

WILLIAM COOPER

(page) To the Honorable Speaker and members of the House of Representatives of Virginia.

The Petition of William Cooper & sundry citizens of Russell county and State of Virginia humbly sheweth, that your petitioner who was a soldier in the Revolutionary war, now is in his 78th years of age, and very feeble and sickly in body & distitue of all the means of comfort and necessaries of life, Save what are contributed by the hands of one or two charitable individuals. Your pretitioner was engaged in a skirmish at Bunker Hill, and there by his own activity & Courage took a prisoner of the enemy and delivered him to Gel Washington. He was also engaged in the Battle of Long Island under the comman of Col'o Hand?. on account of sickeness he was thence discharged & enlisted a substitute; after his recovery your petitioner was enrolled in the malitia under the command of Gen'l Putnam and active as Sergeant Major; he was under the command of Gen'l Ported at the Battle of Brandywine and acted as Adjutant in a skimish near Philadelphia, and at the Battle of German Town, he was also engaged Your petitioner had formerly some property which he gave to his sons on condition they would support him during his life, they by misfortune & bad management became Insolvent, so that they were unable in any manner to contribute the comforts or even the necessaries of life to your petitioner, who is as destitute as possible to be, and has been so far a year or more

(page) In the year 1775 August I entred in to the Revolutionary War. I marched from York Town in Pensylvania under the command of Capt Michal Dawdle belonging to the first Rifle Regiment of Pensylvania, commanded by Co'l Edward Hand. We marched to Cambridge & then we ware attached under the Command of Gen Washington Capt Dawdle's company marched Down to Bunkers Hill neck, were we attacked the British picket yard: We ware caused to Retreat, in the skirmish I was so fortunate as to take a prisoner and deliver him to Washington -- 30 days afterward I foilled? a British major off the british Brestwork In 1776 March, we marched for New York in April --- and from that to Long Island, & on 2nd of August 1776 where said Cooper stood in defense of America, The enemy being to strong we ware compeled to Retreat in to New York under the command of Capt. Henry Miller. then said Cooper was taken sick, and was discharged and sent home.

In the year 1777 I marched to Jarseys under the command of Capt James Mitchell attached to the Regiment commanded by Maj. James Dill an then I acted as Sergent major under Maj Dill & served three months. Co'l James Thompson appointed me as Adjutent and we march from York Town in the year 1777 to Brandywine the Brigade being commanded by General Potter and was in the

battle of Brandywine on the 11th day of September 1777 and also in the Battle of Germantown also acted as Adjutant on the 4th day of Oct 1777

(page) And is indebted for his subsistence for that length of time to the charity of one or two individuals as above state; the prayer therefore of your Petition is that he may be placed on the pension list, and he as in duty bound will ever pray etc

OBITUARY OF COL. ANDREW JOHNSON

Copied from Lewisburg, (W) Va, newspaper from microfilm. Date of 7 Dec. At his late residence at Giles C. H. Va. on Wednesday the 14th inst. Col. Andrew Johnston in the 68th year of his age. He was one of our most distinguished citizens, and through life was characterized by a highminded and gentlemanly deportment, and an unflinching integrity rarely equalled. About two years since he made a profession of religion and attached himself to the Baptist Church, since which time his steady christian demeanor and constant attention to all the duties of religion, has evinced the sincerity of his profession and done honor to the cause he had espoused. His death was preceded by a most distressing illness of near three weeks, during which he gave strong evidence of the efficacy of the christian religion to soothe the bed of affliction, and light up the dark valley and shadow of death. He was not herd to utter a complaint but with truly christian resignation committed himself to the keeping of him who judgeth righteously "he was often heard to say that his only hope and consolation was in the blessed Saviour of sinners, and when scarcely able to articulate his lips were still seen to move and his voice heard to whisper in prayr, thus he passed away from a world of affliction to the bosom of his God. He has left an affectionate family and a numerous circle of relatives and friends to mourn a loss which cannot be easily repaired, as a magistrate, a citizen and a christian, his memory through succeeding years will call up a tribute of melancholy yet pleasing reflection in the minds of all who knew him and were capable of estimating his worth.

