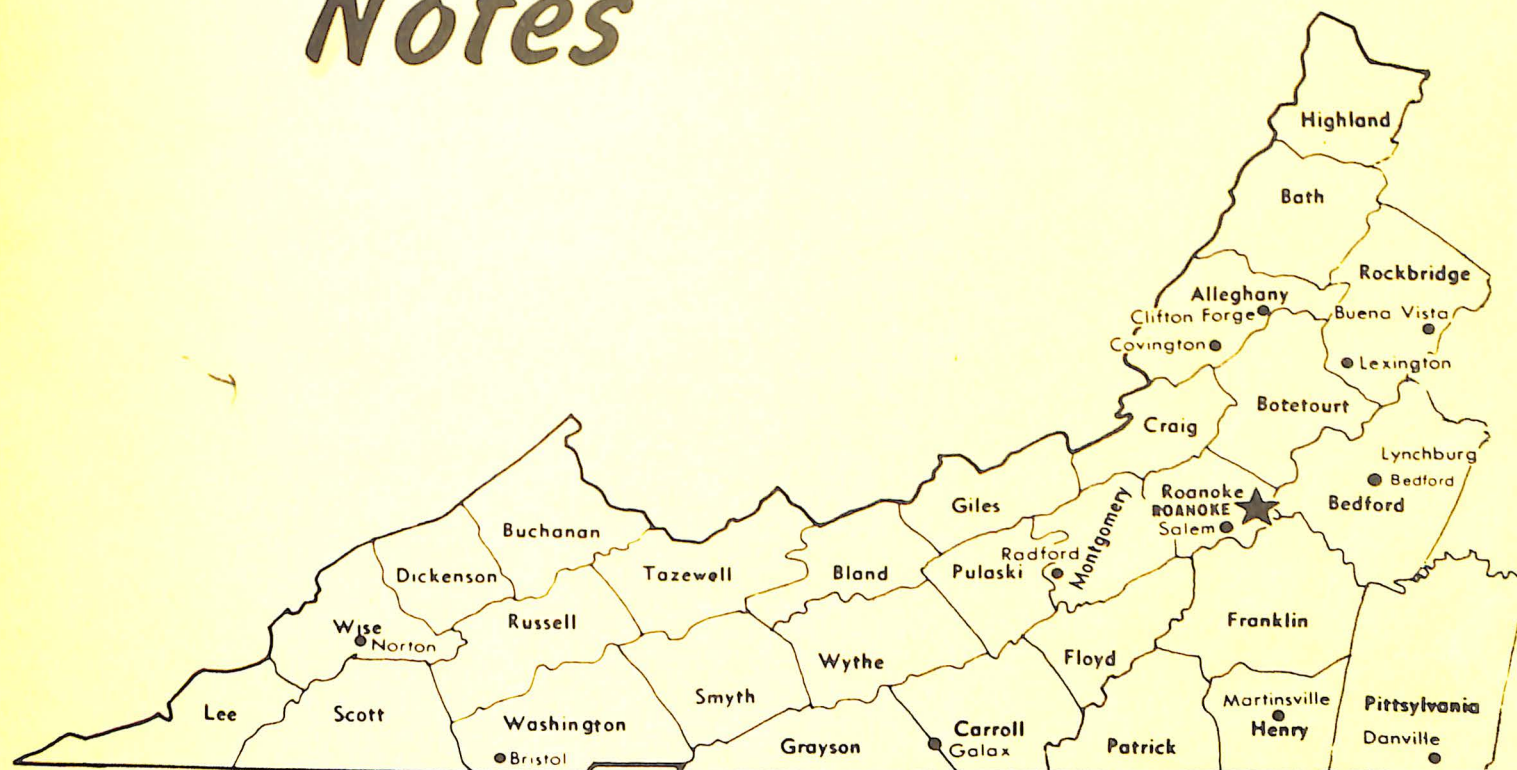

COMMENTS ON THE OCTOBER MEETING

On Saturday, Oct 27, the SVGS went to Lexington, Va, for their monthly meeting. Those of us who went had a wonderful time and wishing we had more time there. Everyone was to be there by 10am (three of us were so busy talking we missed the first exit and arrived a few minutes late) to start a mini walking tour of Lexington. We met at the Visitors Center and met our guide, Mrs Sandy Patterson from the Visitors Center. Our first stop was the Rockbridge Historical Society (long walk, right next door), where we met Dr/Prof. Charles Turner, a member of the Society and professor at Washington and Lee University. For me the most interesting room was upstairs -- the room with the old newspapers, rare books and genealogies of the area. Then a walk to the W&L new Library, The Rare Book room is opened to the public 9-5 Mon-Fri. Prof. Turner left us and Mrs Patterson led us to the Gen. George Marshall Library and pointed out the VMI Library (for the genealogical material there). We visited Lee's Chapel -- then Lunch. After lunch we spent about an hour and half at the Rockbridge Co. Court House -- being small many of the old records not needed everyday are stored in the basement but is available upon request. All the records upstairs were put to use -- some were even copied. DIARY OF JESSE GREEN KARR

1861 - Battle of Carnifex Ferry (?)

(Note: this was typed from a zerox copy of the original. Parts was very faint and the handwriting at times not too easy to read)

rain and without tents.

Sunday 8th Spent the day in reading & writing rained one st of the evening Joe McClaryhity & others left the company & started to Wise,

Monday 9th Coffee Broyles & Hambrick Started back home and the two Reg left

Tuesday 10th got orders to go on to Floyd. drilled some

Wednesday 11th Started for Floyd left Williams & Calfee with measles at Lewisburg. Came to toz (or top?) --- com with us

Thursday 12th Went to Camp Tyre. overtook NC Reg

