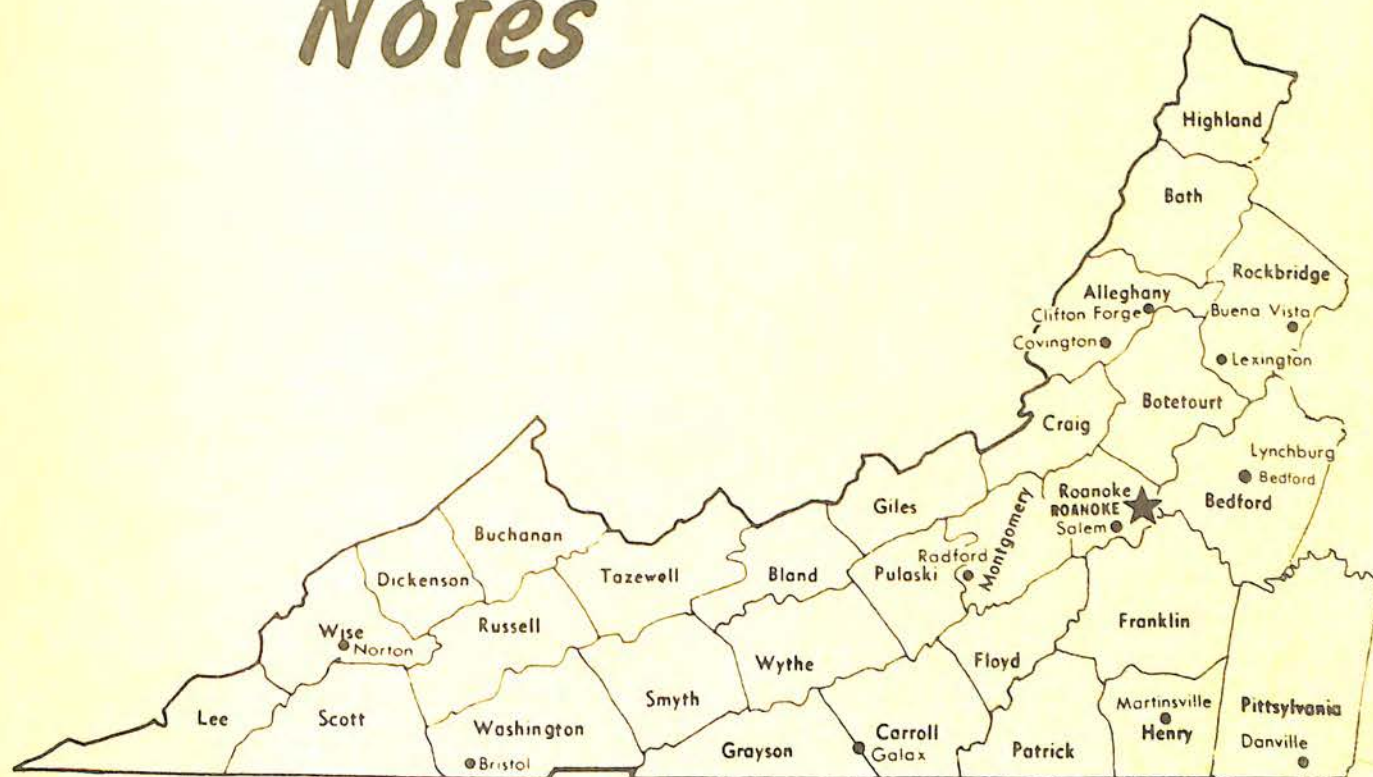

INHABITANTS.

1825. Dec. 16. A 1768. Protest against holding Constitutional Convention. No need for it. Staunton Convention calling for a new constitution was not representative. Printed. James Turner, William Cook, Nath. S. Strange, Wm. Radford, Thos. A. Latham, Edmund Irvine and 49 others. Duplicate with 23 names. Referred.

TRUSTEES of New London Academy.

