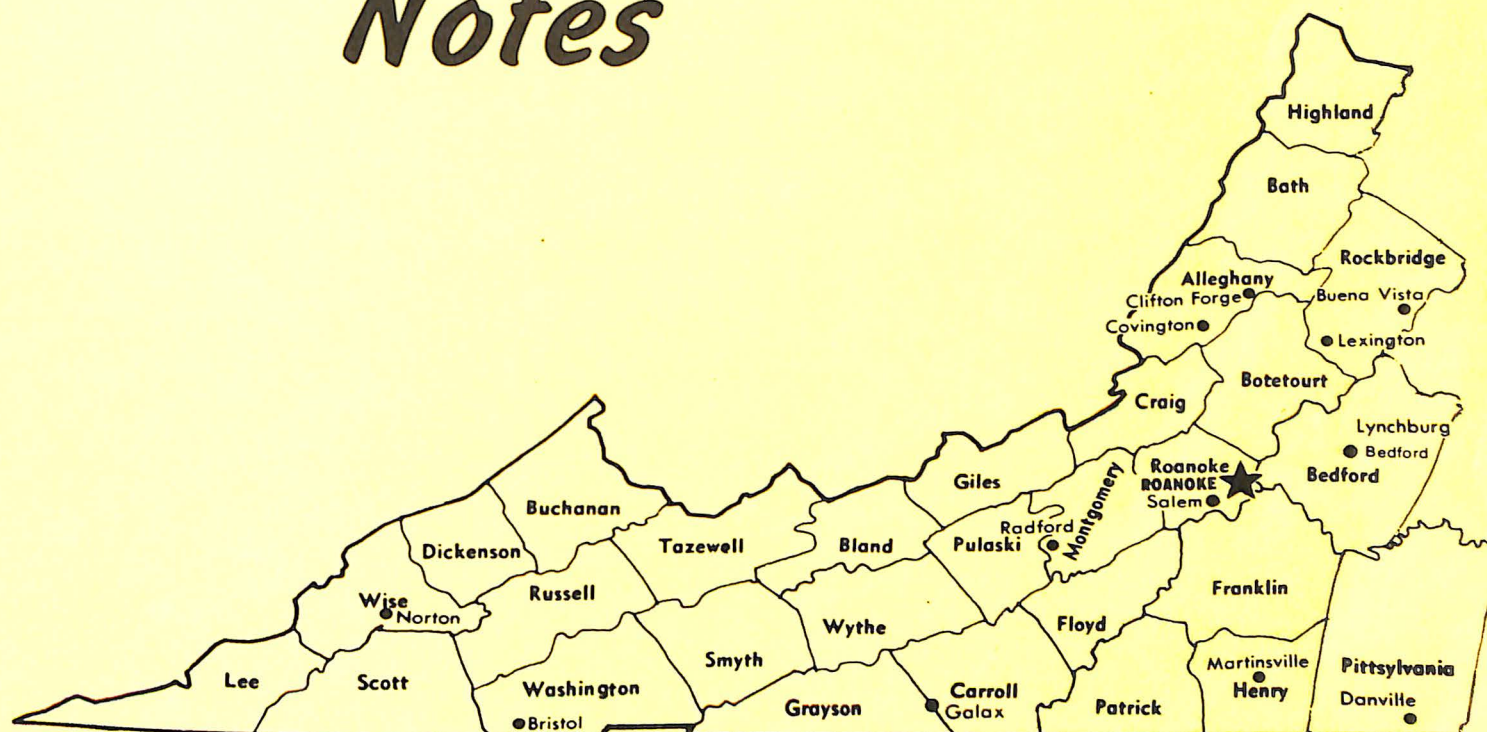

PREISCH - PRICE

AN OPEN LETTER

TO: Members of the HARLESS FAMILY ASSOCIATION and all the descendants of the following individuals who emigrated to America from Germany, arriving at Philadelphia on the ship Winter Galley 5 September 1738: Johan Michael PREISCH; Augustine PREISCH; Daniel PREISCH; Heinrich PREISCH; and Anna Margaretha (PREISCH) HARLESS. All of the above named individuals later left Pennsylvania and settled in the Shenandoah Valley and the New River Valley of Virginia.

