


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PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

THE BUSH FAMILY OF SOUTHWEST VIRGINIA

This family portrait was taken in 1902 on the day Margaret Bush, dressed in white, married her cousin, Albert Bush of the Kentucky branch of the family. Her parents and eldest brother George Gose Bush are seated in the picture.

James Bush, no middle name, the father, was born in 1850, the seventh son of Valentine Bush who lived to the age of 104 years. He was born ca 1799, the son of Austin Bush and his wife said to be of Indian blood. The wife of Valentine Bush and the mother of James was Nancy Gose, the daughter of Christopher Gose and Mary Elizabeth Litz, and the granddaughter of Stephen Gose and Elizabeth Spracher, pioneers of Southwest Virginia and Russell County. Valentine and Nancy Gose Bush are buried in the church cemetery of the Baptist Church in Nichelsville, Virginia.

Mary Ann Ellen Bond, wife of James Bush, was the daughter of George Bond and Hannah Kilgore and the great granddaughter of the Rev. Robert Kilgore, also known as Robin Kilgore, the first Mason to be buried in Scott County. His grave with marker bearing the Masonic emblem is in the Nichelsville Cemetery.

James Bush and Mary Ann Ellen Bond were married December 31, 1874 in or near Nickelsville in Scott County. They were the parents of George Gose Bush, Charles E. Bush, Margaret Bush, James Hopkins Bush, and a daughter who died in infancy.

Present for the wedding of their sister were three brothers, George Gose Bush and his wife, Martha Culbertson Bush, Charles E. Bush and James Hopkins Bush. It was quite an elegant affair for the back woods, judging from the family dressed in their best finery. Even James Bush, a mountain man and unaccustomed to frills and furbelows, put on the new ruffled front shirt his wife had made for him, a coat and his best leather boots. While Mary, his wife, was dolled up in her best bib and tucker. Martha, no doubt, was honor attendant for she, too, was in her Sunday best. All were wearing flowers, even the gentlemen.

James Hopkins Bush, the seventeen year old, on the far left of the picture behind his father, is the father of Viola Bush Wright. He married Mattie Lula

Pinkard, the daughter of Charles Ballard and Frances Mason Pinkard after the family moved from Scott County to Franklin County in the vicinity of Ferrum on Story Creek. They were married October 25, 1907, as the story goes, on horse-back. James Hopkins Bush came to the school taught by Mattie Pinkard on the day he and her father had gone to Rocky Mount for the marriage license. He had brought a horse saddled with the proper side saddle for her to ride and they were married near the school by the minister they knew well, and he, too, is presumed to have been mounted.

Elizabeth Byrnside Alexander was born August 30th, 1820.

Elizabeth Parthenia Sawyers was born January 12, 1829.

William Henderson was born March 5th, 1776 and was married to Ann Dinges. January 10th, 1800. Died June 24th, 1864. 1846

Ann Dinges was born July 9th, 1784 and died January 3rd, 1829.

William Henderson was a son of Capt. John Henderson and his wife was Anna, formerly Anna Givins. Capt. John Henderson was a son of Saml. Henderson.

Ann Henderson, wife of William Henderson was a daughter of Peter and Mary Dinges. Peter Dinges was a son of Michael and Gertrude Dinges.

John Hutton Henderson was born January 27th, 1801.

Mary Henderson, afterwards Mary Straton, was born March 26th, 1803.

Elizabeth Henderson, afterwards McDonald, was born March 12th, 1806.

Dinges Henderson was born May 7th, 1811.

Mary Dinges, wife of Peter Dinges, was a daughter of Thomas and Barbara Smith and the maiden name of Barbara was Anderson.

Henley G Henderson and Elizabeth Jane B. Alexander were married on the 8th day of February A.D. 1853.

Henley G. Henderson and Elizabeth Parthenia were married November 3rd, 1870.

William Henderson was born January 14th, 1854.

Pheba Ann Henderson was born May 5th, 1855.

Mary Isabella Henderson was born March 18, 1857.

John Henry Henderson was born March 6th, 1859.

Henley Gruber Henderson, Jr. was born July 25th, 1860

David Houston Henderson was born July 21st, 1867.

DEATHS

Phebe Ann Henderson died September 12th, 1856. Aged one year, four months and seven days.