1827. Dec. 18. A 1769. Permission to sell lottery for raising money for academy. About \$5,000 has been raised, but petitioners incur great responsibility in conducting lottery and prefer to sell it. Henry Brown, Pres., Js. Hendrick, Secy.

HEWITT, JOHN.

1828. Dec. 8. A 1770. Release from fine of \$51 levied against petitioner for running public house without proper license. Petitioner applied to commissioner of revenue for license and paid \$10 license tax to deputy sheriff, but was nevertheless fined. Reported.

CITIZENS of Liberty.

1828. Dec. 17. A 1771. Repeal of so much of law establishing said town as places an alley therein, and designation of another place for an alley. This petition arises from the extension of limits on north side of the town. P. R. Gilmer, Saml. Ritchey, James Bell, Fredk. Annspaugh, John P. Gray, Marquis D. Gray and 170 others.

CITIZENS.

1828. Dec. 17. A 1772. Change in school system. Better teachers must be had. Fund for education of poor has been of little or no advantage to them. Moral degradation of registering poor children as paupers and want of competent teachers have rendered system ineffective. P. R. Gilmer, Robert C. Mitchell, Henry W. Mosely, R. McDaniel, Lewis Wingfield, Saml. Mitchell and 39 others. Laid on table.

STRANGE, NATHL.

1829. Jany. 30. A 1773. Return of execution and damages paid by petitioner for Stephen Preston, sheriff. Petitioner served execution on one Peggy Baber, who had no property, and execution was returned properly but was charged by clerk of court against sheriff. Two papers. Laid on table.

GEORGE, WILLIAM.

1829. Dec. 9. A 1774. Return of fine of \$30 levied against petitioner for running public house without bond and security. Petitioner paid license tax to sheriff. Bill drawn.

INHABITANTS.

1829. Dec. 9. A 1775. Establishment of turnpike from George Thrasher's in Botetourt to Wm. R. Jones', crossing Blue Ridge at Nippenger's. Allen Marshall, James Campbell, Peter Bobletts,

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Wm. Radford, Wm. Cook, Wm. Berry and 37 others. Reasonable.

DAVY, Free Negro.

1830. Dec. 8. A 1776. Permission to remain in State. Petitioner was freed by Miss Anna M. Quarles, his mistress. He is now living on land of Dr. Thomas Wright in Franklin, where his wife is a slave. Rejected.

JOE, Free Negro.

1830. Dec. 17. A 1777. Permission to remain in State. Petitioner was freed by will of his mistress, Miss Anna Maria Quarles. He asks to be allowed to stay because of his good character and extraordinary circumstances. Four accompanying papers. Rejected.

CULTIVATORS of Tobacco on James River.

1831. Jany. 27. A 1778. Relief from heavy tolls imposed upon people navigating James River. Navigation of river has been very little improved by James River and Kanawha Canal Company, but petitioners must pay heavy tolls. An extended sketch of the James River improvement. Printed. I. Irvin, Jno. Hudnall, Caleb Fuqua, James E. Claytor, Abram Powel, W. B. Whitten and 53 others. Referred.

CULTIVATORS of Tobacco on James River.

1831. March 8. A 1779. Relief from tolls on tobacco. Same as A 1778. Bowker Preston, John Hubbard, Archibald Prather, Stephen Morgan, Willis Chewning, Benjamin Turner and 29 others. Referred.

CULTIVATORS of Tobacco.

1831. March 8. A 1780. Same as A 1779. Richd. Davis, John N. Wilson, B. Hinsley, C. Logwood, Micaiah Davies, Thomas F. Hatcher and 66 others.

STEEN, WILLIAM.

1831. Dec. 7. A 1781. Permission to build mill on James River and dam water at Bold Eagle Island. Robert Camin, Henry T. Pendleton, W. P. Sesson, John Shelton, Edm. S. Rucker, Benj. R. Davison and 350 others. Bill reported.

CITIZENS.

1832. Jany. 27. A 1782. Stringent law for removal of free blacks from State. Their presence is a menace. Printed in newspaper. James S. Dillard, John Marsh, Elisha Peters, Nathaniel H. Price, Edmund Marsh, John Callaway, and 101 others. Referred.