Neuenschwander, 4727 South 1300 East, Salt Lake City, Utah 84117 Telephone: 801-272-7053, a direct descendant of Johan Michael PREISCH (PRICE) and his wife, Margaretha (KILLIAN) PREISCH, through their daughter Agnes, who married Thomas HALE in 1780, in Montgomery County, Virginia. (Comments welcomed by researcher - please include stamped self-addressed envelope for reply.) Researcher is a professional genealogist with a certificate from Brigham Young University as a Specialist in American Research - has some language background, i. e. one year of college German, and two years of high school Latin.

SUBJECT: Native home of the PREISCH family in Germany verified, and ancestral line extended to 1644; maiden name of the mother of the above immigrants found (HOFFMANN), and line extended to 1660.

It is with joy and satisfaction that I wish to share with other descendants the results of recent research which yielded the attached information on the ancestry in Germany of the PREISCH (PRICE) families of the Shenandoah Valley and the New River Valley of Virginia. More than fifteen years ago, I was successful in extending my own ancestry to Johan Michael PREISCH of Montgomery County, Virginia through a daughter, Agnes, who married Thomas Hale in 1780. It was possible to extend the line to this point without too much difficulty from American sources, but, like so many others who have made an effort, I found difficulty in trying to extend the line overseas. In 1967, I did ask a German Professional Researcher to make an effort to find the PREISCH native home in Germany from the clues in Dr. Pritchard's book on the Harless Family. However from American sources it was believed the given name of the father of the above named individuals was Johan Hendrick or Johan Heinrich or Adam Henrich. When the German researcher advised me there was a David PREISCH in Offenbach during the period of time in question and that he was a Catholic rather than a Lutheran, I did not pursue the matter further. Also, I felt I could not afford the expense involved. Needless to say, I should have pursued the matter at that time!

When the Harless Family Association sent me a copy of the Jan-June 1977 issue of their bulletin containing information on the Harless native home in Germany, I decided to use my limited knowledge of German to research German films on file at the Genealogical Society of Utah in Salt Lake City. Seeing the connection of Ferdinand Harless to the Catholic Faith, I decided to search in Catholic records of Offenbach for the PREISCH line. We had information that Anna Margaretha Preisch married Phillip Harless at Offenbach, and I had supposed that because Anna Margaretha Preisch had married in the Lutheran faith that the entire family was Lutheran. Of course, I felt even more disgusted with myself, when I realized the information for further research at Offenbach was included in Dr. Pritchard's book, and that those records on film have been available here in Salt Lake City since 1961.

As you study the attached copies from the Baptismal Register and the Family Register you will note that a date of Death is shown for Johan Michael Preisch. Only a portion of the date is available on the Baptismal entry, along with the sign of death, but the full date is entered in the Family Register. I have discussed this death entry with other professional researchers, and have concluded that a mistake was made by the person entering the date in the register --- we know that the first Daniel Preisch died, else the second Daniel would not have been given that name. The procedure of naming a second child the same as one who was deceased was common during this period of time, especially in German records. We have Johan Michael's age as 19 on the ship register, and the 9 October 1718 date agrees with this age. The date in the Family Register would have been entered much later -- possibly many many years later -- and would have been copied from the Baptismal record, no doubt. We, therefore, know that Johan Michael did not die as a child, but that the first Daniel did die -- I have shown the date of death of 14 February 1722 as applying to the first Daniel rather than to Michael.

You will also note that the word "infant" and the sign of death is shown in the entry of the Baptismal Register for Augustine. To further confuse matters, Augustine's age on the ship register is shown as "14". The Family Register does not show a date of death for Augustine, nor does it show that another child was given the same name. The heading of the ship register indicates "males 16 years of age and upwards" yet Augustine is shown as age 14. I believe a mistake has been made in transcribing the ship's register. We know from American records that Augustine was born in 1722. Chalkley's Records of Augusta County, Virginia, Vol. 2, page 36, states: "Augustine Price states in October 1802 that he is 80 years of age; that he was driven from his home on New River by Indians in the year of Braddock's defeat."

Regarding the mother of the Preisch children who emigrated in 1738, it is not known at this time whether she emigrated or not. We know that her husband, David Preisch died 11 July 1735 at Offenbach, and her own father was also deceased. The Family register does not show a date of death at Offenbach for Agnes Preisch, but the death records, which start in 1747 have not, at this time, been researched. It is inconceivable to me that the mother would have stayed in Germany while all of her children emigrated -- all except Anna Margaretha, who was now married, were very young -- Michael was 19; Augustine was 16; Daniel was 14; and Heinrich was only 12. It is unfortunate that the ship register did not show female passengers. Perhaps further research will eventually clear up this problem for us.