Friday 13 get orders Floyd was retreating turned back came a few men & got orders to go back a few stayed all night with Floyds 57th Reg. Col Whorton to top big Swell. found som men in Grayson Company got very well acquainted with Clarks, cooper pool Hale & Pat (or Passt?) Dickey vey? Clever fellow found some more Company 5 men I know.

Sunday 15th went to Col. Anderson Reg Saw Capt Dormanes men in the evning Rev Mcmohan chaplain of the St^{or} Reg preached presbyterianism on a big rock

Monday 16th Went in the morning to Capt Dormans Company Some of our men working on breast ?srcier? (or wecier?) down on North Side in the evning visisted Col Heaths Reg found Some com men I knew Bro. Cooper from Wise County & Fisher from Wythe. had prayer meetting most all got layed down orders came to retreat to Meadow Bluff Started about 10 o'clock rained very hard after we started road very muddy got some 6 miles before daylight. Wesco Sey com did not go to Meadow Bluff

Tuesday 17th in the evning met with our Co^{rt} with our tents ?Tloy (or Troy, Thop) Saiks cartazd? Bosus Jr

Wednesday 18th took the vote of the Company to go to Wise or Stay with Floyd vote & all but 14 to go to wise. Started came to top littel

Thursday 19th come on got our arms (or army) report & the Enemy in four miles Floyd ordered Wise to retreat but would not tho it our company Sent up on a high point of the spur of the mountains pushed up the wagons

Friday 20th nothing doing but rubing up our old guns Wrote letter in the evning.

Sat 21st Still came (or caml) Spent day in Reading & Writing.

Sunday 22d wrote a letter & reading my Bible forepart day evning visited Capt Dormons company Gen Lee came in and rode throu the camps. at night Bro Robison orderly in Ryans Com preached

Mon 23d Drilld in fore part day about 12 or 2 o'clock the Yankeys advanced to the top of the mountain pitched there tents our calvary fired on them thought they killed 20 or 25 of them got one man killed 2 wounded. our Company Sent scours? on a north hill for picket.

