery was burned over in 1964, several graves marked with thick boards which probably had inscriptions at one time but which had rotted away. Some of these markers without inscriptions are described as follows:

3 graves down slope from Alice R. Staton are marked with plain slab rocks at the head and foot of each grave. These graves are adjoining each other in a row.

2 footstones have been reset next to the trunk of a tree below the Boggess plot. The initials are "W.H.L." & A.A.L." - probably Lemon.

9 graves marked with flat rocks; located up the slope and about 10" from the row of 5 Camper funeral markers. These may be Sniders, according to Pernie Rader; not sure.

8 graves marked with flat rocks; located beyond the above 9. Some of these have been reset in a row, close together, since the cemetery was cleaned off.

2 cld round-top stones with carved designs but no legible inscriptions; located directly behind the J. K. Rader stone and to the right, back of infant Rader. Apparently these are footsones for the graves of John Kesler and wife, Elizabeth.

2 thin rocks set upright; located about 6' right and slightly above level of Elizabeth Kessler, wife of John. These 2 rocks stand side by side.

4 graves marked with rock slabs set upright; located about 15' and slightly towards fence from Susana Snider. These also have rock slabs at foot of each grave.

2 graves, one marked with thick board and the other with old round-top stone at head of grave and another similar smaller stone at foot. Delicate border design on headstone and simple abstract design on footstone, but legible inscription. The wooden marker was destroyed when the cemetery was burned over in 1964. These were probably Housman graves, since they are near the markers of George Housman and Lewis Hammond.

1 small slab, unmarked; located near fence, to left, from Geo. E. & Lou E. Rader.

1 unmarked slab; located near corner of fence above Geo. E & Lou E Rader.

The body of Retta Rader Reynolds (died in childbirth) and her infant, formerly in plot with her parents, Geo. E. and Lou E. Rader, was moved to Troutville Cemetery some years ago.

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BRICK UNION CEMETERY (con't)

About 20' right from the Henry H. Snider family graves, near secondary fence 2 graves marked with thick boards, rotting away. No trace of these after cemetery was burned over.

Next space, slightly up hill from John Girty, Citizen's metal funeral marker, no legible inscription. Probably John's wife.

Near John Girty and other Citizen's metal marker, lower level towards main boundry fence, is a metal Rader funeral home marker: _____ died Feb. _____ 26 ____. Mostly illegible.

According to Will Girty, there are at least 6 or 8 colored men, unidentified, buried there who died in the late 1870s and early 1880s while working on the railroad during its construction. They were not local people. Also, there are a number of slaves buried in Brick Union Cemetery who belonged to local white citizens.

RED TRAILS AND WHITE

The Mysterious Life of Caty Sage

By Mrs. Bonnie Sage Ball

One can imagine the feelings of Lovis Sage, wrinkled and whitehaired, now well along in her nineties, when she received an unusual letter from her son, Charles Sage, in Western Missouri. The Sage homestead was located in Elk Creek Valley, Grayson County, Virginia, near Independence. This was a spring day in 1848. The letter read like this:

> "Van Burren Co. Missouri April the 2nd, 1848

Dear Mother, Brother and Sisters:

I again take up my pen to write you. I have often written to you but never with such intense interest as at the present time. . . . Some three weeks ago I was at Fort Leavenworth, and I met a half breed Wyandott Indian. He told me there was a white woman living with them, that her voice and features had a resemblance to mine. After telling him the circumstances of my having had a sister lost, he said he believed it to be she. So I determined to go and see her myself. I did and got all the information I could and believe she is my long lost Sister Caty. . . . She looks to be about sixty years of age."

Caty (Catherine) Sage, when a small child, had been taken from her home in Grayson County and later given to the Wyandotte Indian tribe by the Cherokees.

From the foreword of this book, the author states that the reader will see potentialities for a stirring historical novel. The nucleus has been handed down through six generations of a pioneer Virginia family. So rare are the circumstances, it was referred to by an early historian as "Truth reads stranger than fiction."

The biography is based on nine letters, yellow and brittle with age, left to a grandson in Elk Creek Valley by his grandmother, Betsey Sage Delph, who lived to see the dawn of the twentieth century. Betsey was the youngest sister of the mysterious Caty.

A gift of <u>Red Trails</u> and <u>White</u> has been given to the Southwest Virginia Genealogical Society by the author, and it has been placed in the Virginia Room of the Roanoke Public Library, Roanoke, Virginia. Great grandfather: PETER JONES, born 1818, married MARY ANGLE, daughter of Catherine Humphre by a former marriage. Peter and Mary were married July 1838 in Salem, Va, by Rev. Joshua Burnett, Baptist Minister. This was first Jones marriage recorded in Roanoke Co. Peter Jones was a millwright - having built and installed machinery in some of the first mills in Roanoke Valley and on the North and South Forks of the Roanoke River. The last mill he built was known as Kirbys Mill in Montgomery County on the North Fork of Roanoke River, now known as Fagg, Va. He was living at Fagg when his youngest son, John William, was married. Soon after, he and his wife went to make their home with John William and his wife, Sallie Lane Jones. John William was born just west of Salem in the old brick house now known as the Preston Place.