CITIZENS.

1832. Feby. 10. A 1783. Pardon of Abner Martin, sentences to two years in penitentiary for passing counterfeit money. He was victim of designing persons and has served one year of his term. John N. Kasey, Michael Overfelt, John H. Whitehead, Josiah S. Kennell, William Hackworth, Baley Martin and 81 others. Referred.



CITIZENS.

1832. Feb. 8. A 1784. Pardon of Abner Martin, sentenced to two years in penitentiary for passing counterfeit money. Bowker Preston, James Leftwich, Jr., Abraham B. Pullen, Geo. D. Davis, Benj. F. Turner, Elisha H. Preston and 82 others. Duplicate with 162 names. Referred.

CITIZENS of Bedford & Campbell.

1832. Dec. 4. A 1785. Pardon of Green B. Lewellen, sentenced to ten years in penitentiary for passing counterfeit money, two years of which he has served. James Anthony, William Leftwich, Benj. Musgrove, Jacob Warner, Elijah G. Cundiff, Stephen R. Smith and 282 others.

GLEASON, PATRICK.

1832. Dec. 31. A 1786. Permission to sell land left to his wife and then his children by James Floyd. Land is poor and petitioner wishes to sell it and buy better farm. Bowker Preston, Pleasant Preston, John Laganby, John Mitchell, Sr., Benjamin Frazier, William Arther and 33 others. Copy of James Floyd's will. Rejected.

CITIZENS.

1833. Jany. 10. A 1787. Building of seven miles of road necessary to connect Lexington and Lynchburg by turnpike. Road is of great importance, especially on account of James River Canal. Benjamin Robinson, Joseph Slaughter, Hector Harris, Willis Poindexter, Wm. Stein, Francis Meriwether and 34 others. Referred.

ANNSPAUGH, DANIEL.

1833. Feby. 12. A 1788. Payment of expenses incurred in pursuit of one Charles Marshall Jones, whom petitioner followed across mountains and arrested in Rockbridge. Payment of account refused on ground that petitioner's act was illegal. Petitioner is aware of this. He should have applied to the magistrate of each county traversed by Jones for his arrest, and in meantime Jones would have escaped. Account and two certificates accompanying. Bill drawn.

CITIZENS of Bedford & Campbell.

1833. A 1789. Pardon of Green B. Lewellen, serving term in penitentiary for passing counterfeit money. John D. Taylor, Henry Carper, Moses Grier, Jr., Theo. F. Webb, George Warker, Thomas Helms and 425 others.

CITIZENS.

1833. Dec. 4. A 1790. Pardon of Green B. Lewellen, sentenced to ten years in penitentiary for passing counterfeit money. Henry Brown, Jr., Benjamin Musgrove, Charles Slurland, David Owen, Henry Brown, Saml Hancock and 134 others. Resolution to discharge.

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RUFF, JOSEPH.

1833. Dec. 9. A 1791. Permission to keep gun. (Code of 1819, I, p 423.) Petitioner "is one of that unfortunate class in Virginia, who neither possesses the common privileges of a free man, nor has the protection and security of a slave." He needs gun to kill fowls and protect his crop. Petitioner, with others, has lately been deprived of this right. He is an honest man and his father served State in Revolution. Samuel Williams, Wm. A. Jones, William Campbell, Tandy R. Jones, Trade. Annspaugh, Wm. Dooley and 11 others. Rejected.

1834. Feby 28. A 1792. Copy of Bedford Court order appointing Baptist Church in Liberty as courthouse until new courthouse is finished. Letter accompanying. Bill reported.

SAWYERS, THOMAS.

1835. Jany. 31. A 1793. Pardon. Petitioner was tried on charge of stealing two slaves and suit of clothes. Jury first found him guilty of both offenses and sentenced him to four years; later acquitted him of theft of clothes but sentenced him to six years for stealing slaves. Petitioner is innocent of crime, has served most of sentence and has a family to support. Court record and letter. Petition asking for Sawyer's pardon and signed by William A. Adams, Benj. Hawkins, James F. Johnson, Maj. Wilson and 50 others. Referred.