Every precaution has been taken to insure the accuracy of this copy of the Marriage Bonds and Minister's Returns on file in the Botetourt County, Virginia, Courthouse. Each document has been carefully examined by several persons familiar with the script of earlier days; both English and German. Where several interpretations are possible, the most plausible one is found herein. In some instances, a second possibility is noted.

It is interesting to know some of the rules governing the early marriages of this state. Before 1780, all marriages were supposed to be performed by a minister of the Church of England, who was to keep a list of them, to be turned over to the Secretary of the Commonwealth. A great many of such lists, if they were kept, were never turned over to the state.

In Botetourt County, where a great majority of the county officials, and even the vestrymen of the Church, were of Scotch-Irish and Presbyterian backgrounds, these Marriage Laws were not rigidly enforced.

There were two methods by which the Minister was authorized to perform the marriage rites; one is generally referred to as "by bond," and the other "by banns" or "by publication." By bond, the groom and his surety would sign

a bond for fifty pounds (later, one hundred and fifty dollars) payable to the King (later, to the Governor), to guarantee that a marriage would take place with the girl, if there were no legal objections. Legal objections were: the refusal of a parent to give consent, if either party was under the age of twenty-one; either party having a living, legal husband or wife, etc. When this bond was presented to the Clerk of Courts, he would sign it, thus giving authority, or license, to the minister to perform the ceremony.

By the other method, the intended marriage was announced at public worship service, for three weeks, and if no objections were heard, the ceremony was performed. A list of these marriages was to be kept by the minister, and a copy sent to the Clerk of Courts, within three months. The fee charged for a marriage by this method, was only one-fourth that for the "bond" method.

Ministers of other denomiations performed marriages, that were considered legal only by members of that denomination, and were not recorded at the Courthouse.

Some denominations considered marriage a sacrement, the same as baptism and the Lord's Supper, and should not be regulated by any other authority than the church, and that there should be no costs, such as fees, involved.

So, we have some of the reasons why the Courthouse records do not show all marriages actually celebrated.

In 1780, the law was changed, allowing ministers of other denominations to qualify to perform ceremonies, and legalizing the marriages performed in these denominations, in the earlier years. This law also, required that the list of marriages performed be sent to the Clerk within three months. This was not always done. The law reads that he who "failing to transmit such a certificate to the clerk of the court in due time, shall forfeit and pay the sum of five hundred pounds, to be recovered with costs of suit by the informer in any court of record." To my knowledge, this was never enforced, so it appears that ministers were allowed to do pretty much as they pleased.

The genealogist wishes there had been more marriages recorded, but he is amazed and thankful that we have as many as we do.

This volume is copied according to the year the marriage was preformed (for VAN it was retyped in alphabetical order - groom's name) and copied as the names were listed -- as we read them -- on the bond in the space listed for the bride and groom, the sureties, and signatures. We found several errors on the bonds but made no attempt to correct any errors. There were several names in which a "l" should have been a "t", "e" for "i" --- in fact just about any letter. I know that just about any name is subject to correction, because on the second go around I've changed my mind. Also noted genealogical material, unusual information, or spelling from the bonds and consents. The one thing that I have found out from my experience at abstracting original records is, if at all possible, to OBTAIN COPIES OF THE ORIGINAL RECORDS because what is copied into the court records or abstracted (such as we are doing) may be entirely different from the original or the data you

need has been left out.

Mrs. Inez E Good, Assistant Professor Roanoke College, Salem, Va., helped us with the translation of some of the German names and consents. Mrs. Good said she is not sure that the translations are correct because of the difficulty in reading the handwriting. She also put down her "translation" of the English signatures -- these were included to show the difficulty in reading the handwriting of that period.

Our abstractions were compared with the Botetourt County marriages included in "Annals of Southwest Virginia 1769-1800" by Lewis Preston Summers (I was told these marriages were copied by a typist and not by Mr. Summers) and "Early Marriages, Wills, and Some Revolutionary War Records, Botetourt County, Virginia" by Anne Lowry Worrell. After each author's name are listed the differences, if any. If no differences, just the name of the author or if the bond was not listed.

We sincerely hope that these abstractions will be of help to those researching the county --- and please forgive us for any error that we may have made.

WHITE GATE, GILES COUNTY, VIRGINIA

by Jerrie Atkin*

A large taste of living abroad has convinced the James Bryans there's nothing like burrowing down in this little Giles County hamlet of some 150 souls.

