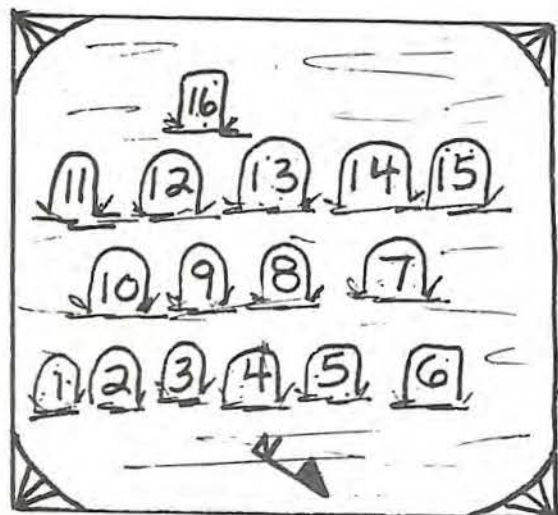

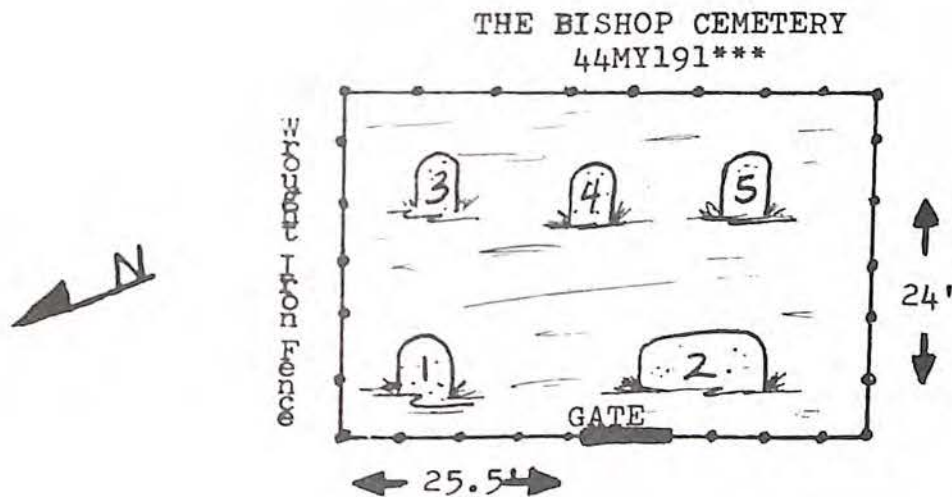

About a hundred years ago, a village called Snowville on Little River, Pulaski County, Va. ___ miles south of Radford, was started. This village was called "The Foundry" at first, with the post office named Humility. In those days there were no postage stamps nor envelopes; the letters were folded up, a small quantity of sealing-wax held them together; the money, ten cents, was paid to the postmaster. Not many persons received letters, and newspapers were hardly heard of. I never saw a newspaper until 1852.

Snowville was named after the Snow family who were Northern people, and were among the first settlers, whose touch gave life to the many enterprises that followed. The New Englanders who settled here introduced churches, school houses, Sunday schools, singing classes, debating societies, etc.

Before the war Snowville was a great iron center. The charcoal furnace was one of the largest enterprises in the county. Then there was the foundry, where all kinds of castings were made; then the wood-shop with its facilities for making all sorts of farming implements; then the flour mills, saw mills, woolen mills.

Back in those days, before railroads and macadam roads, our village was an inland emporium.

Saturday was always a great day in Snowville; everybody around about had to go to town once a week and get the news. The mails were carried weekly from Christiansburg to this place. I can see old Dan Aker, sixty years ago, coming with the mail. The sturdy yeomanry would come in from the country and exchange ideas, crack jokes, buy something from Capt. Bill's big store. This gentleman was from New York, and had the push of an A. T. Stewart. The Captain was a polished gentleman, a great thinker, and a genuine friend.