MOSES, Free Negro.

1835. Feb. 14. A 1794. Permission to remain in State. He was freed by will of Lewis Chastain, but executors refused to free him and attempted to hurry him out of State. He instituted suit and gained his freedom. He is old and his wife is slave in neighborhood. Jno. F. Sale, John Hewitt, Th. Sale, John Wharton, Willis Poindexter, Nelson A. Thomson and 30 others. Copy of court records. Reasonable.

CITIZENS.

1835. Dec. 9. A 1795. Incorporation of company to build railroad from Lynchburg to Tennessee, with intention of joining Tennessee Railroad and making continuous line south to New Orleans. James S. Dillard, Henry Brown, Ben Ward, Th. Steptoe, Saml. Crawford, Wm. Redford, John Tw. Read and 40 others. Reasonable.

INHABITANTS.

1835. Dec. 11. A 1796. Pardon of Anderson Read who is confined in penitentiary. His parents are aged and respectable. William Campbell, Jno. S. Hurt, Jos. C. Higginbotham, Nathaniel S. Weber, Bartlett Thompson, Thos. J. Hill and 29 others. Referred.

CITIZENS.

1835. Dec. 15. A 1797. Incorporation of part of county cut off by Smith's Mountain and Staunton River in Pittsylvania. Much more convenient for petitioners. John Ward, George Parker, Alexander C. Parker, Andrew Good, Aaron Jacobs, Joseph Parker and 5 others. Reported.

CITIZENS.

1835. Dec. 22. A 1798. Incorporation of company to build rail-road. Same as A 1795. Balda McDaniel, John O. Leftwich, John F. Hawkins, C. L. Cobbs, C. C. Johnson, T. H. Might and 84 others. Laid on table.

DRURY, JOHN.

1836. Dec. 7. A 1799. Return of fine of \$54.50 levied against petitioner for selling whiskey without license. He was appointed sutler by Capt. Henry Edgar at militia muster in 1835, and thought he acted properly in selling whiskey to soldiers. Pleasant Creasy, Archibald Craigg, Sampson B. Lewis, William Craggett, William Lindsey, George E. Shinnell and 29 others. Bill reported.

QUARLES, MURPHY, Free Negro.

1837. Feby. 8. A 1800. He was freed by will of Ann Maria Quarles, but bound out to trade of currier and tanner until 19 years old. He is now 19 and asks permission to stay in State until 21, in order to thoroughly learn trade. Reuben Parker, Trade. Annspaugh, George W. Stanley, Micajah Davis, Reuben Witt, L. N. Browns and 23 others. Copy of Ann Maria Quarles' will.

1837. March 16, A 1801. Petition for release of Anderson Read from penitentiary, withdrawn on March 15, 1837.

ROBINSON, ZACHARIAH.

1838. Jany. 2. A 1802. Return of fine levied against petitioner for gambling and charged upon two counts. This is a mistake. Petitioner only gambled on one occasion, and should be fined for but one. Affidavits and court record. Reasonable.

BALLINGER, SALLY, nee WADE.

1838. Jany. 2. A 1803. Divorce from her husband, Richard Ballinger, on grounds of abuse and open adultery. Certificate signed by Silas Taylor, Howell Robinson, Isaac Wade, Jr. John Hewitt, Archd. Franklin, Franklin Creasy and 17 others. Referred.

COFER, MARY A.

1838. Jany. 20. A 1804. Release of William E. Cobbs' estate from bond of \$2,000 given by Cobbs as bail on charge of having stolen a bond. Cobbs was petitioner's son and forfeited his bail. His four securities were bound for \$500 each, which \$2,000 has been paid, but Cobbs was personally liable for \$2,000, which has not been paid. He has since died in Mississippi leaving a small estate, and petitioner, his mother, will be reduced to want if bond is enforced. Four papers. Bill drawn.