.. A year ago they bought the old Beauregard Allen home and 250 acres off Virginia 42...... Although the Allen house is only around 85 years old, the site is historic. In cleaning out around fencelines, the Bryans found the wooden sign marking White Gate's first post office in 1842.

Oddly enough, the community, previously called Rye Meadows and Baneville, was dubbed White Gate because the first postmaster, John Bane, had a white gate in front of his house.

The place also bustled a lot more in pre-Civil War years.

Bill Bane, Giles County treasurer and a lifetime resident of White Gate, says it used to be known as an educational hub of the county because it boasted the Old Academy, one of two institutions of higher learning in Giles.

The Old Academy wasn't college caliber or anywhere near it, Bane said. Rather, the primitive log structure was the next rung above the one-room school, kind of equivalent to the current junior high.



VIRGINIA APPALACHIAN NOTES

BY-LAWS

OF

SOUTHWESTERN VIRGINIA GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY

Article I - Name and Purpose

Section 1. The Southwestern Virginia Genealogical Society, hereafter referred to as the "Society" is organized as a non-stock, non-profit organization to encourage, foster, and organize genealogical research, teaching, publishing, education, and recording; and to encourage, foster and organize all other activities related to genealogy.

Section 2. The area covered by this society shall include the twentynine counties of southwestern Virginia, consisting of the following:
Alleghany, Bath, Bedford, Bland, Botetourt, Buchanan, Carroll, Craig,
Dickenson, Floyd, Franklin, Giles, Grayson, Henry, Highland, Lee, Montgomery, Patrick, Pittsylvania, Pulaski, Roanoke, Rockbridge, Russell,
Scott, Smythe, Tazewell, Washington, Wise, and Wythe, as well as any
cities located within this area.

Article II - Membership and dues

Section 1. Membership in the Society shall be open to any person who subscribes to the purposes and principles of the organization as stated in Article 1.

Section 2. Membership in the Society shall be of two classes, active and honorary. Honorary membership may be conferred upon any person by unanimous vote of those present at any regular meeting. Honorary members shall not be required to pay dues and shall not have a vote in the meetings of the Society.

Section 3. Annual dues of \$7.50 for individual membership and \$10.00 for family membership shall be due and payable on January 1 of each calendar year. Members whose dues are not paid by January 31 of each year will not receive the next issue of Virginia Appalachian Notes (VAN). Family memberships shall be furnished only one copy of any newsletter, notices, or other publications. All members will be furnished a list of members of the Society, a copy of the by-laws, and a copy of the VAN to be published quarterly.

Section 4. VAN - Virginia Appalachian Notes, shall be published in February, May, August and November of each year.

Article III - Officers and Their Duties

Section 1. The officers of the Society shall be a president, a first vice-president, a second vice-president, a recording secretary, a corresponding secretary, treasurer, assistant treasurer. With the exception of the first and second vice-presidents, duties of the officers shall be such as their titles imply and as prescribed by the parliamentary authority adopted by the Society. The first vice-president shall serve as program chairman and the second vice-president will be chairman of the membership committee.

Section 2. The officers and the immediate past president shall constitute the Executive Board.

Article IV - Elections

Section 1. All officers shall be elected by ballot at the November meeting

and shall continue in office one year, beginning on January 1, following, or until the next annual election. No officer may be elected to more than two consecutive terms of office.

Section 2. A majority of all votes cast shall be necessary to constitute an election.

Section 3. Vacancies in office shall be filled by special election.

Section 4. The President shall appoint a nominating committee of three members at the October meeting to present a slate of officers to the membership at the November meeting. Nominations for all offices may be made from the floor at the November meeting. Prior consent of all nominees shall have been obtained.

Article V - Meetings

Section 1. Regular meetings of the Society shall be held the third Saturday of each month at 1:30 p.m. in the auditorium of the Roanoke City Main Public Library.

Section 2. Ten members, exclusive of officers, shall constitute a quorum.

Article VI - Committees

In addition to the Nominating Committee provided for in Article IV, the following committees shall be named.

- 1. The Program Committee shall be chaired by the first vice-president who will appoint two others to serve.
- 2. The membership committee shall be chaired by the second vicepresident who will also appoint two others or more to serve.
- 3. The president shall appoint a chairman and committee members for publicity, books, telephone, pedigree charts or others as the occasion arises.

