This was "A List of the Taxable property within the county of Floyd taken by Joseph Howard commissioner of the revenue for the year 1831.

Floyd County, Virginia, was formed in 1831, from Montgomery and Franklin Counties - this should be a list of most of the people in the county compare this with the 1830 Montgomery and Franklin Counties censuses.

The abbreviation rep's stands for representatives. Chistopher Bower rep's (or representatives) - would usually mean that Bower was deceased and the estate had not been settled.

The 'abbreviation' - Isaac Booth A. son - Isaac Booth is son of A - most likely Abner (the only A. listed in this tax list.

David Howell Miller - name is Daniel Howell and he was a miller.

The original of this document is at the Virginia State Archives, Richmond, Virginia, in the Legislative Petitions. Our copy of this tax list will be given to the Virginia Room, Roanoke Public Library, Roanoke, Virginia, and a copy will be given to the court house at Floyd, Virginia.

ACHILLES WOMACK

. . . a Virginian by birth . . . Jay's great-grandfather, who made the long trek from Virginia to Texas in 1860, with his wife and seven*children. He is buried in a lonely family cemetery "in Fain's pasture," according to a local resident. This is the Blanton Family Cemetery, near Whitewright, Texas, but in Fannin County. The eldest son of Achilles Womack married Maggie Blanton, and evidently Achilles was living with this young family at the time of his death. His grave is inside a very old iron fence, near the entrance to the Cemetery, has a Masonic emblem on the stone, and the following inscription:

A. WOMACK
Dec. 25, 1807
Nov. 30, 1897

Sleep on Twilight, work is done,
Jesus has come and borne thee home.

Family members have stated that a "wagon train of Womacks" came to Texas about the same time, and Jay's Dad (Arthur Virgil Womack) told us an Uncle came along, but we have not verified the names of those who came to Texas in 1860, along with Achilles and family. It is very probable that John Daniel Womack (from Pittsylvania County, Virginia) was one of those who came at that time, since he lived in Lamar County near the same time period. John Daniel Womack was a third cousin of Achilles, as they were both grandsons of William Womack (1710 - 1792) There were also families by the name of Gish, Pearcey and Daniel in Lamar County, Texas circa 1860-1870, and it is possible these families were all related.

Our first record of Achilles Womack in Virginia is his marriage bond on 4 January 1830, to Polly Bowyer.

"Know all men by these presents that we, Achilles Womack & Adam Bowyer are held and firmly bound unto William B. Giles, Esqr. Governor or Chief Magistrate of the Commonwealth of Virginia in the Sum of One Hundred and fifty dollars to which payment well and truly to be made to the said Governor or his successors in Office for the use of the Commonwealth - We bind ourselves and each of us owe & each of our heirs Executors and administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents

*(perhaps eight)

Sealed with our Seals and dated this 4th day of January 1830. The Condition of the above obligation is such, that whereas a marriage is shortly intended to be had and solemnized between the above bound Achilles Womack and Polly Bowyer, now if there shall be no lawful cause to obstruct the said marriage, the above obligation to be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue." Signed by Achilles Womack and Adam Boyer.

Achilles is mentioned in the will of his father, Daniel Womack, probated in Bedford County, Virginia in March of 1830. This will mentions the wife, Nancy, and twelve children (all names given). Evidently final settlement of Daniel's estate did not take place until after the death of Nancy . . . circa 1850. By that time it appears that only eight children were still living as the estate was divided into nine parts . . . and one of those parts was to the heirs of a deceased daughter, Julia Benson Womack Burson.

On the 1830 Census of Bedford County, Virginia the name Achilles W. Womack appears (age between 20 - 30). This is the only instance I have ever seen his name with a middle initial. His wife at that census year was also between the age of 20 and 30. We have never found any further record of Polly Bowyer Womack, and assume she died. Jay remembers his Grandfather stating that his father was married twice . . . "but there warn't no children by the first union."

