THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The highlight of our year is always the ANNUAL GENEALOGICAL WORKSHOP. This year was no exception with Bill R. Linder, formerly director of the Central Reference Division, National Archives, and author of HOW TO TRACE YOUR FAMILY HISTORY, and Peggy Shomo Joyner (Mrs. Douglas), a Certified Genealogist, author and genealogy instructor for 10 years at Old Dominion University, Norfolk, Virginia.

Mr. Linder in his first lecture gave "An Overview of and Update on the National Archives" with a slide presentation. If you are interested in a Genealogy Tour to National Capital, Oct. 17-23, including classes, socials and research trips to the National Archives, DAR, Library of Congress and National Genealogical Society write: DC Tour, Bill R. Linder's second lecture was "Organizing to Produce" a slide presentation, covering the ground from note taking, filing, writing, publishing and distribution.

Mrs. Joyner's lecture was entitled "Colonial Germans in the Shenandoah Valley of Virginia." Her special interest was pre-1800 German - Swiss immigration and the early Germans of SE Pa., W. Md.. and Valley of Virginia. She has published two genealogy books, "The German Mennonite family of Roosen/Rosen" and a "Study of the Quaker Denson Family of Eastern Virginia." She transcribed the German register of St. John's (Union) Church, Augusta County and presented the church with a bound copy. She distributed two maps from John W. Wayland's book, "A History of Shenandoah County, Virginia." Her address is Peggy Shomo Joyner, C.G., 5008 Dogwood Trail, Portsmouth, Virginia 23703.

Thanks to all of you for attending OUR WORKSHOP. Our membership is now the highest in its history and the attendance at the workshop was the largest, about 120 including book fair people. FLOYD COUNTY, VIRGINIA LEGISLATIVE PETITION

The original of this document is at the Virginia State Library, Archives Divition, Richmond, Va. 23219. Ask for Petition dated Feb. 2, 1852, Floyd Co., Va., Box A, Legislative Petitions. The photocopy has been placed in the Virginia Room, main Roanoke City Public Library, Roanoke, Va. - also a copy will be given to the Floyd County Court House, Floyd, Virginia.

(page) To the Honorable House of delegates of Virginia your petitioning represent that they reside in the north west section of Floyd County and Some of them distant fourteen miles, from any Election Precinct and having Good Faith in the Wisdom and Patritism of the Present Legislature, We humbly ask that our Grievances may be remedied by Estibishing a Seperate Election Precinct at Indian Valley which is Situate midway between the Counties of Carroll and Montgomery and the Pricinct at Lemon and known as the Burksfork Pricint, and the County of Pulasky, and in the Center of a Populous Community, and Cannot but be the best Situation for a Precinct for the Election of County officers when the County is laid off into districts and your Petitioners further represent that owing to the Great distances to any Election Precinct. Many voters are deprived of enjoying the right of Suffrage, your Petitioners Will ever Pray.

A standard headstone or marker can be furnished, at government expense, for your deceased veteran of WARTIME or PEACETIME service of honorable severance. Also eligible may be members of reserve forces.


An unmarked grave for a Civil War Veteran in my family caused me to inquire into this governmental program as a means of erecting a memorial to his great sacrifice. He was mortally wounded at the Battle of Chicamauga in Georgia.

Applicant need not be a member of the deceased's family, but should be assured that the grave is UNMARKED. Government markers are not furnished to supplement an existing monument, nor to reflect a veteran's honorable military service. They may not be used as foot stones.

A variety of styles of markers are available including bronze, flat and upright. If interested you may write asking for VA Form 40-1330 and marker style sheet to: Monument Service (42), Veterans Administration, 810 Vermont Ave. NW, Washington, DC 20420.

The headstone or marker is shipped, without charge, to the person or firm designated.

This program now under the Veterans Administration was begun many years ago by the Adjutant General's Office of the US Government.

CHEROKEE REMOVAL RECORDS

Register of Cherokees who wished to remain in the east. 2 Volumes.

These are arranged chronologically by date of registration of the Cherokees who wished to remain in the East as U.S. Citizens. There is an alphabetical name index for some of these.

Emigration Rolls -- 18 Volumes.

This is a listing of Cherokees who wished to emigrate, rolls of actual emigrants, muster rolls of conducted parties, and lists of Indians able to move by themselves. Some rolls are signed by the Indians and constitute relinquishments of their lands in the east. Usually only heads of families are listed, but often there is some information concerning the other members of the family. There are alphabetical name indexes for some rolls.

Eastern Cherokee Census Rolls -- 19 Volumes

Original rolls, copies of rolls, and alphabetical indexes. The rolls were commonly known as follows:

Henderson Roll: This was the census of 1935*taken of the Cherokees before removal to the West. Mullay Roll, 1848; Siler Roll, 1851; Chapman Roll, 1852; Powell Roll, 1867 (no index); Swetland Rolls, 1869 (one roll not indexed) and Hester Roll, 1884.