David Houston Henderson died at midnight between the 17th & 18th of August 1866. Aged one year and twenty eight days.

Elizabeth Jane Byrnside Henderson died August 13th, 1869 at 12 o'clock/m. Aged 49 years wanting 17 days.

Mrs. Phebe Alexander died August 9th, 1869. Aged 86 years and 5th month.

Henley Gruber Henderson died February 6th, 1892. Aged 83 years and 9 days.

Elizabeth Parthenia Henderson died October 29th 1896.

William Andrew Henderson died Dec. 24th, 1893.

John Henry Henderson died Nov. 30, 1925.

TOWNS AND PLACESFURNACES OF BOTETOURT COUNTY

Between 1768 and 1882 there were some twenty furnaces producing iron in Botetourt County. The first furnace was Harvey's Catawba Furnace located on Lee's Branch of Catawba Creek. It was built between 1768 and 1770 by Isaac Zane. In 1821 it was owned by Robert Harvey and is sometimes referred to incorrectly as Martha Furnace.

Downstream from Harvey's was the Brunswick Forge and Splitting Mill. It is near the mouth of Lee's Branch where it flows into the Catawba. This forge is shown on Woods Map of 1821 as Taylor's Iron Works. At one time it was also known as Catawba Forge.

Also in the area was the Catawba Furnace. It was located upstream from Brunswick Forge on Catawba Creek. It is incorrectly shown on Wood Map as being near Lee's Branch. It was actually upstream from Stone Coal Creek. It was built in 1830 and may have been owned by Robert Harvey. The property was sold to Joseph R. Anderson in 1847.

A fourth furnace was located on the Catawba. This was the Salisbury Furnace located where the Catawba empties into the James River. The pits used in making charcoal for the furnace was located across the James from the furnace.

Another early furnace was owned by Mathew Harvey. It was located on his Mountjoy estate near Buchanan. It is shown on Wood's Map on the south side of Looney's Mill Creek.

About 1830 a furnace was built at Roaring Run by a man named Robertson. The tub bellows were built by a millwright named Flaherty. The furnace was owned and operated by the Anderson family. It was abandoned in 1854 and rebuilt in 1863. The furnace could produce ten tons of high quality iron per day. The area is preserved as a picnic area near Eagle Rock.

Near Roaring Run was another Anderson furnace, Grace Furnace. There was an old charcoal furnace there before the iron furnace. It was in operation in the 1850's and during the Civil War.

Two other old furnaces were located on Purgatory Creek north west of Buchanan. They were known as Mayberry A and B. The lower furnace, Mayberry A, was located near the Cartmill's homestead and is shown on Wood's Map. The stack to the furnace is still standing, but the remainder of the furnace has been torn down to build walls in the fields across the road. The other furnace was further upstream. I could not get my Cutlass that far up the road to see if it was still standing.

Probably the best known furnace in Botetourt County was at Cloverdale. This furnace was built about 1787 by Robert Harvey. It was also known as Martha after Harvey's wife Martha, the daughter of Benjamin Borden. The furnace was on a mill race which

was used to power the bellows. The same race was used to power the Cloverdale Flour Mill. The furnace was located upstream from the flour mill where the old road leading west crossed Tinker Creek. The 1821 map identifies it as Tayloe's Furnace. It was operated by John Tayloe III from 1810 to his death in 1824. There may have been as many as three furnaces located on or near the same site. A furnace known as Cloverdale 1 was built about 1830 and abandoned in 1843. Cloverdale 2 was built in 1841 and rebuilt in 1850. Both these furnaces were in production during the Civil War. One of the furnaces was burned by General Hunter in June 1864, but was rebuilt in six months.

The only furnace in Botetourt County built during the Civil War was at Arcadia. It is on Jennings Creek about three and one half miles northeast of Buchanan in the Jefferson National Forest. It was built in 1862 and abandoned in 1882. The furnace is still standing. The present owner has a CB antenna mounted on top of it.

During the Civil War most of the furnaces in production were owned or controlled by John and /or Joseph Anderson. These included Roaring Run, Catawba, Cloverdale 1 and 2, and Grace. Joseph Anderson was an agent for the Tredgar Iron Works in Richmond who purchased Catawba, Cloverdale, and Grace from the Andersons in 1862. Apparently the only furnace in operation after the Civil War was Arcadia.