Tuesday 24th our Artelry throwd some Bombs over on them Some picket fightin to day killed seven of there men our com Still on Picket

Wednesday 25 Staied on the North of the hill Feldgers men got up to day fighting expecting every hour

Thursday 26th orders for our company to leave the North of the hill and go to the breast work commenced raining the nt Wise left for Richmond night. rained all night.

Friday 27 rained all day our tents all sent off to Meadow Bluff. Men all chilld ?sifen?

Sat 28 Still raining Johnston & Jones came to us first letter from home

received by them straight got our tents went to Sleep about 9 oclock got orders to go on picket our whole company staid all night very cold like to froze

Sun 29th ?very prety ne_w? morning our tents sent down to ?_mantus? expecting a battle detached to guard our tent & Spent part of the time writing & reading; in the*ening our Col Spalding got killed by the Yankey Pickets. He was drinking & rode up them his corps (*written between lines "mustered in to serve") started on to Richmond. (*evning)

Monday 30th nothing doing towards fighting Still with our tents at ?Smains (or Smiaus)

Tuesday Oct 1st Wm Saundoy? (or Saundos) & Franklin Whiteker or Bros got a dischargh? to go home to ?ddd?* out in a hurry, musterd into service today or dated from this date (*day?)

Wednesday 2d (faded) Gen Soursing got in with all his Brigade about 5 or 6 Thousand. Said to be 15000 Strong Saw H Bane & Sam Shanon

Thursday 3d called expecting an attack in the morning. Yankeys still on Top of the mountain. Col Savage of the Tenn. Reg. has our command for the present

Friday 4th built our breast works more substantial expecting fighting every hour

Saturday 5th Several of our boys sick ____gt Emmons unable for duty Capt appointed me in his place. Some of the newer militia came from Meadow Bluff to see us Visited some of Gen (or Sen) Floyds men

Sunday 6th ?rain? to*\$trible? tents expecing a Battle at day light found the yankeys had retreated back to dogwood gap left a good many cook vessels provissions (*?struck?)

Sat 5 houses & wagons & c____? ma_k up two Reg. to pick up the things at 11 oclock Chaplains in 1st Reg. preached & distributed some Testaments & tracts

Monday 7th every think still every man wondering what was going to be done

Tuesday 8 Floyds command building a boat to cross New River. The militia discharged to go home

Wednesday 9th some of Floyds men started to wards (or warde?)

Thursday 10th our Syior doing nothing but nem (?men) on the mountains

Friday 11th Still remain at the same place

Sat 12th doing nothing but cooking and eating

Sun 13th No preaching. reading the Bill

Mon 14th laying about doing nothing

Wed 16th occupying some tralls

Thurs 17th some boys sent to hospital

Friday 18th preparations to go to Meadow bluff

Sat 19th Struck tents to leave but did not get off on the account of Bagage

Sun 20th Struck tents but did not start until night came to Fraziers 4 miles

Monday 21st came to Meadow Bluff after night Remained there for a month and a half our Regiment built Cabbins our com got them pretty near ready to go into

Nov 15 Col Starh came in took possession of the Regiment

Sun 17th nov. the Regiment started for camp Starke Korrt? Hambrick left house to go home (Coperal in Swank? left also sgt? Reirie, not sorrow) come Sunday to camp Arbuckle

Mononday 18th got to camp Stake $\frac{1}{2}$ mile above Greenbrier Bridge Stayed there two weeks,

Sunday Dec 1st moved up above the Bridge $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles on the union Road Stayed there 4 days went to cuting house logs for cabbins

Wednesday 4th got orders to take up a march to Salem or BonSacks Depot.

