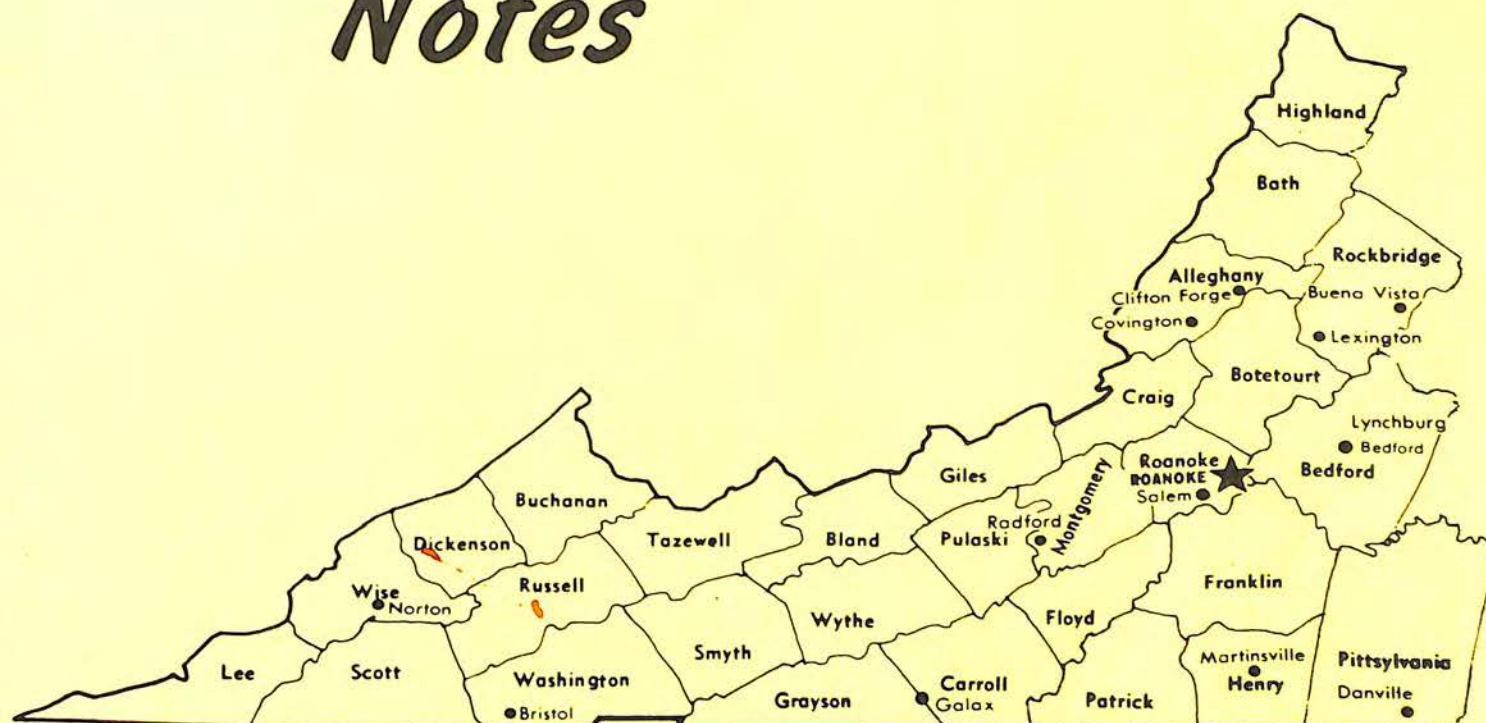

FLOYD COUNTY, VIRGINIA
LEGISLATIVE PETITION

County Meeting in Floyd.

Pursuant to notice a meeting of the citizens of Floyd County was held at their Court House, on Saturday 8th inst, to pass resolutions concerning the Distilling of Grain into Whiskey. Henry Deskins Srg was called to the chair, who explained the objects of the meeting, and Co'l John Williams appointed secretary.

J. J. Williams addressed the house in a Short & pertinent speech & presented the following resolutions

Whereas: We the people of the County of Floyd in public meeting assembled, deploring the unhappy state of affairs produced by an inordinate thirst for speculation, particularly in articles of huino? necessity, the principal sufferers from which are the needy & unprotected families of the poorer classes; and deprecating the conduct of the unscrupulous, who ought to be the warmest friends of the country -- who instead of supporting the Government, are buying up large quantities, & all the surplus of Grain produced by the Country for the purpose of distilling it into whiskey (underlined in original) -- Therefore be it

Resolved, I That inasmuch as the County has furnished its quota of men to the Confederate service, the most of which is actual labor from the fields, and in the event of a failure of the Grain Crops the ensuing year, every consideration of safety & Humanity requires us to protect ourselves, & provide for the families of the absent, by husbanding our resources, & thwart if possible the schemes of the Distiller, who seeks the destruction of, & perversion from its ordinary channels, the fruits of our industry.