On the Hoffmann pedigree and the Family Register, it is indicated that Johan Georg Hoffmann emigrated to America -- this would be a brother of Agnes Hoffman who married David Preisch. The Winter Galley register of 1738 indicates a Jerg Hoffmann was on board, age 37. This may very well be the Johan Georg born 25 April 1700, married Eva Barbara Starct 7 May 1725, had several children, but none shown as born after 1738. Other Hoffmanns on board same ship not identified. Agnes' brother, Johan Jacob, emigrated to Hungary.

During the past several years, I have done considerable research on all of the Preisch family who emigrated in 1738 -- so much so that I felt I knew them well which was certainly beneficial when trying to locate these people in the German records. Much research was done in an effort to prove or disprove the information which a couple publications show that Johan Michael Price married a Margaretha Harless, a sister to Johan Philip Harless. In all my years of searching, I have not found one single vital record to support this assumption. Now we have information from the Harless research in Germany which shows there was a Maria Margreta Herlass from Muhlhofen*, no doubt a sister to Johan Philip Herlass, but further research indicated that this Margreta married Johannes Ruppel, 19 August 1738, and probably remained in Germany. I believe this mistake can now be put to rest.

I submit for your comments my conclusion that Margaret Price, the wife of Johan Michael Preisch (Price) of Montgomery County, Virginia, was Margaretha Killian, born 1721, in the Rheinisch Pfalz, Germany, daughter of Andreas Killian (wife's name unknown) who emigrated via Philadelphia 23 September 1732. We know that he and his family remained for sometime in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, but by 1747 he had moved South through the Shenandoah Valley into North Carolina. We also know that Johan Philip Harless and his wife, Anna Margaretha (Preisch) Harless settled at least for a short time in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, because we have found the Christening date of their first child, Martin, in Lutheran Church records of the City of Lancaster, Pennsylvania.

I have tried to locate a marriage of Michael Preisch to Margaretha Killian in Pennsylvania records but the search is not complete. Perhaps it is recorded under a "B" rather than a "P", as is noted in the Family Register of Offenbach. Hopefully further proof will eventually be found, but I am attaching for your information a copy of the will of Andreas Killian who indicates his daughter, Margaretha, married a Michael Price, and both the family histories available on the Killian Family indicate nothing further was known of the whereabouts of Margaret Killian. I did some research in North Carolina records years ago, but found nothing there on Margaret who married Michael Price. I have been in touch with George W. Killian who authored the book ANDREAS KILLIAN 1702-1788 HIS ANCESTORS AND DESCENDANTS published in 1969. He replied to me "What a very special thrill to hear from you and learn something of our Margaret who married Michael Price. One of the reasons I did the work on the book was in the hopes that just something like that would happen." While the Killian book does give possibility of German ancestry of the Killian family, it does not document actual proof. There are Killians in the same area as the Preisch ancestry -- in Landau Lutheran Church records as early as 1615, and there is a Lutheran Church pastor by the name of Johan Conrad Kilian in the early 1700's (I believe the parish was Billigheim but I need to recheck to make sure on this.) Perhaps further research in records of

this area in Germany will give us documentation of the marriage of Andreas Killian and his first wife, as well as the birth or christening date for the children who were born to them while still in Germany.

Daniel Preisch's will was probated in Orange County, Virginia, shortly after 1800 -- I am unable to locate the exact date in my notes. His wife was Anna Catharina, and I hesitate to suggest that she may have been the Anna Catharina Herlas, sister of Philipp Herlas, of Muhlhofen, without further proof. Please do not accept this as fact that she was Anna Catharina Herlas, but some years ago I found a notation that there is a Preisch-Harless genealogy (Descendants of Daniel Preisch) on file at the St. Louis Public Library -- perhaps someone in that vicinity could check for such a genealogy and help clarify this problem.

NOTE: Due to limited space (and difficulty in reproducing) only the English Translation of the German records will be shown here.

Taken from the marriage register of Offenbach (Landau), Rheinland Pfalz, Germany - Catholic Church - 27 June 1713 was performed by the minister "was married before me David Preisch and Agnes Hoffmann and they were both Catholic." (G. S. #367,641)

The index to the Baptismal Register and the only record that shows the maiden name of the wife of Joannes Henricus Preisch to be "Becker"

Note: Joannes Jacob, born 1682, not included in this index to the Baptismal Register -- he was born before 1685 when the register was started, but his year of birth is given in the Familienregister. (#367,638.)