Peter Jones and Mary Angle Jones were buried in the Brown's Cemetary near McDonalds Mill in Montgomery County nine miles east of Blacksburg, Va. Peter died 10-20-1889; Mary died 8-26-1894.

SOME NOTES ON THE TODD AND MCKEE FAMILIES OF ROCKBRIDGE COUNTY, VIRGINIA

Condensed from notes made in 1886 by S. S. Todd, M.D., of Kansas City, Missouri, in the margins of a book: J. I. Mombert, "Authentic History of Lancaster County, Pa." published in 1869.

The Finley, McKee and Todd families originated in County, Dawn, Ireland. Before their emigration to America they were closely related through marriage.

Head of the Todd family (American immigrants) was John Todd. He had at least three sons (James, Robert, Andrew), and one daughter (Elizabeth).

All these members of the Todd family came to America prior to 1738, for in that year John Todd died in Abington Township, Philadelphia County (later the area became Montgomery County).

In County Dawn, Ireland, James Todd married Nancy Barnes; and William McKee married Elizabeth Todd. (James and Elizabeth Todd were children of John Todd.) Later, in Abington Township, John Finley married Sarah Todd, daughter of Robert Todd.

Robert Todd moved from Abington Twp. to Trappe, in Montgomery Co. Andrew moved to Chester Cou/nty, and James and Nancy (Barnes) Todd took their family to Pequea Creek, Lancaster County, in1740 where they settled for a time. The McKees -- William and Elizabeth (Todd) McKee -- moved with them.

In 1749, the James Todd and William McKee families left Pequea creek for the Valley of Virginia, where they settled in Augusta County (that portion which became Rockbridge County). Along with them went, also, some members of the Hamilton family.

Shortly after these families went to Rockbridge, Va., John and Sarah (Todd) Finley moved to Chestnut Level (on a small tributary of Fishing Creek), where John and Sarah lived out their lives and were buried.

Head of the immigrating McKee family is in doubt: William, Samuel or Thomas? Robert McKee, who became Captain of the 3rd Battalion, Lancaster County Militia in 1777, was the son either of Samuel or Thomas Ackee. (Possible relationship of William (who married Elizabeth Todd) to Thomas and Samuel, is not explored, although a relationship is clearly implied.)

Montgomery County Court Record, 1788

(Certified Copy from John B. Myers, Clerk Circuit Court of Montgomery County Christiansburg, Virginia 24073)

In the name of God, Amen, I Samuel Newberry of the County of Montgomery and State of Virginia being in a low State of Health though perfect in memory Knowing it is appointed for all men to die, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form as follows. In the first place I recommend my soul to Almighty God who gave it and my Body to the Earth to be decently Buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned and as far what worldly goods it hath pleased God to bestow on me I give and bequeath in manner and form as follows. In the first place I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Bethian Newberry one third of my whole Estate. In the second place I give and bequeath to Daughter Elizabeth Newberry the balance of the movables after her Mother takes her thirds except the Child that my wife now goes with should be a girl then in that case the said girl if it lives to share equal with my daughter Elizabeth in the next place I desire that my lands be equally divided between my five sons as namely Samuel, James, Robert, David and Josepeph except the child my wife now goes with should be a boy then in that case I desire that he should share an equal part with my other sons. I desire that my sons shall not be prohibited from setling on the said Land either at marriage or at age. I also desire that neither of my sons shall have liberty of selling their part of the Land untill my son Joseph comes of age. I also desire that my wife shall keep the whole of the stock for the use of her family untill my daughter comes at age then the said stock and the increase what should live of the said to return unto my daughter except my daughter should marry before she comes of age the said stock and increase to be delivered to her at the day of marriage. I do hereby anominate and appoint my wife Executor to my Estate. I desire that my son Samuel be bound to Andrew Crockett to learn the Blacksmyth Trade and my other sons to be bound to such other Trades as my Executor shall see cause. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Twenty eight day of January 1787.

TOWNS AND PLACES

(Editor's Note: This is the first column on names of towns and places in Virginia, West Virginia, and Pennsylvania. Suggestions, questions, or contributions should be sent to J.V.Avery, Jr. P O Box 2154, Roanoke, Va. 24009.)

Our January 1978 issue of <u>VAN</u> contained a query requesting information or research on Collins Creek in Augusta Co and Collins Mills Post Office in Grayson Co.

The Post Office at Collins Mills was evidently only in operation for two years 1890-91. It was run by H. Collins. The 1880 Census shows two "H. Collins": Houston a farmer age 36 (wife Della age 21, children: Charles 3 and Alice 9 mos.); and Hasten(r) Collins also a farmer age 28 (wife Martha 26, children Bertha 3, and M.Margie 1). Other heads of families in the area were Malon age 34, Dennis 29, Randolph 31, James 39, and Elijah 77 (wife Maggie 62). These families were found in the section of Grayson Co known as "Oldtown".

No reférences to Collins Creek could be found in the indexes to the histories or Annals of Augusta Co. The earliest Collins found was John Collins who is found there first 19 April 1749.

There was a Collins Settlement in Lewis Co WV which was once a part of Augusta Co. Collins Settlement was founded in 1797-98 by John Collins and his three sons: Jacob, Cornelius, and Isaac. It was located in the southernmost portion of Lewis Co on the West Fork River. The Post Office was first started by J.H. Camden in 1821.