Resolved II That we condemn in the strongest terms the erection & putting into operation the Distilleries in our county, consuming in a few months the entire products of the County & petitions the Legislature to pass general Laws, prohibiting the Distilling of Grain into whiskey throughout the State, during the Continuance of the present war, as we in duty bound shall ever pray &e?,

Resolved III That a copy of these resolutions be transmitted each to our Delegate & Senator in the Legislature, requesting them to lay them before their respective houses, and that they be instructed to vote (underlined in petition) for the same & that these proceedings be published in the Richmond & Lynchburg papers.

P. Howell Esq in a lengthy speech objected to the Resolutions, but they passed the House unanimously - there being not a single dissenting voice
John Williams Secte Henry Deskins P__t

To the House of Delegates and Senate of Virginia:

We the undersigned citizens of Floyd County, would most humbly represent unto your honorable bodies that we are in great dread of intense suffering in our midst, in consequence of the inordinate thirst for speculation in the article of LIQUOR. We have distillery after distillery springing up in every neighborhood. Grain has been, and is still being bought up by these "Shylocks," who are determined to make their 'pile'. They are great friends by profession to the Southern Confederacy; but if the independence of the South depends upon them, we fear we would soon be in the hands of "OLD ABE.". They will, unless your honorable bodies prohibit it, soon have all the wives and children starving. Under the circumstances it would be impossible to get the fathers and husbands of these starving families to enlist in the army. Our County Court has been liberal in taxing the people to raise means to make the families of the soldiers, who are in the service, comfortable; but it seems unless these houses of destruction are stopped in their operations, grain cannot be had at any price, and we understand, our's is not the only community in the State in the same situation.

We would therefore most humbly pray that a law may be passed prohibiting the distilling of grain, during our present difficulties. Our men will be much better soldiers without the liquor, and their families enabled to obtain bread.

Your petitioners would humbly represent, that in their opinion the only way to remedy the evil, will be to prohibit the distilling of grain altogether. The idea of some is to tax them, but that will only augment the evil, and lead to still greater extortions. We could say much more in support of our petition; but are aware that you need no argument to be convinced of the evil of which we complain and as in duty bound will ever pray &c.

1838. "MURDER MOST FOUL AND UNNATURAL." The painful duty devolves upon
us to record one of the most cruel and savage murders, ever known to have
been perpetrated in our section of country. Two children of Mr. George
Mays who resides at the Warm Springs, Bath County, were one day last week
most barbarously murdered by two of his female slaves. The children we
understand were between six and nine years of age. When murdered, they
were on their return from a school a short distance from the Warm Springs,
and were found with their throats cut and schokingly mangled.

We have no information of the particulars of this horrid Transaction.
The negroes have confessed the crime, and they were incited to the deed
by a malignant spirit of revenge, for some slight correction they had
previously received from their mistress, noted for her kindness, atten-
tion and indulgence to her servants. To Mr. and Mrs. Mays this unhappy
berenvement is peculiarly afflicting, as these two murdered children were
the only survivors of four or five others who met an early grave.