Augustin; Parents: David Preisch and Agnes, his legal wife, born Hoffmann; Godparents: not translated; Date: 31 May 1722.

Daniel, Child; Parents - David Preisch and Agnes, his legal wife, born Hoffmann (name is spelled Preusch in this instance.) (This is the Baptismal record of the second Daniel.)

Baptismal record for Henricus (Heinrich) Preisch; date 8 Sept 1726. Parents - David Preisch and his legal wife, Agnes, born Hoffmann, resides here.....

Following from ANDREAS KILLIAN 1702-1788 -- His Ancestors & Descendants by George W. Killian, published 1969.

WILL OF PIONEER: ANDREAS KILLIAN; written 22 Sept 1785, probated 1788.

In the name of God I Andrew Killian of the County of Lincoln in the State of North Carolina, being sick of body but of sound and disposing memory, do make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth (to wit)

After all my lawful debts are paid, which I allow to be paid out of the debts now due to me; I give to Mary my beloved wife the sole and proper use of the house in which I now live with the benefit of a garden one half acre of the tendable land, firewood, etc. Enduring her natural life together with the gray mare and colt and her choice of any of my milk cows with her calf and wintering for the same on my plantation yearly as long as she lives, and also twelve bushels of wheat, seventy bushels of Indian corn, and two hundred weight of hog meat to be paid her annually by my sons Daniel Killian and Samuel Killian jointly as long as she lives, or otherwise enduring her widowhood, likewise her bed and furniture, spinning wheel, and such part of my pewter and dressar furniture as she may desire, and such other part of my household furniture as she may reasonably need for housekeeping, these things to be for her only proper use and behoof forever.

I give to my son-in-law Michael Price the husband of my daughter Margaret one shilling sterling.

I give to my son Leonard Killian one shilling sterling.

I give to my son John Killian one shilling sterling.

I give to my son-in-law William Lewin husband of my daughter Jean one shilling sterling.

I give to my daughter Crate Hager one shilling sterling.

I given to my son Andrew Killian one shilling sterling.

I give to my son George Killian one shilling sterling.

I give to my son-in-law James Prithet (sic in the copy from which this is copied; but the name is usually understood to be Pritchett) husband of my daughter Brina one shilling sterling.

I give to my son Daniel Killian one half of all my land in fair division, quantity and quality considered together with one seventh part of all the profits arising from the sale or division of my unbequeathed moveable estate and outstanding debts, whom I also appoint one of my Executors of this my last Will and Testament.

I give to my son Samuel Killian the one half of all my lands in fair division with his brother Daniel Killian together with one seventh part of my unbequeathed personal estate whom I likewise appoint one of my Executors of

this my last Will and Testament.

I give to my son-in-law John Barringer husband of my daughter Christina (Catrina) one seventh part of my unbequeathed personal estate.

I give to my son-in-law Michael Houk husband of my daughter Elisabeth one seventh part of my unbequeathed estate and outstanding debts.

I give to my grandson Andrew Killian son of my son Andrew Killian one fourteenth part of my unbequeathed personal estate.

I give to my grandson Daniel Killian son of my son Andrew Killian one fourteenth part of my unbequeathed personal estate.

I likewise give to my son George Killian one seventh of my unbequeathed personal estate.

I likewise give to my son-in-law James Pritchett one seventh part of my personal estate not heretofore bequeathed, etc.

Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament, in testimony of which I have unto set my hand and seal in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty-five on the twenty-second day of September in the ninth year of the American Independance.

The association would cease as soon as they had entered. The theaters finally abandoned the sham and provided a supervised "children's section". Cletus' theory here is most interesting. It might account for no list showing the arrival of Andreas' wife and daughter Elizabeth. That is, they might have come later and been "attached" as wife and daughter to some friend who was making the trip.) Doubtless many of the young people among the early immigrants practiced a like dodge to avoid certain otherwise very unpleasant experiences at the port of entry. Several of the learned articles in the Proceedings of the Pennsylvania German Society suggest that such "dodges" were fairly common to escape the cruel indenture system then in vogue. I cannot find any indentured Killian, nor were any of them redemptioners. This clearly indicates that all of them were, comparatively, wealthy. Many of them seem to have been fairly expert in avoiding taxes, yet when they were assessed their taxes, as a rule, were considerably above the average of the local inhabitants.