There were other furnaces in Botetourt of which little record remains. These include: Aetna 1 and 2, Rebecca (in operation in the 1850's), Retreat, Callie, Princess, and Jane (also operating during the 1850's).

SOME FREEDMEN IDENTITIES

PART II -- Slaveowners and Their Former Slaves

All references in this section to Montgomery Co. are to Montgomery Co, Va., whose county seat is Christiansburg, containing the Courthouse, constructed in 1908. The County Clerk's office contains, among numerous other records, the marriage records of the county from 1787 to the present. In the flap pocket of Book one of the Marriage Register this writer found four folded papers with the following heading: "Register of Colored Persons of Montgomery County, State of Virginia, cohabitating together as husband and wife on 27th February 1866." Subheadings were: Name of Husband; Age; Place of Birth; Residence; Occupation; Last Owner; Last Owners Residence; Name of Wife; Age; Place of Birth; Residence; Last Owner; Last Owners Residence; Name of Children, with age of each; Date of Commencement of Cohabitation, Some 336 families, with a minimum of 2 to a maximum of 14 to a family were listed. This register was compiled by Captain Charles S. Schaeffer, Freedmen's Bureau Agent who was the founder of the Christiansburg institute and the church which now bears his name -- Schaeffer Memorial Baptist Church in Christiansburg.

Where the 1866 Cohabitation Register listing coincides with 1865 "Census of the Colored Population of Montgomery Co., Va." it has been incorporated under the name of the individual. Although not all of the 865 names are thus matched, it does not diminish the importance of the Register of Colored Persons cohabitations. Prior to February 29, 1866 there were only seven (7) Black marriages registered in the County Clerk's office - the first of which occurred on 28th of October, 1865--but, these do not show former slave-owners and children, if any. Therefore, this is a find of considerable consequence to Black geneology in this area.

George Robinson and His Kin
by

George Robinson and His Kin is the story of the Robinson family, descendants of James through his son, George from 1726 to the present. James Robinson and his wife Cathern Howell Robinson came from the North of Ireland, along with other Ulster County Presbyterian Dissenters, either in the late 1600's or early 1700's. James settled in New Castle County, Delaware where he made his will in 1726.

George Robinson brought his family down the Shenandoah Valley in Orange County, Augusta County (now Botetourt) with land transactions along Buffalo Creek (now Tinker Creek), the James, the Roanoke and the New River. "Captain Robinson died in the spring of 1763,.... an important individual in the great migration from lower Pennsylvania to Virginia...."

The Russell County, Virginia Robinsons began with Samuel Robinson whose first record was found in 1786 the year of the County formation. His records show lands around the cedar-covered rolling hills of Lebanon, Virginia and Elk Garden. "The magic of Elk Garden is something that will live forever in the physical and mental makeup of anyone who has been so fortunate as to see its beauty, breathe its air...."

The Pike County, Kentucky Robinsons began with David Robinson "looking to see what was over the next hill." Early records mention Millard Area, Johns Creek, Brushy Fork and Apple Orchard Settlement.

Allied families of the Robinsons were Huffman, Johnson, Price, Alexander, MacDonald and others. The book includes many wills, marriage records, land deeds and military records. It has documented notes and an index.

BY-LAWS

OF

SOUTHWESTERN VIRGINIA GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY

Article I - Name and Purpose

Section 1. The Southwestern Virginia Genealogical Society, hereafter referred to as the "Society" is organized as a non-stock, non-profit organization to encourage, foster, and organize genealogical research, teaching, publishing, education, and recording; and to encourage, foster and organize all other activities related to genealogy.

Section 2. The area covered by this society shall include the twenty-nine counties of southwestern Virginia, consisting of the following: Alleghany, Bath, Bedford, Bland, Botetourt, Buchanan, Carroll, Craig, Dickenson, Floyd, Franklin, Giles, Grayson, Henry, Highland, Lee, Montgomery, Patrick, Pittsylvania, Pulaski, Roanoke, Rockbridge, Russell, Scott, Smythe, Tazewell, Washington, Wise, and Wythe, as well as any cities located within this area.

Article II - Membership and dues

Section 1. Membership in the Society shall be open to any person who subscribes to the purposes and principles of the organization as stated in Article 1.