CITIZENS.

1838. Jany. 29. A 1805. Reform in law for processioning lands. Robert Campbell, Alexander Wade, James A. Walker, John I. Tariss, Fred H. Quarles, H. Terry and 65 others. Referred.

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HARRIS, JAMES.

1839. Jany. 12. A 1806. Divorce of daughter, Martha C. Harris, from her husband, John Hemmings. Latter is a thief and swindler and was driven out of community. Certificate signed by Robert Campbell, Charles W. Stevens, Joel A. Jones, John Crouch, Irvin S. Broles, Samuel Jones and 47 others. Rejected.

CITIZENS of Bedford, Amherst & Nelson.

1839. Feby. 4. A 1807. Incorporation of Virginia Beetroot Sugar Manufacturing Company, and grant of bounty of three cents a pound for sugar and five cents a gallon for molasses made. Joseph B Irving, Ro. M. Brown, La. Drummond, C. Dabney, I. Wells, Henry W. Quarles and 35 others. Report No. 815 of United States Department of Agriculture. Referred.

CITIZENS OF LIBERTY.

1839. Feby. 7. A 1808. Incorporation of Liberty. Armistead Otey, William Terry, James T. Johnson, John C. Hopkins, Robt. A. Clement, Tho. L. Leftwich and 50 others. Reported.

GEORGE, WILLIAM.

1839. Dec. 7. A 1809. Refunding of fine levied against petitioner for failing to give bond and security for keeping an ordinary. He thought that payment of license was all necessary. Court record and certificate. Reported.

CITIZENS.

1840. Jany. 17. A 1810. Some method to reduce number of dogs, in order to prevent sheep-killing. Householdors should be taxed on all dogs more than two; negroes should be allowed to keep but one dog and slaves should be prohibited from keeping any. John C. Chilton, Jno. Callaway, T. T. Saunders, William Creasy, Uriah Hatcher, William L. Otey, James Slaughter, Richd. Davis. Rejected.

ROBINSON, HOWELL.

1840. March 20. A 1811. Petition for divorce withdrawn.

HARRIS, JAMES.

1840. Dec. 2. A 1812. Divorce of his daughter, Martha C. Harris, from her husband, John Hemmings. Hemmings is a thief and swindler and has fled to avoid prosecution. Court record. Bill drawn.

CITIZENS of Bedford, Botetourt & Roanoke.

1840. Dec. 29. A 1813. Permission for stockholders in Lynchburg and Salem Turnpike Company to receive 6 per cent. dividend on their stock before the State receives anything, or that the State dividends may be used in paying amount due for extending road. \$87,600 out of \$100,000 stock to be raised has been subscribed by individuals. Rich. C. Perkins, Alexander Irvine, Will. Steptoe, P. Eckols, John T. W. Ready, Wm. Leftwich, Jr. and 241 others.

CITIZENS.

1840? A 1814. Subscription by State to stock of railroad from Lynchburg to Tennessee. Line is necessary to James River Canal and to development of southwest. Jos. Wilson, G. A. Wingfield, Jesse T. Hopkins, A. Otey, W. F. Gordon, Jr. and 9 others.

DIRECTORS & Stockholders of Bedford Savings Bank.

1841. Jany. 4. A 1815. Amendment of bank charter placing notes negotiable at its office on same footing as foreign bills of exchange. At present all notes negotiated at bank must be made payable in Lynchburg, which is great inconvenience, and unnecessary, as bank has \$30,000 capital. G. A. Wingfield, Pres., Jos. Wilson, James F. Johnson, Jno. A. Wharton, Wm. L. Hall, Alfred A. Bell and 11 others. With names of 21 other citizens added.

1841. Jany. 15. A 1816. Draft of bill granting permission to Joseph Wright, guardian of John H. Markle, to invest proceeds of sale of lands at Liberty in lands in Missouri. Court record. Rejected.

JONES, WM. R.

1841. Jany. 28. A 1817. Petition withdrawn.

CITIZENS.