H7 2. On page 5 (para 34) you mention the "Salem Church", I strongly suspect that this church was formerly known as the "Old Dutch Meeting House" which was located about eleven miles east of Lincolnton on the old highway. The deed to this property is said to have been given by Adam Cloninger to the "German Congregation of Killian's Settlement." It is my impression that I have seen a historical entry in some Colonial Record that this church was organized at about the time that the Killians moved into North Carolina; however, I made no note of it. This isolated fact may enable you to more accurately locate the first Killians in North Carolina. One might suspect from this that the Andrew (Andreas.....) Killian family was quite religious, or any rate very strict church attendants. The reverse, however, would seem to be the case. I have found no record of either baptisms or confirmations of any of Andreas Killian's extensive family in any church in Pennsylvania. Unfortunately there are still a number of the records of the early churches to be published.

H8 3. On page 3 (para 11) there is a mere mention of Margaret Killian and her marriage to Michael Price, even the date of the marriage is not given. It seems very likely that Andreas Killian did not get to North Carolina until some time in the forties. This would make Margaret more than 20 years of age. Is it not likely that Andreas lived for a time in the Shenandoah Valley? Many of the Pennsylvania emigrants from Pennsylvania to North Carolina did that. A similar situation existed when the Killians migrated beyond the Alleghenies. Many of them stopped for a time in Tennessee, Kentucky, Ohio, and Illinois before making permanent homes in Arkansas, Missouri, Iowa, etc. If Andreas lived for a time in Virginia, or Maryland, then is it not likely that Margaret met her husband there and stayed while the family, as a whole, moved onward?

BOOK REVIEWS

INDIANA SOURCE BOOK I. Searching for ancestors in Indiana? You must not miss The Indiana Source Book I, genealogical material from the Hoosier Genealogist, 1961-1966. Records include Bible, cemetery, family, intestates, marriages, school census, tract books, voters lists and wills.

County records are from the following counties: Allen, Blackford, Cass, Clinton, Daviess, Delaware, Elkhart, Floyd, Fulton, Greene, Harrison, Hendricks, Henry, Jasper, Kosciusko, LaGrange, LaPorte, Lawrence, Madison, Morgan, Marion, Marshall, Miami, Montgomery, Noble, Orange, Posey, Putnam, Rush, Scott, Shelby, Steuben, Tippecanoe, Vigo, Warren, Washington, Wells, and Whitley.

Family records in the following names are found: Bland, Buchanan, Collett, Dixon, Ellis, Gates, Hass, Hopkins, James, Jordan, Justice, McCammon, Morrison, Nearon, Patterson, Prather, Sites, Smith, Stapp, Straugh, Ward and Wright.

REYNOLDS AND McGUIRE ANCESTORS by William W. Reynolds. The ancestors of the Reynolds and McGuire families, according to this study, were primarily English, Irish or Scotch-Irish and German. They first settled in Virginia and Pennsylvania. The Reynolds began with Thomas Reynolds between 1635-45 as listed in early passenger lists, settling first in York County, Virginia. The name appeared in Louisa, Hanover, and Fluvanna Counties of Virginia. They moved slowly westward, going as far west as Wythe and Tazewell Counties.

The McGuire name was found in many colonial Pennsylvania records. The first McGuire record located in Virginia was west of the Blue Ridge Mountains in Augusta County in 1754. This was John McGuire. In 1770-1773, James, Laurence, Cornelius and William McGuire appeared on the tax lists in Botetourt County, and later in Montgomery County. Peter Gost of this line built a two-story stone house on Burkes Garden Creek in 1812 in Tazewell County. The house was still standing and in good condition in 1976.

The Reynolds-McGuire ancestors included the names of Brown, Clyce, Davis, Driscoll, Foster, Garland, Gillock, Gose, Karnes, Kennon, Kinser, Lewis, McGuire, Moorman, Morris, Old, Owen, Preston, Reynolds, Thomason, Turner, Wade, Whisman, and many others.

Family ancestor charts are included, and migration paths are shown on Virginia maps. The sources of information are well documented. The book has a paper cover, illustrations, and has 95 pages.

DESCENDANTS OF DOSWELL ROGERS by Eleanor Rogers Edmondson. "Good reader, blame not the wrytter for that that is myssing in this booke is not his fault. What he hath founde -- as nere as possybell he could he hath set down." (From a 1582 English Parish Register.)