The Henderson Roll lists heads of families and gives information concerning the family and its property. Most of the other rolls were made to determine eligibility for payments due under provisions of the 1835 Treaty.

1851 Old Settlers Roll

This is a roll made up of those old Cherokee settlers who were in the west before the Trail of Tears or the emigration of the Eastern group. The settlers of the west felt they should have a portion of the fund allotted in the Treaty of 1935. The government did give them a portion and a transcription and index to this is in microfilm roll 12, microcopy 685.

<u>On May 28, 1909 Guion Miller</u>, special commissioner presented a final roll of those Cherokee Indians who were eligible to participate in a fund awarded to the Eastern Cherokees at the time of 1835-36 and 1845 or to their descendants.

The report consists of 10 volumes of findings on individual applications, arranged by application number. There are two volumes of alphabetical index to names.

A FAMILY RECORDS SYSTEM

"Happiness is Knowing Where it is"

(The following is the outline of the talk presented by Bill R. Linder at The Fifth Annual Genealogical Workshop held on July 17, 1982.)

MAIN IDEA: "EVERYTHING HAS A PLACE"

GET CONTROL:

Go through the house and find out what you've got. Make headings on slips of paper and stack item under these headings.

Make a working list of the types of items (subjects) you find.

GET ORGANIZED:

Set up major subject classifications.

Set up subdivisions as necessary.

EXAMPLE:

S	ubject	1st Level Subdivision	2nd Level Subdivisions
E	XPENSES	Insurance	Auto Life Medical

Make an alphabetical list of all subject headings, and under each subject, list subdivisions alphabetically.

This list is a guide or index to what is in your paperwork collection.

GET FILED:

Label folders to match subject headings and subdivisions.

File papers neatly within folders in orderly fashion.

USE YOUR FILE:

Place your file index at the front of your file.

Don't let papers accumulate -- file them.

Create new subject and subdivision headings as needed, always adding them to your file index.

When feasible, use your file for appropriate non-paper items.

Use your file for <u>all</u> family paperwork. It is a family "central" file. All papers will flow efficiently to and from it if you will <u>use</u> it.

Teach your children and your spouse to use your file.

Tailor the concept of the family records system to fit your family's needs.

(Editor's note: As Mr. Linder also used slides, the above was the basis for his lecture. How does the above apply to genealogy -- everyone has the above expenses -- but the needs of each genealogist is different. The beginner will not have as extensive a file as the one who has done research longer. As Mr. Linder said start NOW -- on your house file and your genealogical file. Too expensive to buy a file and folders. Start with a cardboard box (paint it, use contact paper to cover it) and the folders -- or manilla envelope makes temporary file folders. You have a friend - or spouse - who works in an office, ask them to save you the old folders that are to be thrown away. I wish I could think of everything that Mr. Linder said -- and it takes me forever to transcribe a tape. We learn a lot -now to put it into practice -- today not tomorrow!!)



PIONEERS ON THE WESTERN WATERS by

Theodosia Wells Barrett

Indians lived in adjacent areas when the long hunters came to the northeastern section of Russell County, Virginia, an area the Indians called "Middle Ground". It was the crossroads of several tribes of Indians who inhabited the surrounding areas and met in the secluded forest retreat at regular intervals to hold conferences and engage in hunting parties.

The beautiful Indian name for Clinch River was Pellissippi, which means Son of waters. About the year 1769 Thomas Witten and a few other families settled at Crab Orchard on the headwaters on the Clinch River now in Tazewell County. About the time the Upper Clinch settlements were made, Jacob Castle left his home in Rockbridge County and wandered through the wilderness until he reached Lower Clinch Valley, where he traded a big knife to a band of Indians for a large tract of land which was called "Castles Woods" and later changed to Castlewood. He stayed here for a short time, trading his land to another tribe and resumed his wanderings.

Permanent settlers began to arrive in Castles Woods, among them were Charles Bickley, James Bush, Archelous Dickenson, Henry Dickenson, William Fraley, Henry Hamblin, Jerry Harold, Richard Long, Henry Neece, James Osborne, Simon Oscher, Samuel Porter, William Ritchie, William Robertson, and William Russell.

Settlers kept coming into Clinch Valley. By an act of the Virginia Legislature January 6, 1786, Washington County was divided into two counties. The new county was Russell County, honoring General William Russell. The first court was held in the home of William Robinson September 18, 1787. On September 19, 1787 the court convened in the new court house at Henry Dickenson's plantation. It was a log structure, twenty feet by twenty feet, a wood floor, benches and a rustic bar. Henry Dickenson was the first clerk of the court.

Mid-Clinch Valley settlers began to arrive. Names as, Ball, Elam, Fletcher, Griffith, Honaker, Horton, Kendrick, Patrick, Sword, Thompson, Vance, Wells and Wilson were some of them.