On 4 January 1840, in Roanoke County, Virginia, Achilles Womack and Anna Carney were married . . . ten years to the day from the date of the marriage bond between Achilles and Polly! This bond was unrecorded in Roanoke County records in 1973 when we visited the courthouse. Kent Womack found the bond in the drawers of "loose" bonds in the courthouse, and I gave it to a clerk in the office and asked that she index it for their records (after securing a photocopy).

Anna Carney was the daughter of Charles Carney and Susannah (Gish) Carney. The Womack family remembers that Charles Carney was not happy about the marriage, and since Achilles was 16 years older than Anna, it is easy to understand his concern. Charles Carney's will was dated 5 July 1853 (with a codicil dated 15 July 1853, and probated in August, 1853 - Roanoke County, Virginia) & stated:

"I have given to my daughter Anna Womack her part that may be coming to her, & to all my children except Anna Womack who have received anything from me the same must be considered as apart of what they are to receive makeing all equal."

On the 1840 census of Roanoke County, Virginia, "Achilles Wamack" was living in the household enumerated immediately following Charles Carney. The one female in Achilles' household was between 15 - 20 years of age, which would be the right age bracket for Anna. These families were also listed in adjacent households in the 1850 census of Roanoke County (See Census Worksheet).

Achilles Womack bought land in Montgomery County, Virginia by 1844 and he is mentioned as being "of Montgomery County" in that first deed. He and Ann sold this first tract of land in 1848; evidently they moved back to Roanoke County, since they were enumerated there in 1850 - however, "Archelaus Womack" was chosen as a Justice of the Peace for District #1 of Montgomery County in 1852, and deeds from 1848 to 1859 in Montgomery and Floyd Counties show them as residents of Montgomery. It is odd that they were enumerated in Roanoke County, and I have no knowledge of when they moved back there, since they seem to have owned land almost continuously in both Floyd and Montgomery Counties.

The Achilles Womack family appears to have left Virginia for Texas after sale of their land in 1859, as they appear in Lamar County, Texas by the time enumeration was made for the 1860 census.

Lamar County, Texas deed, dated 23 October 1860: "Archilles Wamack" bought 313 acres of land in Lamar County from James H. Stephenson & Emily C. Stephenson - "on Kimbells Creek, a tributary of North Sulphur, it being the North half of headright survey of John Kimbell." \$2504
Recorded in Book K - Pages 663-664

This same land was sold in August of 1869 to Vanary McBee, for \$3754 - land "on Kimbals Creek North tributary of North Sulphur, it being the North half of the Head Right of John Kimball about 14 miles S. W. from Paris" Recorded in Book S, Pages 228-229 - deed dated 10 August 1869.

In October of that same year Achilles Womack bought 160 acres in Fannin County, Texas. In deed dated 4 October 1869, Harrison Ford and wife, Louisa, sold to "Achilles Womack of said county" this acreage surveyed in the name of George Damron, "on Bois d'Arc Creek" - Also 154 acres out of W. S. Loyd Survey; also 60 acres out of said Lloyd Survey. Deed Book R - Pages 113-114.

Jay's Dad had mentioned to us that his Grandad Achilles was a "mule trader," and this seems to be borne out by a bill of sale recorded in Deed Book T, Page 402, of Fannin County records, wherein Achilles Womack and D. Browder paid \$1,000 for "twenty eight head of horses mares mules & Colts described as follows. (Viz) Two Black Mares and colts. Two Brown and five Bay Mares and colts. Three 3 years old horse two sorrels & one a Brown, 3 filleys ten Bays one a roan 4 Mules. Yearlings an two years old. being my entire horse property Branded W on the right shoulder" - signed L. C. Walls, May, 1871. Witnesses were J. H. Wamack (John Henton Womack) and T. W. Wamack. Who was this T. W. Wamack?

Many other deed records appear in Fannin County, including two tracts of land "on waters of Bois d'Arc Creek" in 1876 from John M. May & wife, A. J. May, to A. Womack. During most of his adult life Achilles Womack appears to have signed his name merely "A." Womack, and this initial appears on his tombstone.