Thursday 5th December Started came 10 miles on dry creek near the big tunnel

Friday 6th came 14 miles to the Sweet Springs over the threw mountains

Saturday 7th came 7 miles to Potses creek. before night in Aligainy County,

Sunday 8th came to New castle 18 miles

Monday 9th came 14 miles to Catawby near old

PETTIT - THOMAS BIBLE

This Bible was first owned by William Abner Pettit, whose last home was the Evans house (now gone), which stood beside the Evans Spring, now in northwest Roanoke City. It is a small Bible, with a very limited space for family information. From Pettit it passed into the hands of his daughter, Mrs. G. S. Thomas; and from her to her daughter-in-law, Mrs C. B. Thomas, and is now held by Miss Lucinda Thomas of Bedford, Va.

In later years, after the regular space was filled, other family information was entered in various places, making it difficult to tell relationships. For this reason, these later entries are not included here, except this one, "Great Grandpa Wm. Abner Pettit married 3 times." This is the only place we see his middle name.

The dates of his last marriages are not given in the Bible. His second was on 24 Feb 1834, recorded in Botetourt County, and his third on 15 Mar 1842 in Roanoke County, Va.

NOTATION: An asterisk indicates that more details about the individual concerned are given in the listing of the following generation. The numeral system used here allows an individual's descent from BFTC to be traced by means of the number assigned to him. Thus Heather Kelly Reyburn (41221), a fifth generation descendant, is the daughter of (4122), John Alexander Reyburn, a fourth generation descendant, who in turn is the son of (412), Agnes Fitzhugh (Sneed) Reyburn, the daughter of (41), Ellen Catlett (Fitzhugh) Sneed, the daughter of (4) Louise Roberta (Conway) Fitzhugh, the fourth child of BFTC. Adam Walker Sr. was born in October 1729 possibly in Pennsylvania. On 19 May 1767 he married Agnes Davis (July 1749-18 Sept 1808). Adam died 30 Sept 1812. They had children: James b. 7 April 1768; Walter b. 3 Oct 1770 m. Grizel Buchanan 20 April 1797 d. 26 Jan 1857; Adam Jr. b. 12 Feb 1773 m. Polly Doak 11 Mar 1813 d. 27 April 1835; Penny b. 27 Feb 1775 m. James G. Long 3 Mar 1803; Mary b. 5 Feb 1777 m. John Montgomery 1 Sept 1808; Nancy b. 13 June 1779 m. William Finley 7 March 1799; Martha b. 18 Sept 1781 m. Alexander Buchanan 10 Feb 1803; Rachel b. 12 Feb 1783 m. Audlai Campbell 12 June 1806; and John Martin b. 8 June 1787.

Adam Walker Jr. was born 12 Feb 1773. On 11 March 1813 he married Polly Mary Doak (26 Oct 1779-28 July 1842) in Virginia. She was the daughter of David Doak and Jenny Alexander. Adam Jr. died in Missouri 27 April 1835. They had five children: Walter Montgomery Walker b. 23 July 1814, Wytheville VA, m. Jane Mackey 6 July 1843, d. 4 May 1896 in Zena Oregon; David Doak Walker b. 25 June 1816 in Wythe Co Va., d. 27 Nov 1835; Claiborne Campbell Walker b. 1 Mar 1819, Wythe Co, m. Louise Purvine 4 July 1850, d. 30 Dec 1902 Zena Oregon; Nancy Hannah Walker b. 22 July 1821 Wythe Co, m. John C. Henry, d. 29 Aug 1839; and Wellington Boliver Walker b. 17 Mar 1824 Wythe Co, m. Catherine Josephine Purvine 20 Sept 1849, and d. 16 Feb 1904 in Zena.

A copy of the family bible gives the information concerning the dates of birth, marriage, and names of spouses. However it does not show the places of each event. Some of the dates have been verified through the microfilms at the State Library in Richmond.

The first Buckingham is John, transported to Maryland in 1669. Some of his family migrated to Virginia, Pennsylvania and westward. His great grandson, Reverend Richard Buckingham (b 1782-d 1863) joined the Baltimore Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church in 1814 and was assigned churches in Botetourt, Montgomery and Pulaski Counties. He married Rachel Switzer, whose grandfather was Henry of Botetourt County. Their offspring married with the following southwestern Virginia families: Akers, Cecil, Chenoweth, Crandall, Conevey, Dudley, Fulwider, Hall, Howard, Pate and Simpkins. These settlers were found in the Counties of Augusta, Botetourt, Frederick, Montgomery and Rockbridge. Towns named were Childress, Radford and Snowville, Virginia.