Section 2. Membership in the Society shall be of two classes, active and honorary. Honorary membership may be conferred upon any person by unanimous vote of those present at any regular meeting. Honorary members shall not be required to pay dues and shall not have a vote in the meetings of the Society.

Section 3. Annual dues of \$7.50 for individual membership and \$10.00 for family membership shall be due and payable on January 1 of each calendar year. Members whose dues are not paid by January 31 of each year will not receive the next issue of Virginia Appalachian Notes (VAN). Family memberships shall be furnished only one copy of any newsletter, notices, or other publications. All members will be furnished a list of members of the Society, a copy of the by-laws, and a copy of the VAN to be published quarterly.

Section 4. VAN - Virginia Appalachian Notes, shall be published in February, May, August and November of each year.

Article III - Officers and Their Duties

Section 1. The officers of the Society shall be a president, a first vice-president, a second vice-president, a recording secretary, a corresponding secretary, treasurer, assistant treasurer. With the exception of the first and second vice-presidents, duties of the officers shall be such as their titles imply and as prescribed by the parliamentary authority adopted by the Society. The first vice-president shall serve as program chairman and the second vice-president will be chairman of the membership committee.

Section 2. The officers and the immediate past president shall constitute the Executive Board.

Article IV - Elections

Section 1. All officers shall be elected by ballot at the November meeting

Article IV - continued

and shall continue in office one year, beginning on January 1, following, or until the next annual election. No officer may be elected to more than two consecutive terms of office.

Section 2. A majority of all votes cast shall be necessary to constitute an election.

Section 3. Vacancies in office shall be filled by special election.

Section 4. The President shall appoint a nominating committee of three members at the October meeting to present a slate of officers to the membership at the November meeting. Nominations for all offices may be made from the floor at the November meeting. Prior consent of all nominees shall have been obtained.

Article V - Meetings

Section 1. Regular meetings of the Society shall be held the third Saturday of each month at 1:30 p.m. in the auditorium of the Roanoke City Main Public Library.

Section 2. Ten members, exclusive of officers, shall constitute a quorum.

Article VI - Committees

In addition to the Nominating Committee provided for in Article IV, the following committees shall be named.

1. The Program Committee shall be chaired by the first vice-president who will appoint two others to serve.
2. The membership committee shall be chaired by the second vice-president who will also appoint two others or more to serve.
3. The president shall appoint a chairman and committee members for publicity, books, telephone, pedigree charts or others as the occasion arises.

Article VII - Parliamentary Authority

Robert Rules of Order, Revised, shall be the parliamentary authority of the Society except where they are inconsistent with the By-Laws.

Article VIII - Amendments

These By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting by a majority vote of the members present. All proposed changes shall be in writing and shall be distributed to the members at the regular meeting. Voting on the proposed amendments shall take place at the next regular meeting.

Article IX - Honors

At the end of the president's term of office, a book shall be given to the Virginia Room of the Roanoke Public Library in honor of that retiring president.

Article X - Dissolution

In the event that the Society shall be dissolved, any assets held by the Society shall accrue to the benefit of the Virginia Room of the Roanoke Public Library if it qualifies as an exempt organization under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law. If they do not qualify under the Internal Revenue Code, then the assets will be disposed of as stated in the Sixth part of the Articles of Organization.

ARTICLES OF ORGANIZATION

Articles of organization of the Southwestern Virginia Genealogical Society.

The undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the United States, desiring to form a Non-Profit Association, do hereby certify.

FIRST: The name of the Association shall be the Southwestern Virginia Genealogical Society.

SECOND: The place in this State where the principal office of the Association is to be located in the home of the president elect of the association.

THIRD: The Association is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes. The purposes for which the association is organized are as follows:

- (a) To encourage, foster and organize genealogical research, teaching, publishing, education and recording.
- (b) To encourage, foster and organized all other activities related to genealogy.

FOURTH: The names and addresses of the persons who are the initial trustees of the association are as follows:

FIFTH: No part of the net earnings of the association shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the association shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article Third hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the association shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the association shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the association shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by an association exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or (b) by an association, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

SIXTH: Upon the dissolution of the association, the Board of Trustees shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the association, dispose of all of the assets of the association exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding

provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Trustees shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the county in which the principal office of the association is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