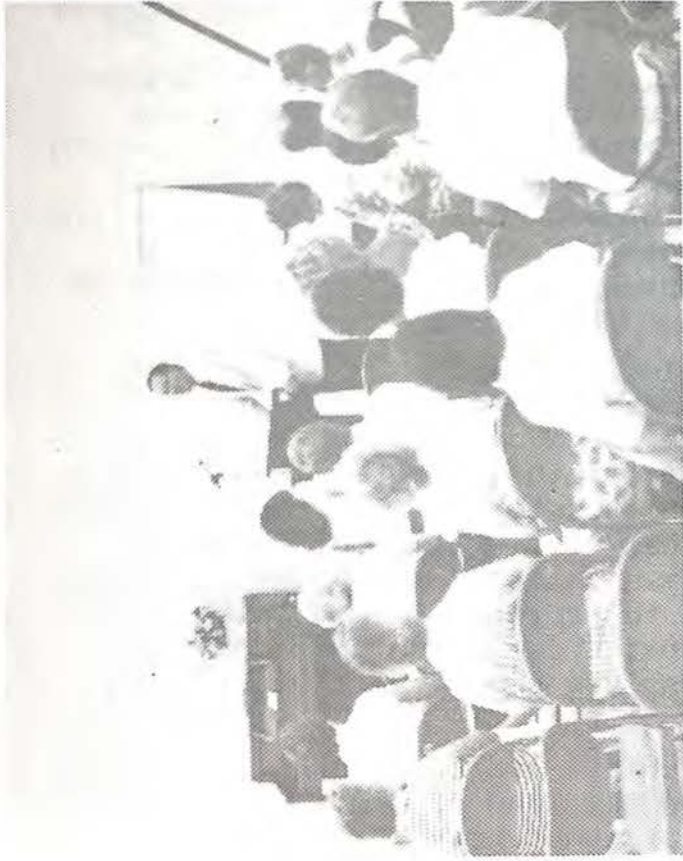

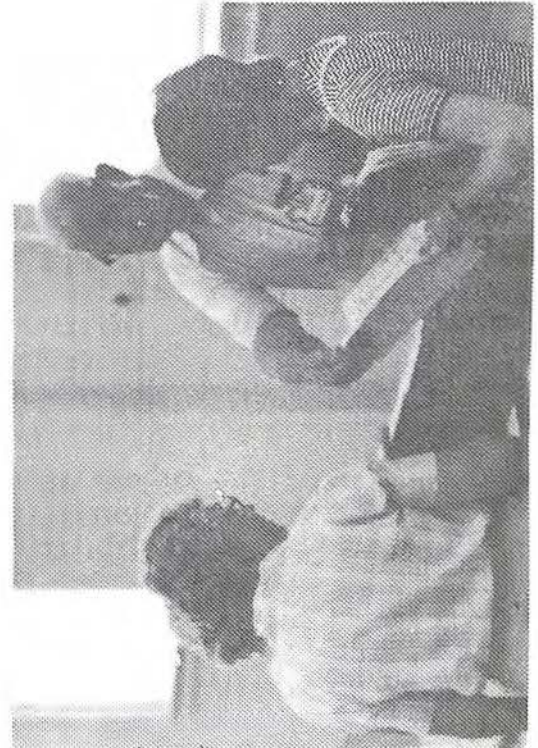
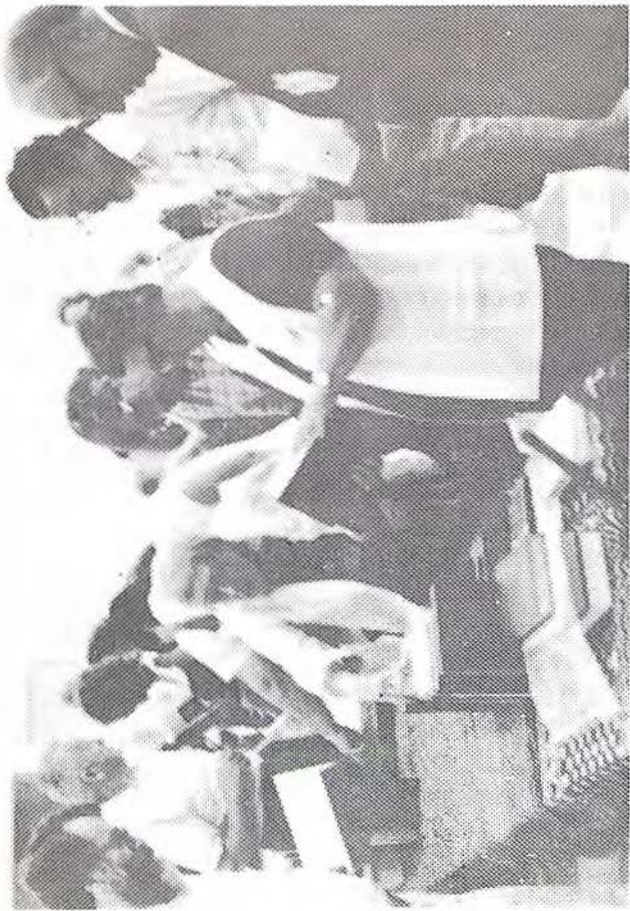