Article VII - Parliamentary Authority

Robert Rules of Order, Revised, shall be the parliamentary authority of the Society except where they are inconsistent with the By-Laws.

Article VIII - Amendments

These By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting by a majority vote of the members present. All proposed changes shall be in writing and shall be distributed to the members at the regular meeting. Voting on the proposed amendments shall take place at the next regular meeting.

Article IX - Honors

At the end of the president's term of office, a book shall be given to the Virginia Rooom of the Roanoke Public Library in honor of that retiring president.

Article X - Dissolution

In the event that the Society shall be dissolved, any assets held by the Society shall accrue to the benefit of the Virginia Room of the Roanoke Public Library if it qualifies as an exempt organization under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law. If they do not qualify under the Internal Revenue Code, then the assets will be disposed of as stated in the Sixth part of the Articles of Organization.

ARTICLES OF ORGANIZATION

Articles of organization of the Southwestern Virginia Genealogical Society.

The undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the United States, desiring to form a Non-Profit Association, do hereby certify.

FIRST: The name of the Association shall be the Southwestern Virginia Genealogical Society.

SECOND: The place in this State where the principal office of the Association is to be located in the home of the president elect of the association.

THIRD: The Association is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes. The purposes for which the association is organized are as follows:

- (a) To encourage, foster and organize genealogical research, teaching, publishing, education and recording.
- (b) To encourage, foster and organized all other activities related to genealogy.

FOURTH: The names and addresses of the persons who are the initial trustees of the association are as follows:

FIFTH: No part of the net earnings of the association shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the association shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article Third hereof. No substantial part of the activities of theassociation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the association shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the association shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by an association exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or (b) by an association, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

SIXTH: Upon the dissolution of the association, the Board of Trustees shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the association, dispose of all of the assets of the association exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding

Material for publication:

- 1. Please type, if possible, on 8½x11" paper, single space, with minimum margins of 1" on all sides and headings patterned on those in this issue. PLEASE use a dark ribbon and CLEAN keys, mail in large manila envelope if ready to publish. If handwritten, please write plainly or print. If you feel you cannot type well, please type the material with double space. Please read the material over before sending it and check all dates.
- 2. Give source of material. Original documents where found, type, number of page, etc. We cannot print material from printed source unless we have permission from the author.

3. Deadline for submitting material is the first of the month previous to the

month of publication.

4. Material contributed will not be returned unless accompanied by a stamped

self-addressed envelope.

5. We welcome all family histories (may have to be edited due to space) copies of court records, Bible records, etc. That little bit of information may be of help to someone. Of course, we cannot promise next issue publication.

6. On family histories, our policy is to print prior 1900 -- much as we would like to carry forward the modern day generations - it uses too much space.

NOTE: We cannot vouch for the accuracy of the material submitted to us or that the "translation" of the original document is true. If you have read such material, you can understand.

QUERIES:

- 1. Unless queries are to be used as fillers, submit one at a time. Since this is a quarterly, queries not used when originally submitted may become dated and of no value to the writer.
- 2. All material should be sent to Mr J V Avery Jr, PO Box 2154, Roanoke, Virginia 24009.

3. Be sure your query makes sense. Don't abbreviate (we will) or over simplify. If longer than 50 words, we will edit.

4. Queries are free to members. To nonmembers the cost is 5¢ a word -- does not include your name and address. Limit of 50 words. We will try to get all queries in as space permits.

5. Please put queries on a separate sheet with your NAME and ADDRESS when enclosing with other material. Some queries have been lost along the way because of being included in the body of a letter. (NOTE: this applies to other requests as well.)

REQUESTS FOR RESEARCH: Our research is made in our library. NO One should ask for material on John Henderson of Virginia -- we need dates, county (area) --give us something to go on. Remember early Virginia went to the Mississippi River - later included Kentucky, West Virginia, part of North Carolina, Tennesse, Maryland, and Pennsylvania (disputes over the boundaries). So when you say John Henderson was born in Virginia ----designate, parents, children and who married who. Please remember that the research is done by volunteers and therefore is limited, it cannot be a comprehensive research. Also - please enclose a self addressed stamped envelope (SASE)