Pearisburg, Va. Nov. 25 th 1863

Dear Bro & Sister

As it has been some time since I wrote you, I thought I would write to-night. We are all well at present. Mr. H is not at home at this time. He has been absent for two weeks. He went to Wytheville last Thursday one week ago.. I suppose he has been visiting his relatives. I expect him home in a few days. We heard from Frank last week. He was near Chatanooga Tenn. Was not very well when he wrote. I came from the river this evening. I have been helping mother to make apple butter. They were all well. Pop says you can get some leather from Sinsz. and also that cotton that was coming to you. He has several bales of cotton yarn for sale. if you want to purchase now is your time. You had better come soon, or it will all be gone. It is going very fast. Try and make it convenient to come and stay with us all night. You are always in such a hurry when you come over here that I scarce have an opportunity of conversing with you. I suppose you have heard of Barbara Woolwines death ?. this she died of Dypheria a few weeks ago. Jinnie has been very unwell. She is teething.. I think this causes her to be puny. She is some better now. How are Annie and Jinnie? I would like very much to see them and all the family. I will try and come over if I can before the weather gets bad. I would like very much to do so, if the Yanks do not get you. I hope you may be unmolested this winter. The relations generally are well. I will now try and give you some of the general news. Henry Dennis has sold his property to Flinn from Dublin. He moves today and is going to keep tavern. I am glad of it. We need a tavern in this town to entertain strangers. Black Mary is dead. She died with the disease you said she had, poor creature. I suppose you have heard of Robert Brothertons decease. He died with fever. His was a triumphant death. "Let me die the death of the righteous." Square Billy Snidow died with the same disease. Death is not confined to any particular place. James Adams is dead also. And many more that I do not remember at this time. Mrs Thrasher is at home. She is still increasing in size. rapidly I understand. Beck says please send her that flannel for Jinnie's dress and petticoat of the first chance. Excuse this badly written and dictated letter. I did not feel like writing to-night and have had to entertain company and laugh with Beck. I do not often apologize but am really ashamed of this blotted paper. Write to me soon, not a short letter, but a long interesting one and I will endeavor to do better next time. Accept our love and kiss the children for me.

BOOK REVIEW

John and Edward Tuck of Halifax County, Virginia,
and Some of Their Descendants

The Tucks of Virginia are descended from an English family chiefly of County Kent, but also of London and Norwich. In the Seventeenth Century many Tucks emigrated from the old Country to the Colonies. Robert Tuck, "a chirurgeon, vinter and tailor" came in 1636 from County Suffolk to settle first in Massachusetts, later in New Hampshire where he founded a numerous family. Among those of the name who came to Virginia in the early years were: Woodland Tuck in 1642; Ann Tuck in 1652; William and Robert Tuck who in 1657 had headrights of 730 acres of land each in New Kent County. Nothing further is known of these early settlers.

This compilation deals almost entirely with the descendants of John and Edward Tuck of Halifax County, Virginia, whose direct ancestry has not been determined. They, and a Thomas Tuck, who may have been a brother, appeared in Halifax County about the time it was cut off from Lunenburg in 1752, acquired land, established homes and reared large families, the descendants of whom are scattered throughout our nation.

John Tuck (1730-1801) married Mary Powell (1733-1828), daughter of Edward and Elizabeth Powell. From his will of 1801 the following children were named: Sarah, Elizabeth, Edward (Ned), Mary Achsah, Ezra, Robert, Richard, Benjamin (Bennett), John, Jane, and David. His descendants are numerous and widely scattered throughout our nation. Large numbers are to be found in Virginia, many in Halifax County. In 1945 a great-great-great grandson living in that County, William Munford Tuck was elected Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

Edward Tuck, b. ca 1730 d. 1781 (will recorded May 17, 1781), listed the following children: Mary, Moses, Josiah, Edward, Cary, Sarah, Vashti, Tabitha and Susannah. His wife's name was unknown.

HIGHLIGHTS IN THE EARLY HISTORY OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY, VIRGINIA

Montgomery County, Virginia, lies at the southwestern tip of the Valley of Virginia between the Alleghany and the Blue Ridge Mountains. It had been originally a part of Augusta County, formed in 1738 and with divisions was formed in 1777 from Botetourt and extinct Fincastle Counties. Being formed one year after the death of an American Revolutionary War officer, Richard Montgomery, it seemed fitting that the county should bear his name. He was the first officer of high rank in the American army to be killed, and his death saddened both officers and soldiers.

Richard was the son of Thomas and Mary Franklin Montgomery, and was born in Swords County, Dublin, Ireland. He married Janet Livingston in 1773, the daughter of a wealthy judge and land owner, Judge Livingston in New York City.

In Drapers Meadows were the Drapers and Ingles families, who were natives of Ireland. George Draper and Eleanor Harden Draper had two children, Mary and John. Mary Draper married William Ingles, a son of Thomas Ingles, in 1750. John Draper married Betty Robinson in 1754. William Ingles was one of the gentle justices of the first court of Fincastle, present Montgomery, and a signer of the Fincastle Resolutions, an important document drawn up at Fort Chiswell (Wythe County). Other gentle justices appointed by Patrick Henry were Walter Crockett, James McCorkle, James McGavock, John Montgomery, William Preston, James Robertson, James Thompson and Stephen Trigg.