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## GENEALOGICAL WORKSHOP

The First United Methodist Church in Salem was the scene of the annual workshop sponsored by the Southwestern Genealogical Society on July 16, 1983.

Among the day's activities was an outstanding book fair where participants browsed, purchased books and supplies and met authors of local history and genealogical works. As usual, the workshop afforded opportunities for renewing old acquaintances and making new friends. Participants came from all over Virginia and several came from out of state. The door prize for the person who traveled the longest distance went to Jacqueline Kinn of Tiffin, Ohio. The highlight of the day was the two outstanding speakers -- John Frederick Dorman and Richard K. MacMaster.

Mr. Dorman, the editor of "Virginia Genealogist," spoke in the morning session on the topic, "Using Federal Revolutionary War Pension Records." In a very interesting and informative presentation, Mr. Dorman stressed how important it is for those doing research to know the origin of legislation which created the records they are using. He gave an overview of the federal pension laws of 1818, 1820, 1828 and 1832 indicating what kind of information a researcher would find in these records. Mr. Dorman pointed out the significance of these records for historians who are trying to recreate the social history of a certain period and place. He suggested that those doing genealogical research should seek to find out as much as possible about the time period in which the persons being researched lived.

Mr. Dorman indicated that the National Archives has two microfilm collections of the federal pension records and warned that one of these has selected records, therefore the researcher needs to indicate that he/she wishes to receive every paper in the file when requesting the records.

In the second morning session, Mr. Dorman discussed the topic, "Certification of Genealogists." As an officer of the Board for Certification of Genealogists, he was able to give the group information about the purpose of the Board, the categories of certification, and the procedure for obtaining certification. The four categories are: Certified Genealogist (C.G.); Genealogical Records Searcher (C.G.R.S.); American Lineage Specialist (C.A.L.S.); and American Indian Lineage Specialist (C.A.I.L.S.).

Richard K. MacMaster, Associate Professor of History at James Madison University, conducted a very informative session in the afternoon. His topic was, "Church and County Records of Shenandoah and Rockingham Counties." Mr. MacMaster discussed the importance of genealogical research to the development of local histories and especially its importance in relation to the emphasis placed on social history in recent years. MacMaster talked about several exciting projects developed by the Shenandoah Valley Historical Institute, a consortium involving cooperative work among historical societies, the history professors at colleges in the area and people in the community involved in genealogical research.

In discussing the records of Shenandoah and Rockingham counties, Mr. MacMaster pointed out the diversity of the religious and ethnic groups who settled there. He gave an overview of the church and court records and enumerated some sources that would aid the researcher. For example, he noted that many of the men in the Shenandoah Valley refused militia service because of their religious beliefs and this led to much correspondence back and forth about why they could not serve. Another source would be the delinquent fine lists for people who would not serve in the militia as well as lists of persons fined for missing drill.