The Earl family migrated from Ireland to New York and married with the families of Buckingham, Hox (Hax), Morse (Maus) and Feitner. The book is beautifully written with personal documents and photographs from the past to the present. Although Hillman is an ancient English name, this record definitely begins with the marriage of William Hillman and Margaret Burton in 1792 and traces this branch of the family down to the present time.

Chapters on the families of Abel Carrico, John D Edwards, Samuel Newberry, Richard Wells and Samuel Stallard are included.

The book is well documented and indexed and contains many interesting illustrations. Brief discussions of the history of surnames, coat-of-arms, ancestral charts and bibliographies are included.

While most of the work pertains to Southwest Virginia, the Hillmans and their related families came from the British Isles via Maryland, Massachusetts and Virginia and some of these records are included.

If you are researching the name Hillman, Marshall, Holbrook, Lawson, Osbourne, Sutherland, Carrico, Edwards, Newberry, Wells, Hutchenson, or Stallard, you might find this book helpful as well as quite interesting.

The book is hard back with an illustrated dust jacket and contains 161 pages.

The author states in his preface that KEITH KINFOLKS has three primary purposes. First: to honor his Keith ancestors by gathering, preserving and perpetuating in book form the knowledge acquired on James Keith Sr. and his descendants. Second: to make the knowledge available to interested parties now living and those to come in future generations. Third: to furnish Keith descendants a means of tracing and learning their ancestors, knowing their kinfolds and establishing their relation to each other.

This has been so well done by the author for the descendants of James Keith Sr. who lived in several areas; including Botetourt, Bedford, and other Virginia counties before finally settling near present day Willis in Montgomery (now Floyd) County just before the Revolutionary War. Eleven generations of his descendants are included with 16,500 names indexed. The information is contained in 2715 biographies arranged by generations, and, in as far as possible, birthdates in the generation.

Many descendants are living in Roanoke and surrounding counties. Calvin Lee Weddle of Roanoke, and a member of the Southwestern Virginia Genealogical Society is a descendant of James Keith Sr. and the author states that he contributed a great deal of information, time and other resources during this research.

There are 182 photographs (showing 685) individuals. These were selected from 1000 photographs that were loaned. Over 4000 family history questionnaires were sent to complete on their families, and about 3000 individual letters were written seeking help. Mr. King has been a master at arranging all his research in an easily understood system that is explained at the beginning of the book.

The book has 363 pages, well documented, and Library of Congress cataloging. A gift copy from the author has been presented to the Southwestern Virginia Genealogical Society and has been placed in the Virginia Room of the main Roanoke City Public Library.

The forebears of Joseph Junkin I had emigrated from their home near Inverness, Scotland into Ireland sometime before 1688 during the Stuart's persecution. "They were Covenanters (Reformed Presbyterians) and were a strongly Calvinistic group where members sang, or chanted, only the Psalms in worship, and prohibited using instrumental music in their worship....."

Joseph Junkin I (1715-1777), born in Monahan County, Antrim, Ulster, Ireland, immigrated to this country in 1735-56. He married in 1743, at Peach Bottom, York County, Pennsylvania, Elizabeth Wallace (1714-1796), who was the daughter of John and Martha Hays Wallace. The Wallaces had settled in York County upon their arrival from County Tyrone, Ireland. Joseph and Elizabeth soon settled in Kingston, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania, where he had acquired 500 acres of land. Joseph had completed a stone house prior to 1747 (still inhabited in 1969). "Here it was that Squire Junkin and his beloved Elizabeth settled to raise their family and it was here they died.....both buried in Silver Springs Church Yard." Their children's names by Joseph's will probated in 1784, Cumberland County, Carlisle, Pennsylvania, were William, Mary, Joseph II, George, Agnes, John, Benjamin and Elizabeth.