William Christian was a patriot, policy maker, and defender of the frontier. His parents, Israel and Elizabeth Stark Christian, emigrated from northern Ireland to America in 1740. William was born on Christian's Creek near Staunton, Virginia, in 1742 where his parents opened a general store. He married Anne Patrick, Patrick Henry's sister, about 1768. William Christian moved his family to Kentucky in 1785, and he died there April 9, 1786. Christiansburg, the seat of Montgomery County, was fittingly named for this brave and able defender of the frontier in early days.

Dr. John Blair Radford, for whom the city of Radford was named, came from Bedford County in 1836 to the area, and married Elizabeth Campbell Taylor on May 31, 1836. Descendants of the Radfords married into the families of Adams, Moore, Yancey and others. The Radford home, Arnheim, still stands today and is used as an annex to Radford High School.

Jane Buchanan Floyd is typical of the many frontier women who went with their husbands into a wilderness land to sustain and comfort them. She was the daughter of John and Margaret Patton Buchanan and a granddaughter of James and Mary Osborne Patton. Jane Buchanan married John Floyd in October, 1778. Jane's son, John Floyd, Jr., became governor of Virginia in 1830. Floyd County, formed from Montgomery, was named for him.

The book has 183 pages with a bibliography, and contains an appendix with a chronology of early Montgomery County, Virginia, from 1671 to 1867, and copies may be ordered from Patricia Givens Johnson, Route 2, Box 172, Christiansburg, VA 24073. The price per copy is \$5.95 plus 50¢ postage. A copy of this book has been given to the William Fleming High School Library, Roanoke, Virginia, by the author. There is a genealogy club in the school.

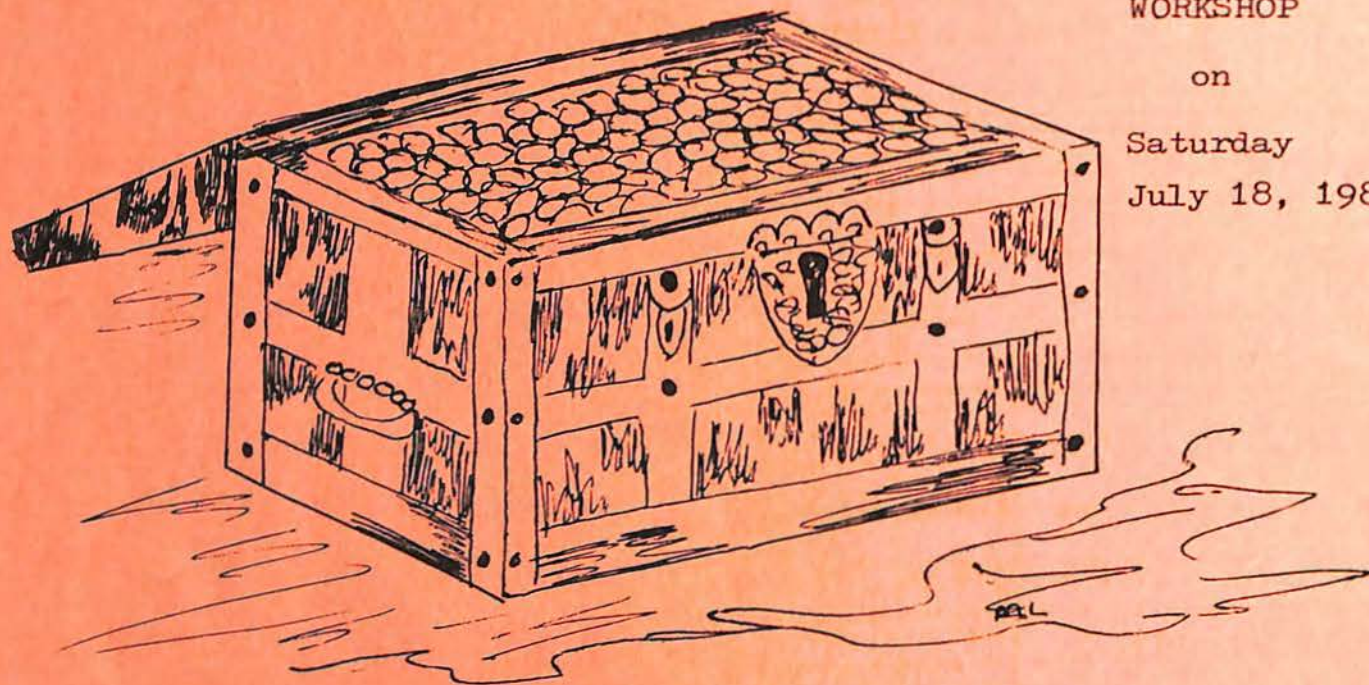