Let us name a few of the men who used to be seen on the streets of Snowville: Rubin Roop, Big Jim Simpkins, John Hawley, Creed Taylor, Dr. Pepper, Gordon Hall, Dan (Ben?) Ridpath, Lewis Roop, John Meredith, Gordon Dobbins, Thos. Hall, Thos. Crandall, Rev. Mat. Smith, et als. All these and many of the younger generation have vanished, and their names are almost forgotten.

There were a number of citizens of the village that I cannot forget. These people lived there before the war, viz: The Bullards, the Snows, the Stones, the Ammonses, the Sangers, the Hamakers, the Baxters, the Bills, the Hundleys, the Palmers, the Taylors, the Shelors, the Godbeys.

In 1861 Snowville passed under the war-cloud. Many of her hoble sons rallied to the call of the Southern bugles. "Fall in" was heard all over the country. As it were, men dropped their plows in the field, laid down the hammer and the saw, kissed dear ones and started to the front. I can see the boys marching --- Tramp! Tramp! Tramp! I can see Albert Bridges, J. P. Hamaker, William Sanger, John Baxter, William Shelor, going toward the valley of death! The writer saw the courage of those boys tried in the "Queen Battle" of the war--Chancelorsville---where blood flowed like water. Not a waver in the ranks, although half our company fell in the fight where Jackson was killed. Col. Vandevanter led the 50th regiment in this great battle, and Capt. Stone, Lieut. Bridges and Lieut. Worrell led Company I, and Meeker's (?) legions vanished like leaves of the forest. I here draw a curtain over that dreadful scene, and when "the last roll is called" I may meet my comrades from Snowville on the beautiful camping ground, where war is forgotten.

This was written by the Rev. James T. Taylor about the year of 1912. He died in 1919.

HISTORIC FINCASTLE, INC.

Fincastle, Virginia, twenty miles north of Roanoke on U. S. Highway 220 was established in 1772. Today it is a quiet and quaint village of 365 residents and a virtual museum of American architecture from the late 1770's through the twentieth century.

As the seat of the new Botetourt County from 1770 until well into the Revolutionary War, Fincastle was the governmental center of a vast tract of land that included the entirety of the present state of Kentucky and most of what is now West Virginia, Ohio, Indiana, and Illinois.

George Washington, Patrick Henry, Thomas Jefferson, and other prominent Virginians either appeared in Fincastle or sent their agents to lay claim to tracts of wilderness lands. Thousands of Swiss, German, and Scotch-Irish pioneers passed through on their way down the great Valley Road which traversed the famed Shenandoah Valley to settle the western frontier country.

Combining the talents of German craftsmen and Scotch-Irish merchants and lawyers, Fincastle built a town of well proportioned houses and public buildings, a substantial number of which still survive. Courthouse Square contains the old Jeffersonian Courthouse, a Gothic style jail, and the old Western Hotel.

Three antebellum and two late nineteenth century churches still serve their congregations. The narrow streets are lined with a mixture of architectural styles. Homes of early smiths, wagonmakers, and sadlers were usually made of logs now clapboard and shingle covered. Commercial establishments and homes of the more wealthy were made of brick. The surrounding countryside is also rich in frontier architecture and historic lore.

Realizing the value of these old buildings and the heritage of the town, Historic Fincastle, Inc. was organized in 1968. The objectives of the organization are to preserve the buildings, encourage restoration, and educate the public to the importance of its past.

One of the first projects accomplished by H.F.I. was the restoration of the "Bar Building", a part of the Western Hotel, after a severe fire. The building is now used by the county for offices. H.F.I. has purchased and resold "The Douglas House", "The Crowder House", and Hayth's Hotel, all now with protective covenants. A typical Victorian gazebo was constructed on the Big Spring lot, an ever-present reminder of days gone by. Under reconstruction now is a log cabin on Murray Street dating from the late 1700's. The cabin will be furnished in an authentic manner and will be open to the public when completed. The rear wing will be used as the administrative office for H.F.I.

Walking tours of Fincastle are conducted by guides for a nominal fee. The Botetourt County Museum and the Courthouse are of great interest. Special consideration is given to tours for school children.

At this writing H.F.I. is making plans to establish genealogical archives. Many people come to Fincastle to research the Botetourt County records for their "roots". H.F.I. would

like to give additional help by having local genealogies available to the public.