Old family photos, homes and scenes of early towns are included. Brief biographies are included of some notable citizens named Boyd, Dye, Elkins, Ford, Griffith, Hartsock, Hess, Lockhart, Mays, Newberry, Spear, Whited and others. A gift copy from the author has been placed in the Virginia Room of the Roanoke City Public Library, Roanoke, Virginia. The book has 116 pages and a soft cover. CHURCH RECORD FROM WOLF CREEK, GILES COUNTY, VIRGINIA

This is the Journal of the Christian Church on Wolf Creek, Giles County, Virginia. The beginning of the Christian Church in Giles County was on December 20, 1818, by Joseph Thomas, Elder of the Christian Church, with Landon Duncan and Thomas Kirk, ministers in the Baptist Society. The records says 12 males, 21 females, 28 blacks, 3 dead, 7 joined.

These records were from 1820-1829. The names of the members of the Christian Church of Wolf Creek, October 3, 1824 were: Elder Landon Duncan, John French, Jeremiah Jones, Susan French (dead), Elizabeth French, Elizabeth Pennington, Jane Garrison (died in July 1825), Polly Straley, celia McDaniel, Harry (a servant), Henrietta (a servant), John Jones, Susanna Jones, Vincent Hale (dead), John Hale, Abraham Garretson, Rachel Jones, Nancy Conley, Elizabeth McKinny.

The original manuscript was written with a quill pen by Landon Duncan himself and is in the possession of Dr. O. S. Hare, Bluefield, WV. This document was sent SwVGS by James L Emerson, 3162 Madeira Ave., Costa Rica, CA 92626. It has been placed in the Virginia, Roanoke City Public Library. (by Belva M Counts)

RUSSELL COUNTY - A CONFERATE BREADBASKET

Russell County's role in the WAR BETWEEN THE STATES was unique. Not a single full company of Union soldiers invaded the county during the war years. There are no memorial battlefields as in many other parts of Virginia.

Russell County soldiers fought, died, and were left on numerous battlefields in Northern Virginia, West Virginia, Maryland, Pennsylvania, and other areas. The County played a vital role as a Confederate breadbasket and supplier of horses, clothing, and other essentials to the war. At least 1450 were soldiers, others in the local militia and Home Guards. Many women were left to manage their homes when the men went to war. Stories and pictures are included of Cynthia Hurt Barrett, Amanda Richardson, and Mahala Kiser Sutherland.

Mrs. Wells lists her source materials (books, court and census records). Her most unusual find was the Muster Roll of Captain Simeon Hunt which reached her by way of a flea market in North Carolina. This Muster Roll, consisting of 12 officers and 74 privates, is listed. They were called the NEWGARDEN FEARNOTS and was a part of the 1st Regiment of Virginia Volunteers. Slavery in Russell County is reviewed and the slave population in the Russell County Census of 1820 is included.

Pictures are included of Lt. James H. Barrett, Mace Emmette Duff, Christopher C. (Kit) Richardson, C.L. Samples, (Rebel) Robert D. Silva, age 100, (Yankee) Andrew J. Kiser, age 97, and Captain Simeon Hunt. A group picture of Confederate soldiers at Honaker (Russell Co.) in 1922 with Capt. J. W. Bausell.

PLEASE use a dark ribbon and CLEAN keys, mail in large manila envelope if ready to publish. If handwritten, please write plainly or print. If you feel you cannot type well, please type the material with double space. Please read the material over before sending it and check all dates.
- Give source of material. Original documents where found, type, number of page, etc. We cannot print material from printed source unless we have permission from the author.
- 3. Deadline for submitting material is the first of the month previous to the month of publication.
- 4. Material contributed will not be returned unless accompanied by a stamped self-addressed envelope.
- 5. We welcome all family histories (may have to be edited due to space) copies of court records, Bible records, etc. That little bit of information may be of help to someone. Of course, we cannot promise next issue publication.
- 6. On family histories, our policy is to print prior 1900 -- much as we would like to carry forward the modern day generations - it uses too much space.

NOTE: We cannot vouch for the accuracy of the material submitted to us or that the "translation" of the original document is true. If you have read such material, you can understand.

QUERIES:

- 1. Unless queries are to be used as fillers, submit one at a time. Since this is a quarterly, queries not used when originally submitted may become dated and of no value to the writer.

- 3. Be sure your query makes sense. Lon't abbreviate (we will) or over simplify. If longer than 50 words, we will edit.
- 4. Queries are free to members. To nonmembers the cost is 5¢ a word -- does not include your name and address. Limit of 50 words. We will try to get all queries in as space permits.
- 5. Please put queries on a separate sheet with your NAME and ADDRESS when enclosing with other material. Some queries have been lost along the way because of being included in the body of a letter. (NOTE: this applies to other requests as well.)