TREASURE UP THE MEMORY

By James Frederick O'Nan *

"Those who do not treasure up the memory of their ancestors do not deserve to be remembered by posterity."
Edmund Burke

The family O'Nan had its beginning in France. The earliest extant record of the name in this country is contained in a list of French (Huguenots) arriving in King William's Town, Virginia, aboard the Peter and Anthony out of London, England in 1700. From the Virginia Historical Society Collections, Vol. 5, New Series, pages 24 and 27, "is set down the name of JEAN ONAN, his wife and one child."

In Peyton Neal Clarke's book Old King William Homes and Families, there is a biography of one John Onan. The author noted that THIS John Onan "no doubt descended from the French refugee Jean Onan." These Onans moved into Woodford and Union County, Kentucky, where the descendants are now living and spelling the name O'Nan.

Many of the O'Nans are predominantly Roman Catholic. Listed in Vol. II of The American Catholic Historical Society is the oldest Catholic Church register of the original thirteen English Colonies. Under "Baptisms for the year 1743", one finds this entry:

"Onan, Mary of Denis and Rebecca Onan, baptized December 28th in parent's house; sponsor, Ann Blainy."

One Dennie Onan signed in 1776 the Dissenter's Petition (Virginia Historical Magazine - Virginia Legislative Papers, pp. 265-267). "Whatever his religious affiliation, every member of the family can take pride in the fact that one of his ancestors struck a blow for religious freedom."

Denis Onan, born about 1720, married about 1740. He was living in Bucks County, Pennsylvania in 1743, where his daughter Mary was born. There were three sons, Dennis b. 1748, William b. 1753, and James b. 1755. (There may have been a daughter, Rebecca, named for her mother, b. 1750). The family moved back to Virginia and were well established by the year 1776, for that was the year Denis Onan, at the age of 55-56, signed the Dissenter's Petition. The sons, Dennis, William and James and their descendants are chronicled in this book.

Dennis O'nan settled permanently in Shelby County, Kentucky. The name of his wife is unknown. They were the parents of at least one child, John, born in Virginia in 1773.

William O'nan married Mary Ann Carrico b. 1757, daughter of Abel and Elizabeth Simms Carrico. Mary Ann was born in Charles County, Maryland and later moved with her parents to Fairfax County, Virginia. Mary Ann Carrico O'Nan's brothers and sisters were William, Abel, Jr., Nancy, Simeon, Sally,

Peter and Joseph. (Six of these eight children were born in Virginia). They settled in Grayson County, Virginia. Mary Ann's father, Abel Carrico, Sr., died about 1790 while visiting his son William at Galax, Virginia in Grayson County. William and Mary Ann Carrico O'Nan are buried in Henry County, Kentucky in unmarked graves.

James O'Nan married Elizabeth Lincoln of Virginia. Their son John was born in 1790 in Virginia, and emigrated with his parents at an early age to Kentucky; married in Shelby County, Kentucky, August 2, 1813 Rebecca Carrico, the daughter of Basil Carrico, a native of Maryland and a recognized Revolutionary War Patriot. Basil was the son of Peter Carrico and Margaret Gates.

One allied family of the O'Nans was the Robert Looney, Sr., family, who settled in Botetourt County about 1742, southwest of the James River and west of the Blue Ridge at the mouth of a creek near Buchanan, Virginia, now called Looney's Mill Creek.

The book has genealogical notes on the following allied families:

Bowles, Carrico, Cook, Hanley, Lincoln, Looney (Luna), Martin, Mellody, Merryman, Molohon, Monohon, Potts, Robinett and others.

It is well indexed, documented, and has 149 pages. The book represents fifteen (15) years of research by the author. A copy of the book has been given to The Southwestern Virginia Genealogical Society and placed in the Virginia Room of the Roanoke City Public Library.