A STORY OF THE JUNKINS includes some descendants of seven generations covering ancestry of 240 years whose families are scattered throughout the United States. Some Virginia places with descendants are Christiansburg, Lexington, Roanoke, Staunton, and Tazewell. Family names included are Agnew, Arnold, Brown, Chapman, Cockran, Crain, Crouch, Culbertson, Cuthbertson, Davidson, Donaldson, Evans, Findley, Fishburn, Galloway, Garland, Gibson, Hunter, Jackson, Junkin, McKee, Miles, Miller, Minor, Moorman, Peery, Preston, Robinson, Satterfield, Sinclair, Wade and others.

The book has a paper cover, 92 pages, and a bibliography. 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VIRGINIA APPALACHIAN NOTES

CORRECTION

Received the following from W R Chitwood, MD : ...on page 119 of the last issue (Aug 1979), under the heading "Know Your Illness", there are several things that I believe should be corrected. Quinsy was not tonsillitis. This term was used in earlier days and is still used today and refers to a condition known as a peritonsillar abscess - that is, an abscess situated around, under or near a tonsil. Tonsillitis is an infection in the tonsil. There is a great deal of difference in the two conditions, for the earlier days quinsy could be cured by lancing the abscess, whereas, there was no specific treatment for tonsillitis of any value.

Putrid sore throat could also refer to what we call today "strept" or septic sore throat. Membranous croup was a synonym for diphtheria..... In early days, diagnosis was very difficult and many things were lumped together and called croup.

(I am very sorry that I have not written and thanked you for the above -- not exactly sure where I got my information -- several sources -- one seems to have been a book written (county history) a little after 1900.)

On ordering books, please remember that postage has increased so that the prices of books from a year ago will be higher.

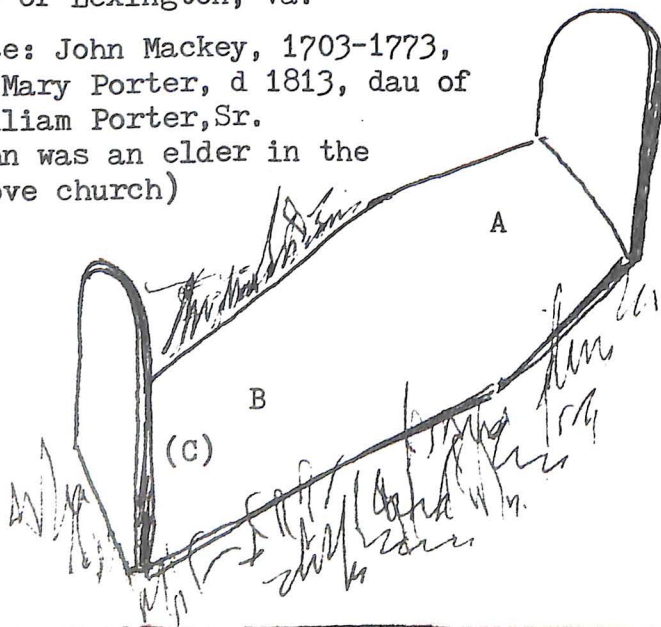

2. Give source of material. Original documents - where found, type, number of book and page No. We cannot print material from printed source unless we have permission from the author.
3. Deadline for submitting material is the first of the month previous to the month of publication.
4. Material contributed will not be returned unless accompanied by a stamped self-addressed envelope.
5. We welcome all family histories (may have to be edited due to space), copies of court records, Bible records, etc. That little bit of information you have may be of help to someone. Of course, we cannot promise next issue publication.

QUERIES

1. Unless queries are to be used as fillers, submit them one at a time. Since this is a quarterly, queries not used when originally submitted may become dated and of no value to the writer.