Historic Fincastle, Inc. is carrying out its objectives with money raised from donations, sponsorship of the Fincastle Arts and Crafts Festival, and the sale of Fincastle souvenirs. The Festival will be September 8th and 9th this year. The following items are for sale through H.F.I. MB 3, p 105; July ____: George Waller & John Marr Esq'rs are appointed to Settle with the Defficient Sherifs for the Severall Collections in this County from the Year 1777 to the Present Year.

MB 3, p 129; Nov. 1783: John Dillard Esq. is appointed Burser to Collect & Account with this Court once in 6 Months for all fines & Forfeitures that has been imposed on the Different Persons in this County Since the Year 1777.

MB 3, p 129; Nov 1783: It appearing to this Court by the Oath of Peter Saunders that Col. Abraham Penn Esq. & also his own that the said Penn had two Negroes taken from him by the British Enemy which Negroes the said Penn Purchased of Charles Smith of Hanover County for which the said Penn gave the Said Smith the Quantity of 16000 Weight of Inspected Tobacco passd at Richmond & Manchester Inspection which is ord'd to be Certified to the Governor & Council agreeable to an Act of Assembly in that case made & Provided. Also the said Penn has 2033 lb. Tobo. destroyed by the said Enemy at Petersburg Inspection, which was pass'd in the name of Thomas Bedford & Pass'd by the said Bedford to him.

MB 3, p 146; April 1784: Ruben Baughan came into Court & made oath that he had a Cert. from the Board of Auditors for £5.8.0 for his Services in the Militia when ordered to the Southward. Also a Cert. for 10/8 for Militia Service which Cert's is since been burnt in his house, & the same is ord. to be C.

MB 3, p 155; May 1784: John Chandler is allowed 40/ for a Smooth Board Gun for the use of the Militia of this County which Gun appears to be lost.

MB 3, p 155; May 1784: Christopher Perkins is Allowed 700 Pounds Paper Currency for a Rifle Gun for the use of the Militia of this County.

MB 3, p 204; Jan 1785: Jacob Burrus is Allowed £25.12.0 for a Waggon & Team & forage... 42 Days Services under the direction of Jos. Martin Agent of Indian Affairs which is Ord'd to be Certified.

MB 4, p 29; June 1785: Jessee Wills is Allowed 350 lb. of Gross Beef furnished the Commissioner of Provisions of this County

MB 4, p 29; June 1785: William Stewart is also Allowed 45 lb. Bacon furnished the Hospital at this Courthouse in March 1781.

MB 4, p 33; July 85: Henry France is allowed £3.10.0 for Support'g Cornelius Cookley & Thomas Summers 5 Weeks each, as Brittish Prisoners, by order of Abra. Penn Gt. Lieut. of the County.

On the motion of Thomas Davis who made Oath and gave bond and security according to law, certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on the estate of Stephen King dec^d in due form.

Ordered that Meshack Turner, Josiah Turner, Jacob Goode and Geo. Turner or any three of them do appraise in current money the personal estate of Stephen King dec^d and return the same to Court.

Stephen Preston vs Robert Cook - Motion - Dock^d & cont^d till the first day of the next Court.

Ordered that Samuel Hale, Pleasant Brown, John Palmer, and Thomas Ferguson or any three of them do state & settle the account current of William Turner dec^d admr. and make report to Court.

Account Current of Josiah Harrison dec^d admr- Ret^d & Cont^d

On the motion of Frances Woody by W^m Coleman her next friend It is ordered that Robert Hodges Jr be summoned to appear at the next Court, to Show Cause why he should not give other and good security as Guardian of the said Frances Woody.

Satisfactory evidence was adduced in Court that Moses Greer Sen^r who was placed on the Pension Roll by Warrant dated the 8^t day of Dec^r 1832, departed this life on the 10^t day of May 1834, leaving no widow, and that Moses Greer Jr. William Greer, Mary Pollard, Nancy Carper, Elizabeth Callaway, Eleanor Shelton, Walter T. Greer, John Greer, Tho^s B. Greer and Catharine B. Greer are his children now living. That the said William Greer, Mary Pollard, John Greer & Eleanor Shelton reside without this Commonwealth in parts unknown & have not been heard from for some time.