Both of the workshop speakers were informative and challenging. Their presentations made the day a truly worthwhile learning experience.

DESCENDANTS OF WILLIAM AND CATHERINE (BECK) SANDY

by Dr. William Allee Sandy

William SANDY was born about 1765 in North Carolina and married in 1787 Catherine BECK who'd been born in North Carolina in Nov., 1765. They probably started their married life in Granville or Wake County, North Carolina, but soon moved to the part of Rowan County, North Carolina, that is now Davidson County. From there they moved (about 1810) to Tennessee where they lived a while before moving to Washington County, Indiana, (were there as early as Aug. 1816) where William SANDY died of tuberculosis in early 1826. Catherine died in Apr. 1845 and was buried in the Stierwalt Cemetery near Paragon, Morgan County, Indiana. William and Catherine (BECK) SANDY had the following children: Henry SANDY (1788-1855) who m. Elizabeth "Betsey" CARSON (1804-1881); Carrie H. SANDY (1792-1852) who married Frederick GOSS (1784-1868); Jeremiah "Jerry" SANDY (1793-1869) who m. Elizabeth Rinan "Betsy" GOSS (1797-1875); Thomas SANDY (1797-1863) who m. first Sarah "Sally" BUSH (1785-1846), m. second Mrs. Nancy (BROWN) JOHNS (1799-1873); Mary "Polly" SANDY (1800-1875) m. first Abraham STIERWALT (1797-), m. second William H. VOSHELL (1791-1861); Elizabeth SANDY (1801-1875) m. John STIERWALT (1798-1876); Catherine SANDY (1804-1890) m. David BUSH (1796-1885); William H. SANDY (1806-1885) m. Lucinda THOMPSON (1811-1879); and Lucy SANDY (1809-1895) who m. Adam STIERWALT (1800-1890).

Beginning in 1889, Dr. William R. SANDY began collecting information on this family; there is no way his research can be reproduced today. Besides his valuable contributions, he also noted the cause of death whenever he could which could form the basis for an interesting and valuable genetic study. About 1939 Dr. William R. made copies of his notes which he shared with Dr. William A. SANDY who did extensive research on bringing several branches of the family up to date. Dr. William A. died before he could finish his work, but his widow (Harriett SANDY) and John V. BECK have worked to prepare his manuscript for publication. John V. BECK has added notes and cross-references as well as adding a complete index. In the book's 200± pages are traced about 3,000 of the descendants of this pioneer couple. Many of these are concentrated in Indiana, Nebraska and Iowa, but representatives of the family reside in nearly every state in the union. Other surnames significant in this records include ALLEE, ARNOLD, BRYANT, DITTEMORE, GUY, HALE, HAM, JOHNS, KNOY, LABERTEW, LINGLE, LOWER, McCARTY, RATTTS and WRIGHT. A picture of Dr. William A. SANDY, several snapshots of the cemetery where Catherine (BECK) SANDY and many of her descendants are buried and a map of parts of Owen and Morgan Counties, Indiana, have also been included.

Two hundred hard-bound copies of the book have been ordered, will be available sometime in Mar. 1983 and are being sold at \$15.00 a copy, postpaid (actual printing cost). Not only will these books become heirlooms - order one for each of your children - they can be valuable additions to your county's library, historical or genealogical society. Dr. William A. 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WILLIAM LAWSON, A SCOTTISH REBEL

William Lawson was born 1731 in Scotland and was transported to the Colonies as a captured rebel after the battle of Culloden. He died in 1826 and was buried in Scott County, Virginia near the Snowflake community. The book contains hundreds of descendants from Southwest Virginia and Kentucky as well as other parts of the country. Book contains approximately 450 pages, indexed, hardcover, easy to read print, and over 100 pictures and illustrations. Eleven chapters and two appendixes make up this book. Appendix One chronicles the early school system of Wise County, Two Country Preachers Remembered, The Lawson Reunions and Our Family Album.