Doswell Rogers I, the earliest known ancestor, is first located in public tax records in Pittsylvania County, Virginia. He and his son William lived in southwestern Virginia, counties of Botetourt, Fincastle, Montgomery, Russell

and Lee, and were Patriots of the American Revolution. The will of William Rogers was proved in White County, Tennessee, in January, 1822, and names his sixteen children. Hawkins County, Tennessee, is said to be the death place of old Doswell Rogers I.

From early records of Virginia and Tennessee to the present, birth dates, places of birth, marriages and families of descendants of Doswell Rogers are recorded. Over 4,000 names are included in this publication. Allied families include Brown, Connor, Darr, Deakins, Hatfield, Hicks, Hill, Howell, Kell, Lusk, Martin, Maxwell, Moore, Sitton, Thurman, Vandergrift and Worley. Many of the early families lived in Hickory Valley of White County, in the Sequatchie Valley north of Chattanooga, and in northwestern Georgia, from where they migrated across the United States.

The book has 213 pages, a hard cover, an appendix, illustrations, Library of Congress cataloging, bibliography and is completely indexed. It may be ordered from Mrs. Eleanor Rogers Edmondson, 2803 Byron Avenue, Odessa, Texas 79762. The price is \$18.00.

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BOHON

I am writing in regards to MARRIAGE BONDS & MINISTER RETURNS OF ROANOKE CO, VA. 1838-1852 copied by Marvin U Neighbors. The record of BOHON, James & Sarah Frances Owens md 30 June 1853 by Wm L Hatcher has a note at the bottom of this page (36) that gives the name as John C Bohon. This John C Bohon is not correct. This is my ancestor and I have several records, besides my grandmother also told me, that his name was James Clark Bohon. I might also mention that this surname is found in the Roanoke and Botetourt County records spelled Bowhan, Baughan, Baughan, Broughon, Baughon, Beaughon, Bohorne, Bohan, Burhon. This is a good example of the variation of spelling of a surname in the early records.

In 1655 (1658?) a patent for 250 acres was given to James Boughan for the transportation of five persons. He had four sons: James, John, Henry and Alexander. This land was in Rappahannock County, Va. Further research is needed to prove that he was the ancestor of the Bohon family of Botetourt and Roanoke Counties, Va.= Barbara Thorn, 1607 Orchard Hts. Rd NW, Salem, OR 97304

- o Fulwider - Augusta and Rockbridge Counties. Abram was a POW Civil War. Carpenter and wheelwright. Later was custodian of Bell Heath Academy. Buried in old cemetery in Radford.
- o Hall - Asa was a Revolutionary soldier out of Dutchess County, New York. came to the New River area in 1790.
- o Howard - John Wesley Boteler of Childress, Virginia
- o Pate - Originally Gloucester then Botetourt and Montgomery Counties, Va.
- o Simpkins - A Revolutionary War soldier.

HINTS ON PEDIGREE CHART

#1 is the person that the chart begins with.

Even numbers are always male.

Odd numbers are always female and a new surname on the chart.

The number for ancestor doubles. The main line on the chart is #1 - his father #2 - grandfather #4 - great grandfather #8 - great great grandfather #16 - etc. The mother is #3 - grandfather if #6 - great grandfather is 12 - etc.

If Jane Doe md John Jones, do not record her name as Jane Doe Jones on #3. That would mean that she had married a Jones before she married John Jones.

If you are not sure of the date, place or name put a question mark beside the information. Family tradition is not always right.

Errors will be made, but, please, do not put the wrong information down on purpose. I have known people to do that.

We are enclosing this chart so that you may tear it out and use as a guide -- or copy it.

3. Deadline for submitting material is the first of the month previous to the month of publication.
4. Material contributed will not be returned unless accompanied by a stamped self-addressed envelope.
5. We welcome all family histories (may have to be edited due to space), copies of court records, Bible records, etc. That little bit of information you have may be of help to someone. Of course, we cannot promise next issue publication.

QUERIES

1. Unless queries are to be used as fillers, submit them one at a time. Since this is a quarterly, queries not used when originally submitted may become dated and of no value to the writer.
2. All material should be sent to Mr. J V Avery Jr, PO Box 2154, Roanoke, Virginia 24009.
3. Be sure your query makes sense. Don't abbreviate (we will) or over simplify. If longer than 50 words, we will edit.
4. If, at all possible, include your membership number with the query.