On the motion of Pleasant Dickinson who produced the Sheriff rec^d for \$18: and gave bond & Security according to law, license is granted him to Keep an ordinary at his place of residence in this County until the 1st Monday in May next, the Court being Satisfied that the applicant is a man of good Character, and that he will keep an useful house of entertainment.

DEEDS AND WILLS BOOK II OF PITTSYLVANIA CO., VA.
1780-1820

In the name of God Amen, I James Bruce of Pittsylvania County, State of Virginia, being weak & in a low state of health; but of perfectly sound & dispossing mind & memory, & knowing that it is appointide unto all men to die, do make this my last will & Testament in form & manner following--

First. I resign & bequeth my soul into the hands of God who gave it & my body to be laid in the ground in decent & Christian manner ----next it is my will & desire that my just debts be paid for which purpose it is my will & desire, that the land whereon my son William Bruce's family now lives & that whereon Clebon Shelton formerly lived containing both four hundred & sixty six acres shall both be sold for this purpose of discharging my just debts - should the sale of the above land amount to more than my just debts, it is my will & desire that the overplus shall be appropriate to the use & support of my beloved wife & children to promote & (?) their education. And shoulde the sale of the above land sale shorts in discharging my just debts it is my will & desire that my Exors. hereafter named shall sell so much of my moveable & parishable property that can be lest spared to supply the deficity if any. For which purpose I choose Jesse Keisee, Griffith Dickinson & Every Mustun to act as my Executors - Further I give them full power to sell those lands above mentioned and make a good & lawful title to the purchase Item I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Tabitha Bruce my house and lands whereon I now live with all my household & kichen furniture together with all my black & plantation tools and every other property which I possess during her natural life or widowhood - and at her death or marriage for my Exors. to sell the property, and the money to be equally divided among my children Item it is my will & desire that those of my children who have received a certain part of my Estate of which others have not received (viz) that those who have received shall account for & settle withmy Exors. for those thing they have received when an equal division taks place Item names of my children who have received certain property.

STOP THE RUNAWAYS!! Escaped from the custody of the Sheriff of Floyd county, Virginia, on the 15th day of April 1832, JOHN H. WILLIAMSON and THOMAS S GARDNER. The former a native of Buckingham and the latter of Montgomery county in this State. They were arrested on the charge of Horse-Stealing, and awaiting their trial. The said Williamson is a very small man, about 21 or 22 years old, blue eyes, dark hair, exceedingly fine teeth, rapid of speech, and of genteel address. He had on when he escaped, a very good blue cloth coat, and corded pantaloons of very wide stripe, much worn, and a pair of old square toed boots and coarse white fur hat somewhat bell crowned. The said Thomas S. Gardner is 22 years old six feet and upwards high, dark eyes as well as recollected, somewhat stoop-shouldered and awkward in his appearance. He had on when he escaped an old brown cloth coat nearly worn out, and pantaloons of the same fabric as Williamsons, but not so much worn, a fashionable black hat, coarse and much worn and unfashionable shoes. His hair is dark. The first joint of the forefinger of his right hand, is crooked. His teeth are very irregularly set, but sound. It is believed they had no money when they escaped. We exhort all the good people of the commonwealth to arrest the said culprits if possible that they may be brought to jail and impartially tried, THOS. H. SLIGON D. for Robt. Goodson, S.F.C. This is a history of the Sturgill family. The book is divided into seven sections. It contains historical and genealogical background of the first five generations of the family to America. In the fifth generation the family splits into two main branches of the family as they exist today: STURGILL-STURGELL branch and STODGHILL-STODGELL. The information included in this book has records from many different sources collected over a period of 50 years. These include public records, such as census, deeds, wills, marriages, tax, leases, contracts and court records, other records from private family Bibles, church records, cemeteries, etc., are included. James Sturgill, who is the common ancestor of all the family died in 1803, and is buried in present Alleghany Co., North Carolina. Each section is indexed.
